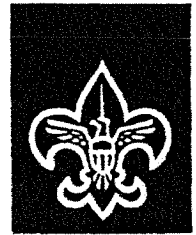

In a letter from [REDACTED], Committee Chairman for Pack 204 and Troop 202, Gorham, N.H., Daniel Webster Council was notified of a child molestation incident involving Mr. Oxton and two youngsters, one from Pack 204 and one from Troop 202. (See letter enclosed.) The incident took place on a 5-day bike trip between August 14-18, 1979.

According to Mrs. [REDACTED]'s letter, and to a verifying telephone call made by me to Sgt. Robert Loven, Troop F, New Hampshire State Police, Twin Mt. Barracks, Mr. Oxton freely admitted to the charges and agreed to seek professional help. Because of this, those involved directly decided not to press charges. Since no charges were pressed, Sgt. Loven could only furnish verbal confirmation of the incident via the telephone.

Mr. Oxton's commission and registration with the B.S.A. has subsequently been revoked by this Council and he has been so notified via a letter from our Council President. Both Mrs. [REDACTED] and Mr. Darrell Bernier, who is the Grand Knight with the chartered institution, have been notified of our actions.

Ironically, Mr. Oxton has responded to our Council President's letter with a series of questions (see letter to Mr. Zell enclosed), and we do not know at this time whether or not he plans to contest our decision. We are making a reply (see our letter enclosed), citing the opportunity for a review of the charges, etc., and will wait to see what happens.

We will keep your office posted of any future actions taken, but request that the enclosed material be placed in a confidential file and that Mr. Oxton no longer be allowed to officially register and participate in the program of the Boy Scouts of America.

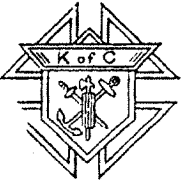

With the deepest regrets, we are writing this letter in regard to the resignation of Alfred J. Olson, Scoutmaster Troop 202, Gorham, NH. Al has been accused of molesting two Scouts: Wilbur (Pack 204) and [redacted] (Troop 202). [redacted] is the son of the Council [redacted], our sponsor of [redacted] (August 14-18). The State Police (Mr. Laver, Main St, Gorham, N.H. Troop 7, Pine Mountain Barracks) were notified. After questioning the two boys, Mr. Laver confronted Al who then admitted that all charges were true. Al was asked to pick immediate psychiatric treatment and resign from Scouts. He called me and gave an oral resignation and has made an appointment at the mental health clinic. As Chairman of the B.S. Committee and assistant Scoutmaster, [redacted] and I notified all the parents in the troop, and order that they could question and deal with any emotional problems - we may arise from their son's close association with Al. We are not pressing any charges at this time, but our main concern is the fact of being re-offending again in the future in another place. We have assurance from you (Danel Webster Council) that Al cannot work with Scouts anywhere. He has a tremendous Scout background and we feel the distinct possibility that he will move to another Council and start this cycle over again. As close friends of Al's my husband and I feel he may have no control over his actions. After discussion with other Scouts, we find that at least to Scouts are prudent in this manner and that the wider troop has been notified. The B.S. Comm felt fortunate that our assistant Scoutmaster, Clare Hanson & Ralph Sparda, have agreed to pick up the reins. Both are good men and of good character, as you committed to keep the Troop going so that the boys will continue that can have always this [redacted] situation. It has to be pointed out

We reserve the right to suspend or refuse registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of leadership which BSA seeks to provide for American youth.
