The purpose of the interview was to again give Mr. the opportunity to again describe in detail the card game that took place, admitted by both Mr. Hill and Mr. in separate interviews.

admitted his original statement was in error, and that in fact he did participate in the card game described, and that in fact Mr. Hill did engage with him in a homosexual act

He indicated that his reason for the erroneous eniginal information was due to his fear of further involvement, and the protection of his reputation, as he felt that was the first and only time he had ever been engaged in such an activity.
