# An Autobiographical Sketch

#### Alan Fox

I was born in Granite City, Illinois, on June 22, 1946 I lived in East St. Louis until I began my undergraduate work with the exception of one year when I lived with my father in Yokohama, Japan.

In the fourth grade I won the school spelling championship, in the fifth was selected to present a radio speech on American citizenship, in the ninth won a third place award in a national science contest and was a member of a special chorus that sang for civic functions, in the eleventh was chosen by the faculty as one of four students to attend a youth conference with sociology professors at Southern Illinois University, Edwardsville. in the twelfth was an unsuccessful candidate for class president coming in second in a three way race, was selected as a member of the National Honor Society, was graduated 8th out of 371, was an Illinois State Scholarship winner, and completed my second year in the high school choir.

In September, 1964, I entered Knex College at Galesburg, Illinois. One year I served as a volunteer in a sixth grade classroom, spending an average of four to five hours a week. I assisted in escorting an ambassador from the South Vietnamese Embassy in Washington around the campus for two days. As a junior, I participated in the initial year of the Knox Program in France at the University of Besancon. I toured ten countries in Europe while I studied there. I served as guest advisor to a French scouting unit in Besancon. My senior year I student taught French at Galesburg Senior High Schoel during the winter quarter under Miss Amy Lindahl. While in college I held summer jobs as a file clerk in a large manufacturing company, as a laborer in a zinc plant, as an aquatics director in a youth camp, and as a delivery truck driver.

I have had active church relations before, during, and after my years in college. I served in the church choir two years in Washington Park before college, served as a youth counselor, and was twice called upon to deliver the sermons while the minister was on vacation. In Galesburg I served as a youth director for the senior highs for five years. I served as a senior high Sunday school teacher for two years. I was banquet director for the farewell dinner for Reverend Herbert Beuoy In 1969.

Before college I became an Eagle Scout and served as junior assistant scoutmaster for two years. During my college years, a served as assistant scoutmaster for one year and was invited berve as scoutmaster for two years when I became old enough. to serve as scoutmaster for the Pioneer Council at summer I became aquatics director for the Pioneer Council at summer camp upon my return from France. It consisted of being merit badge counselor for swimming, lifesaving, rowboating, and canoding as well as awarding scout life guard patches.

After college I taught sixth grade for three years in Galesburg, my first year at Douglas Elementary School and my second and third years at King Middle School. I was an active member of the GEA for three years. I served on a district social studies committee to draw up goals for the new social studies I was one of two teachers who wrote a sixth grade program. social studies curriculum guide for the district as a summer curriculum project. I wrote a guide to assist the teachers of reading with phonics for the district. I developed an individualized reading program for my classes as a supplementary aid. I taught remedial reading in summer school 1970. presented a short talk on the local radio station during American Education Week highlighting the innovative programs at hing Middle School. I had a student teacher from Knox College assigned to me my third year of teaching by Dr. Carl Eisemann. up the class schedule for all the sixth grade classes my third dizzx22 year.

The major highlight of each of my lest two years was a major musical production. My second year I co-produced and directed the musical play, "The Prince and the Pauper." My third year I produced and directed the musical play, "The Sound of Music." Each production took approximately four months in preparation. I had the responsibility of coordinating the activities of at least ten faculty and staff members for each production and seventy some students who participated each year. The plays were video-taped each year and performances were given for both the school and the general public.

I was a member of the Galesburg Jaycees for one year. I was co-director of the Christmas project of decorating the city of Galesburg in 1969.

I surrendered my teaching position in Galesburg in 1971 to continue full time work on my Master's Degree in educational administration at Western Illinois University in Macomb. I have only to write the final paper on accountability in education during the summer quarter to complete the requirements for the degree. I will have a secondary teaching certificate, an elementary teaching certificate, and an administrative certificate.

certificate I have travelled a great deal in the United States and the world. In addition to the travels I have already mentioned, I and my grandmether spent two months in Japan during the summer of 1971 visiting my father, her son, who is military supervisor for the United States Lines in the Yokohama-Tokyo area.

My hobbles include music, stereo equipment, baseball, basketball, photography (I have a collection of over four thousand color slides of my travels.), chess, bridge, camping, traveling, and swimming.

I speak French semi-fluently, well enough to communicate without too much difficulty in France. I also have a rudimentary knowledge of Spanish. I have taught English, spelling, and writing for two years. I have taught advanced, average, and remedial reading for three years. I have taught European and Asian social studies for three years. I have completed over 25 semester hours in social studies for a teaching minor.

I have taken a course in elementary art methods and have a good background in choral music although I cannot play the piano. I took physics in high school, biology in college, and an advanced chemistry course in college, at one time considering it as a possible major. I have completed every course in mathematics through a year of calculus and feel quite competent in this area. I feel that I am more than adequate at public speaking and have had a lot of practice in it. Thave an excellent understanding of all the major sports and basic competence in them. I have had experience leading recreational activities for youngsters. I could handle this at the elementary level with no problem. In short, I enjoy and feel competent in all the subject matter areas in the elementary school curriculum.

The "Alan" referred to is no longer in the Prairie Council, but is still registered as Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 212 of this council, In Galesburg, Illinois. While the letter does not give his last name, we find that "**Galesburg**" is referring to Alan Fox, ASM of Troop 212.

In May, just before Alan left Galesburg, information of a suspicious nature was discovered; however no definite statements could be secured. With this letter it appears quite definite that Alan Fox should not lbe associated with Scouting.

Fox is a graduate of Knox College. His home is St. Louis, Mo. He has obtained a teaching job someplace. As a boy he earned the rank of Eagle Scout. He continues to have an avid interest in Scouting. While Scoutmaster of Troop 212 he built the troop from a weak, small troop, to over 40 active members. No doubt he will want to become associated with Scouting wherever he is located.

Since this is the first case of this type in my experience as Scout Executive I am relaying the information to you so that you may advise me what should be done on our part. I shall appreciate your help and advice.
