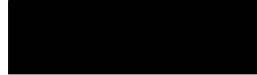

Man, bogus Scout leader, gets 30 years for sex crime

HIGH POINT — A High Point man accused of posing as a Boy Scout leader and sexually molesting 11 juveniles in three Piedmont counties was sentenced Tuesday to 30 years in prison.

William Alfred Shealey, who pleaded guilty Thursday to one count of second-degree sexual offense, was a man whose concern for needy children degenerated into a sickness, his attorney said before sentencing.

"His original intent was to raise the standard of living for these children, to show them that there was something besides crime," Assistant Public Defender Duane Bryant said.

"Somewhere along the line he lost it, and he tried to regain it, but was unable to do so. What started out as very innocent acts turned very ugly somewhere along the line."

Shealey admitted to having anal sex about two years ago with a 12-year-old High Point boy. Superior Judge Thomas W. Seay Jr. found that aggravating circumstances of the crime outweighed mitigating factors, and he sentenced Shealey to 30 years — 18 years more than the sentence presumed appropriate when there are no circumstances that would tend to worsen or lessen the nature of the crime.

In exchange for his guilty plea, prosecutors agreed to drop 13 other sex-related charges against Shealey.

According to police, Shealey lured young boys from low-income neighborhoods in High Point with gifts and trips. Many came from broken homes and did not have fathers.

Shealey, 48, of 1608 E. Commerce St. still faces seven charges in Davidson County and four in Randolph County.

He is expected to make a plea agreement in Davidson County similar to the one he made in Guilford County, said Richard Lyle, the assistant Guilford district attorney who prosecuted Shealey.

At his sentencing hearing, Shealey told the court his problems intensified during the Vietnam War, where he said he worked reconnais-

sance missions for the U.S. Army.

"In one of our missions, we found a kid, 10 years old," Shealey said. "His arm was blown off from here (the shoulder) down."

After he and other soldiers took the boy to a Saigon hospital, Shealey said he and the boy became friends.

When Shealey returned to the United States, he said, "I found more comfort going out and searching for children who needed somebody, and I tried to be that somebody."

Before imposing the 30-year sentence, Seay Jr. said he was taking into account factors which included Shealey's mental condition and his honorable discharge from the Army.

Seay could have sentenced Shealey to 40 years in prison.

Rowan Prosecutor Quashes 47 Sex-Abuse Charges

Alfred William Shealey faces years in prison for the conviction of molesting a High Point boy, and he faces further charges of sex offenses in Randolph and Davidson counties. But he won't stand trial for 47 counts of sexual abuse in Rowan County.

And there's no clear reason why.

Rowan Assistant District Attorney Ron Bowers said a judge in his jurisdiction dropped those 47 charges at the District Court level.

"The warrant was found by the District Court judge to be improperly drawn. I don't remember the reason," he said.

A Rowan County court clerk said the records of the case there read, "The state's motion to quash was allowed."

Capt. Jim Hoyng of the High Point Police Dept.,

whose officers originated the charges and drew the warrants, said the documents were properly written.

"The term 'improper' may be a misnomer," Hoyng said. "They were proper warrants that were drawn with proper charges."

Judge Thomas W. Seay Jr. sentenced Shealey to 30 years in prison Tuesday in High Point Superior Court on a charge of sodomizing a 12-year-old High Point boy.

City detectives R.L. Hall and D.C. Duncan began an investigation last fall that led to 72 charges of sexual offenses being lodged against the E. Commerce Avenue man.

But after pleading guilty to the one count here, Shealey, 49, faces only 11 more counts in Davidson and Randolph.

The out-of-town charges stem from camping trips Shealey took with underprivileged city boys

in which he allegedly molested them. After the warrants were dismissed in Rowan, Bowers said he kept in contact with High Point police for about a week.

"The last time I was in touch with the officer is that's been months ago," he said, adding that he thought the warrants had been rewritten in High Point.

When he was told the warrants had not been redrawn, Bowers said: "I don't think it (the Rowan case) had fallen through the cracks. I think the only thing that occurred was an officer just misunderstood the law, came to the wrong place to take the warrants out."

According to state law, Bowers added, Shealey could be tried in High Point as well as in Rowan, because he had allegedly transported the boys from High Point. But because all the witnesses

and victims were in High Point, it was a better place to try the case, he said.

"This (Rowan) is really a rather

The magistrate approved the warrants, he said, and Shealey's conviction here was on a similar case.
