Denial of Member Registration in Boy Scouts: Allen J. Jackson

- 1. JO1 serves as the Executive Vice President of the Far East Council of the Boy Scouts of America. As such, he acts on proposals to deny registration of adult applicants for leadership positions in the council scouting programs. J1, POC for Scouting programs associated with USFJ, requested our comments on the attached adult registration case file.
- 2. In 1984-86, Allen Jackson, a member of the US Air Force, molested product, including fondling their breasts and vaginas. Because of the refusal of the children to testify, no court-martial action occurred. Sgt Jackson received an Article 15. For some unexplained reason he was not discharged, and it is likely that any effort to discharge him now would be successfully thwarted.
- 2. In Jan 86, Jackson applied for registration in the Boy Scouts, and was accepted. In Jan 87, he re-applied (Case File 4 Atch 9 & 15). When this came to the attention of the Misawa Air Base Commander, who is also a member of the Far East Council of the Boy Scouts, he recommended action be initiated to remove Sgt Jackson from any leadership position with the Boy Scouts (Case Filef Atch 4). In March 88, the Executive Vice-President of the Far East Council, R. A. Gustafson (then JO1), denied Sgt Jackson's application. This decision was delivered to Sgt Jackson on 8 April 88, by the Scout Executive, Mr Weidman (Case File Atch 4).
- 4. That same day Sgt Jackson appealed the decision (Case File Atch a). He also submitted a letter from the President of hischurch, which sponsor's the Scout troop, questioning the decision and stating that he had asked Sgt Jackson to continue working with Troop 9 (Case File Atch b). Both individuals ask the factual basis for denying the application.
- 5. The overriding concern for the Boy Scouts must be the protection of their scouts. The applicant, has no right to be a part of scouting. His presence in a leadership position appears to be an unacceptable risk. The standard is whether the applicant possesses "the moral, educational and emotional qualifications necessary to afford positive leadership to youth."

The decision to reject his application was supported by ample evidence. (See our 8 Mar 88 review at Case file Atch 5).

- 6. The Boy Scouts have established procedures for review of decision to deny registration (Atch 1). Review should be initiated by informing Sgt Jackson of the allegations and providing him opportunity to respond; I suggest 60 days. A review committee is then convened to decide the question. There are further provisions for review at the Regional and National levels of the Boy Scouts. I have prepared proposed text for a letter to Sgt Jackson to initiate this process (Atch 2).
- 7. A response to Mr Larson, the sponsoring church President, is needed. It should explicitly point out that he is not the appropriate authority to decide this issue, the procedures which will be followed, and the potential consequences if he persists in ignoring the rules and procedures of the Boy Scouts by retaining the services of Sgt Jackson. Specifically, he may not allow Sgt Jackson to continue to work with the Boy Scouts until further notice. If he does not comply with Scout procedures, he and his church risk losing their Scouting registration privileges. I have attached proposed text for a letter to Mr Larson (Atch 3).

Dear Mr Jackson,

I have reviewed your letter of 8 Apr 88 to my predecessor asking for the specific grounds for the decision to deny your scouting registration. A copy of the letter which precipitated the denial from Colonel Eastcott, a member of the Far East Council Board, is attached.

If you wish this decision reviewed, please respond within 60 days of receipt of this letter, explaining your position and any facts which would support reinstatement of your registration. The procedures for review have previously been provided to you.

The letter you submitted from your church president, Mr Larson, raises a concern. I hope you have not continued to participate in the Boy Scouts since 8 Apr 88, when you were notified of denial of registration and directed to sever relations with the scouts. Unless you are allowed to re-register, you may not work with the Boy Scouts. If you persist you will diminish any chance of a favorable review of your case and may jeopardize the charter of the troop. I urge you not to do so.

- 4. I recommend you initiate action to remove Sgt Jackson from any adult leadership position in Far East Council Scouting.



Dear Mr Larson,

I am quite concerned by your letter to my predecessor dated 8 Apr 88. You indicate that you have asked Mr Jackson to continue working with Troop 9, despite the denial of his application by the Far East Council. I sincerely hope that he has not accepted your offer, as it not only jeopardizes his future participation in scouting, but also jeopardizes your organization's affiliation with the scouting program.

Under the charter between the Boy Scouts of America and US Forces, Japan, the Far East Council was created to establish and oversee scouting in Japan. Troop 9 is one of many fine troops within the Far East Council's responsibilities. Your church has graciously and successfully participated in scouting, and the sponsoring of Troop 9. No one would wish to see this relationship end. Nevertheless, in order to participate in scouting, an individual or organization must comply with the rules and procedures established by the Boy Scouts of America. The Far East Council must enforce these rules and procedures. Based on what he viewed as adequate evidence. my predecessor determined that Mr Jackson should not participate in scouting. Unless this decision is changed, everyone affiliated with scouting must honor it. Removal from the scouting program can result for those who do not abide by scouting procedures.

I ask and encourage you to take all steps necessary to prevent Mr Jackson's participation in Troop 9.

I would not presume to question your decision that Mr Jackson is able to fulfill church responsibilities not associated with scouting. Nor do I take exception to you supporting him in any appeal of his denial of registration. I assure you he will receive all the procedural rights set out by the Boy Scouts of America and I attach a copy of those procedures.

APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3.: The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 1. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may-if he or she does not agree with the decision-request a review from the regional director by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the local council decision.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the regional decision. The decision by the National Council is final.





- 2. I hasten to point out that Sgt Jackson's misconduct was not violent and it involved only his own female children. There is no indication of any misconduct directly related to his Scouting responsibilities.
- 3. I am influenced, however, by our responsibilities to the children involved in our Scouting programs and to their parents.
- 4. I recommend you initiate action to remove Sgt Jackson from any adult leadership position in Far East Council Scouting.

SUBJECT: Legal Review of Boy Scout De-Registration of Sgt Allen J. Jackson

TO: JOI

- I. It recently came to the attention of Misawa Air Base authorities that Sgt Allen J. Jackson was active in the Boy Scouts. Because of his past criminal acts they are recommending that he be de-registered from the Boy Scouts.
- 2. FACTS: From Nov 86 through Jan 87, AFOSI conducted an investigation concerning SSgt Jackson's alleged child molestation of the content of the confirmed he had fondled their breasts and had attempted to fondle their vaginas. One child was molested during 84-85, when she was 16 and 17 years old. The other child was molested during 86, when she was 14 years old. Because of the refusal of the children to testify, no court-martial action took place. However, SSgt Jackson was given an Article 15, which he accepted. He was reduced to Sgt (E-4). For some unexplained reason, no discharge action was initiated against Sgt Jackson.

#### 3. ANALYSIS:

- a. There is ample evidence to conclude that Sgt Jackson committed crimes of moral turpitude, specifically indecent acts with another and indecent acts with a child in violation of Article 134 of the UCMJ. Both offenses carry a maximum sentence of a dishonorable discharge and several years confinement, among other penalties. Therefore, these crimes equate to felonies in the civilian world.
- b. There is no doubt the accused committed the acts. He admitted to the Misawa AB clinical psychologist that he had fondled admitted the incidents as well.
- c. Although there is no reason to believe that Sgt Jackson would molest young males, it is appropriate that he be banned from Boy Scout activities. Boy Scouts are now open to females, some of whom would be in the age group of when they were molested. Further, Boy Scouts readers note a special position of trust. They are looked to for guidance by these young teenagers. To allow Sgt Jackson to retain this influential position, or any position with the Boy Scouts would

denigrate the respect and trust necessary for the leadership of the Boy Scouts. Finally, I note nothing from Mental Health to indicate Sgt Jackson has been cured.

- 4. OTHER COMMENTS: The letter to be signed should not have your rank of service in the signature block. You are signing as the executive vice-president of the local council. Further the rank of Sgt Jackson should not be used in the letter.
- 5. CONCLUSION: I recommend you deny Sgt Jackson further participation in the Boy Scouts.

REVIEW OF AFOSI PREVIOUS AFOSI INVESTIGATIVE ACTIVITY

3-1. On 6 Nov 86, a review of previous AFOSI investigative activity disclosed the following:

On 29 Apr 86, Major (Dr) WILLARD W. MOLLERSTROM, CHIEF of Mental Health Services, USAF Hospital, Misawa AB, JA., advised that during a clinical session with SUBJECT, SUBJECT admitted to fondling VICTIM on one occasion. related he first hypnotized VICTIM on 17 Apr 86, for the purpose of helping her to stop smoking. Still while under hypnosis, SUBJECT questioned VICTIM about her boyfriend and their sexual activity. SUBJECT then gave VICTIM a suggestion that it was very hot in the room and had her remove her shirt, revealing her breasts for approximately one to two minutes. SUBJECT then told VICTIM that she would not remember anything that happened and to go to sleep. VICTIM awoke approximately an hour later and departed for a friend's house as plans had already been made for VICTIM to spend the evening with the friend. The next evening, 18 Apr 86, SUBJECT picked up VICTIM at the friend's house and used the phrase word, (initially used by SUBJECT on the 17th to place VICTIM in a hypnotic trance) " ". SUBJECT stated he questioned VICTIM pertaining to her actions and what had been going on with her recently. SUBJECT advised that 19 Apr 86 was the only time he actually fondled VICTIM. SUBJECT stated VICTIM and himself were in VICTIM'S bedroom when he used the pharse word, " again. Once VICTIM was under the "hypnotic trance", SUBJECT placed both his hands down the VICTIM'S tank top and bra and fondled VICTIM'S breasts. SUBJECT than gave VICTIM a suggestion not to remember the incident and fall asleep. VICTIM slept for about an hour, awoke, and departed for a friend's house. When SUBJECT picked VICTIM up at her friend's house, he tried placing VICTIM into another trance. SUBJECT advised VICTIM stated that her girlfriend had hypnotized her and discovered what SUBJECT had been doing. Her friend gave her a suggestion to forget all the phrase words previously given by SUBJECT. SUBJECT further admitted that he attempted to fondle while residing in Las Vegas, NV.

During the conduct of a separate AFOSI investigation (8646D7-1948) VICTIM was queried pertaining to a previous incident involving SUBJECT (ref to para 3-1). VICTIM was advised of the pertinent information developed during the course of that investigation and related the following:

During these incidents SUBJECT thought VICTIM was hypnotized; however, VICTIM related she was actually awake and only pretended to go into a trance so as not to upset the family. During the incident in her bedroom on 17 Apr 86, SUBJECT had fondled VICTIM'S breasts underneath her clothing. On 18 Apr 86, SUBJECT had picked VICTIM up from her friend's house, and while parked in front of the family quarters, fondled her vigina and breasts underneath her clothing. On 19 Apr 86, SUBJECT entered her bedroom and fondled her breast and vagina after thinking he had placed her in a trance. VICTIM further disclosed she lied to SUBJECT about her girlfriend hypnotizing her, in an attempt to get SUBJECT to stop fondling her.

#### WITNESS INTERVIEWS

3-3. Interview of: Maj (DR) MOLLERSTROM, Chief Mental Health Services

DR MOLLERSTROM related VICTIM and VICTIM'S family were receiving treatment from the Mental Health Clinic, MAB, JA., for the incidents occurring in Apr 86. DR MOLLERSTROM further related SUBJECT had informed a local church elder (NFI) of his actions. After informing his wife of the incident, SUBJECT moved out of the house and into the barracks. SUBJECT'S wife subsequently informed the Family Support Center Personnel, MAB, of the incident. Family Support Center referred to DR MOLLERSTROM. DR MOLLERSTROM scheduled SUBJECT for clinical sessions at the Mental Health Clinic. During the ensuing sessions with DR MOLLERSTROM, SUBJECT disclosed the following:

The first incident occurred with Approximately one to two years ago, (84 - 85 time frame) while residing in Las Vegas, NV., SUBJECT entered bedroom and tried to touch her. put up some resistance in her sleep so he stopped and left her room. After the himself, and received approximately two months of counseling from a church counselor for that incident. SUBJECT was later contacted by a Nevada social worker, but SUBJECT refused to discuss the matter with them because in his opinion there was nothing to discuss (NFI). MOLLERSTROM stated in other sessions with SUBJECT, SUBJECT advised that the first incident with VICTIM occurred on 17 Apr 86. SUBJECT hypnotized VICTIM in an effort to stop VICTIM from smoking. However, while under hypnosis, SUBJECT began asking VICTIM questions pertaining to her sexual activity with her boyfriend. SUBJECT said he was already aware that VICTIM was sexually active. SUBJECT told DR MOLLERSTROM he got carried away and gave VICTIM a hypnotic suggestion that it was not in the room, and to remove her shirt revealing her breasts. SUBJECT got scared and had VICTIM put her shirt back on. SUBJECT gave VICTIM a suggestion not to remember anything that occurred and to fall asleep. VICTIM awoke a short time later and departed to spend the evening at a friend's house. The next day, 18 Apr 86, SUBJECT picked VICTIM up at the friend's house and used a phrase word, (initially used by SUBJECT on the 17th to place VICTIM in a hypnotic trance) "During this incident he asked VICTIM questions pertaining to what she has been up to lately (NFI). According to SUBJECT, no sexual advances were made on that occasion. DR MOLLERSTROM then disclosed the details surrounding the incident on 19 Apr 86, as related to him by SUBJECT. On 19 Apr 86, SUBJECT entered VICTIM'S bedroom and used the phrase word again to place VICTIM in a trance. Once VICTIM was under the trance, 8646D7-1952

SUBJECT placed both his hands down the front of VICTIM'S tank top and bra, feeling her breasts. SUBJECT then gave VICTIM another suggestion to fall asleep. According to SUBJECT, VICTIM slept approximately an hour, awoke, and departed for her friend's house. At approximately 2100 hours, the same day, VICTIM telephoned home for someone to pick her up from the friend's house. SUBJECT stated when he picked VICTIM up, he tried the phrase word again to place VICTIM under the hypnotic trance. SUBJECT related that VICTIM stated her girlfriend had hypnotized her and found out what SUBJECT had been doing and gave her a suggestion to forget all phrase words previously given by SUBJECT and that his phrase word wouldn't work anymore. According to SUBJECT, that was when he contacted his church elder and later his wife confessing to them what had been going on.

DR MOLLERSTROM further stated he was able to ascertain through sessions with VICTIM the following:

SUBJECT, according to DR MOLLERSTROM had used phases to approach VICTIM. The first phase was having/telling VICTIM to give him good night kisses on the lips. A short time later, along with the good night kisses, SUBJECT started to give VICTIM back rubs. The third phase, SUBJECT started asking VICTIM what her boyfriend did to turn her on sexually. VICTIM informed SUBJECT that her boyfriend would kiss her ear and neck. With that knowledge, SUBJECT started doing that to VICTIM. The fourth phase, according to DR MOLLERSTROM, was the hypnosis performed by SUBJECT on VICTIM. VICTIM also informed DR MOLLERSTROM that SUBJECT had given her a "hicky" while they lived in Las Vegas, NV., around Jul 84 (NFI). VICTIM stated she remembered one occassion where had awakened her and told her what SUBJECT had just tried (NFI). When DR MOLLERSTROM questioned VICTIM pertaining to the incidents involving her, VICTIM stated SUBJECT admitted he had touched her and that it was his problem and not VICTIMS. VICTIM stated SUBJECT told her he had thought about a divorce as not to put the family through anymore of this (NFI). VICTIM stated to DR MOLLERSTROM the times and places were correct that the SUBJECT had stated earlier to DR MOLLERSTROM. According to DR MOLLERSTROM, VICTIM didn't want to elaborate on the past incidents that occurred with SUBJECT. DR MOLLERSTROM got the impression VICTIM wanted to let "sleeping dogs lie". DR MOLLERSTROM stated, and VICTIM and subsequent sessions, no during the first session with mention was made of the SUBJECT fondling VICTIM'S vagina or any other incident with

Following advisement of rights, SUBJECT was questioned pertaining to the incidents involving VICTIM and SUBJECT responsed thru Capt SPITZER, that he would adopt "everything related to DR MOLLERSTROM as his statement". When queried about the incident in Las Vegas, entering bedroom, getting into bed with her, and fondling her, SUBJECT related he never got into bed with her. At that point, Capt SPITZER stated his client would stand by his statement made to DR MOLLERSTROM. Based upon the responses provided to each question during this interview, the interview was terminated. Prior to departing the AFOSI office, SUBJECT was asked if he was willing to provided a written statement. SUBJECT replied he was "willing to stand on his statement made to Dr MOLLERSTROM as the truth".

NOTE: SUBJECT declined to consent to a search of his on-base residence (ref para 4-3, below).

MS PELISH related on 25 Apr 86, while working at the Family Support Center, MAB, JA., entered her office with VICTIM and related the following:

this past weekend (19 Apr 86).

approximately two years ago. PELISH produced her notes of the incident (recorded on AF Form 2801 and maintained at the Family Support Center) and stated she wrote sexually molested because stated. SUBJECT had fondled VICTIM'S and breasts and vagina.

APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may-if he or she does not agree with the decision-request a review from the regional director by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the local council decision.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the regional decision. The decision by the National Council is final.
