

Scoutmaster Awaits Sentence in Sex Case

Staff and Wire Reports

A 70-year-old Berkeley scoutmaster will have to register as a sex offender and another Northern California Boy Scout leader has received a 10-year prison sentence in connection with molesting young boys.

[REDACTED] has been a scoutmaster [REDACTED] for more than 30 years. [REDACTED] on Alameda county court [REDACTED] will be sentenced next month.

[REDACTED] was originally charged with two other counts of molestation involving two other boys, but those charges were dropped as part of a plea bargain that will place [REDACTED] in five years probation and will require his [REDACTED] who was [REDACTED] in the case.

Master [REDACTED] was sentenced to 10 years in prison Wednesday in Sacramento County Superior Court after pleading guilty to nine counts of lewd

Two people died yesterday when two small private planes collided over a remote rural area in San Joaquin County near Tracy.

The planes were a Cessna 180 and a Beechcraft Baron. Investigators said there was only one person in each plane. Larry Bret Foltchman, 59, of Novato was identified as one pilot. The name of the other pilot was withheld.

A Sacramento-area Scoutmaster whose volunteer work earned him his community's "Year" award in 1988, has been sentenced to 10 years in state prison for molesting nine boys.

[REDACTED] pleaded guilty to nine molestation counts in a plea bargain that had called for [REDACTED] eight years.

[REDACTED] rejected the agreement, hoping the acts had "horrendous" effects on his 8- to 14-year-old victims. Five of the boys are in counseling; one has been placed in a residential mental facility for evaluation, and at least one of the victims has withdrawn from men in general, including his own father, according to court documents.

Scoutmaster pleads guilty

[REDACTED] (SJNS) — [REDACTED] a former Gail Boy Scouts of America scoutmaster, pleaded guilty Monday to nine counts of child molestation.

[REDACTED] had not entered a plea on the charges since his arrest when he was charged with molesting eight boys, ranging in age from 8 to 14 years old, in his home. None of the victims were scouts, police said.

[REDACTED] a 41-year-old man, who remains free on his own recognizance, faces up to eight years in state prison for the crimes. He will be sentenced July 5.

[REDACTED] was born and raised in [REDACTED], turned himself in to authorities after a month-long investigation. [REDACTED] requested a warrant for his arrest. [REDACTED] cooperated with investigators.

Man found hanged in closet

LODI (SJNS) — A 20-year-old client in a Lodi board and care home was found Friday hanged in the closet of his room. Coroner's officials suspect he was the victim of suicide.

Yu Tran lived at the Central Manor Residential Care Home, 408 E. Pine, since July 1988. He was diagnosed as having chronic mental disorders, according to a San Joaquin County coroner's report.

Assistant Administrator Clara Lagorio reportedly told investigators that Tran showed no signs of problems prior to his death, but did allegedly show some signs of hostility toward another client in April. A housekeeper told deputies that Tran appeared to be ill or slightly depressed at lunchtime the day he was found dead.

A social worker who visited Tran the day before his death said he wanted to be transferred to a facility that had more Vietnamese clients, but appeared to

unemployment as the two most important problems which should be addressed by a county agency in charge of administering local anti-poverty programs.

Results of the Community Action Agency survey of 400 residents were presented at two public hearings Monday in Stockton and at the Manteca Senior Citizen Center.

Nancy Miller, CAA community services coordinator, said the hearings were held to receive public comment on what programs and services for the poor the agency should spend its money on during calendar year 1989.

She said CAA will have a total budget of \$371,351 federal grants monies to spend in 1990, and with that amount, is charged with addressing the gamut of social ills which contribute to poverty.

"We are what's left over from the old war on poverty program from the days of Lyndon Johnson," Miller said.

Tough pollution

STOCKTON (SJNS) — Tough new air pollution regulations proposed for San Joaquin County businesses were unveiled Monday in an effort to bring the county back into compliance with federal air quality regulations.

If the state air quality agency gets its way, however, the new regulations could have an expensive impact on industries that have been issued air pollution control district permits since March 10.

According to Lakhmir Grewal, director of San Joaquin County's Air Pollution Control District, businesses with "stationary sources" of air emissions — boiler operations, co-generation plants, coal crushing operations, canneries and gasoline service stations, for example — will need to install controls on their emissions of nitrogen oxides, PM10s or sulfur oxides regardless of how much of the smog-producing compounds they allow into the air. Previous regulations allowed up to 150 pounds of the compounds to be released in a day before controls were required.

Grewal said the main concern new businesses have is when the new regulations will go into effect. The state Air Resources Control Board wants to make them retroactive to March 10, when the state agency held a hearing on San Joaquin Valley residents' concerns regarding coal-burning industries.

If "best available control technology" fails to control emissions from a specific business, then it must participate in an "offset" program. To compensate for the pollutants it is releasing, a business must pay to install controls on another business' emissions, thus "offset" the air pollution impact. The costs could be staggering.

"It will make their lives miserable," Grewal said of the regulations' effect on local industries. However, he

Woman guilty in son's death

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP) — A former Modesto woman charged in the beating death of her 2-year-old son has been found guilty of manslaughter by an Arizona judge.

Christina Idleman, 24, had been charged with first-degree murder but agreed to plead guilty to a lesser charge to be decided by the judge. The manslaughter verdict was announced by Mohave County Superior Judge Steven S. Conn after an evidentiary hearing Thursday.

Bail hearing today for Holmes, Mackey

Thomas Holmes and James Mackey, charged with first degree murder in the death of Stockton real estate agent Lawrence John Carnegie, will be appearing before Lodi Municipal Court Judge J. Thomas Seibly at an arraignment and bail hearing today at 1:30 p.m.

The pair were arrested Wednesday and arraigned Friday in the Lodi Municipal Court. The pair are being held without bail in San Joaquin County Jail.

Mackey and Holmes, who are cousins, are accused of murdering Carnegie on Feb. 28. Mackey has retained Stockton attorney Marvin Marks as his attorney while Holmes has retained attorney Ralph Cingcon of Stockton.

Carnegie, 38, was co-owner of Riverboat Realty in Stockton. The real estate agent was fatally shot by an arrow at a home on Tokay Colony Road that he was preparing to show to a client. His body was found near Cloverdale in Sonoma County.

On the evening of Feb. 28, a woman who periodically checked on the unoccupied home for its owners said she saw Carnegie wrapped in a bloody sleeping bag being dragged to a car by two black men.

She was able to give a description of one man for a composite drawing, which sheriff's officials said allegedly match some of Holmes' features.

Isenberg works to preserve legislative agenda

SACRAMENTO — One-third of the bills introduced by Assemblyman Phil Isenberg this year have fallen short of a mid-session deadline, and are in danger of failing, an analysis of his bill package reveals.

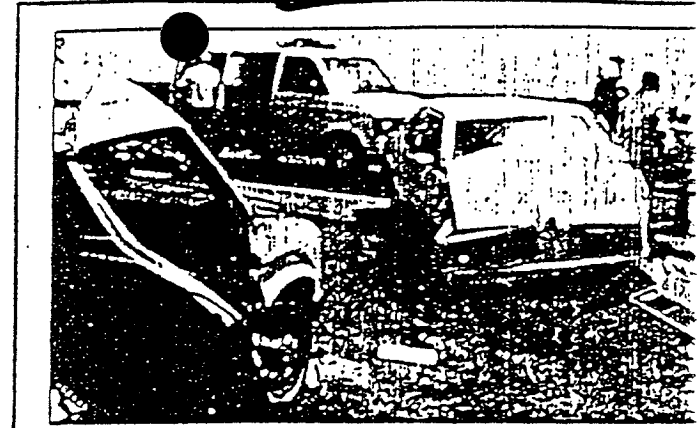
But, because of some last-second wrangling, the lawmaker may yet preserve much of his agenda, according to an aide.

Isenberg, who took over the

powerful Assembly Judiciary Committee this year, undertakes a lengthy and involved process to decide which bills to author. Because of this, most of them eventually pass, according to chief-of-staff Alison Harvey.

"Phil's philosophy is to never give up," said Harvey, who predicted only one of Isenberg's seven bills that missed a late May deadline may fail.

Meanwhile, 13 of his measures successfully cleared policy commit-

Three-vehicle accident kills one on Highway

A 61-year-old woman from Altaville died Monday when the van she was driving in was involved in a three-vehicle accident on Highway 12. Her name has not been released pending notification of next of kin.

She was a passenger in a van driven by Robert Laur, 67, of Altaville. He was taken to Lodi Memorial Hospital where he is listed in stable condition.

The other vehicles involved in the accident were a car and big rig.

At approximately 1:43 p.m., the rig was traveling westbound on Hwy. 12 about one-half mile west of Tower Park Marina when it veered into the eastbound lane and struck with the van driven by Laur, according to

the California Highway Patrol. The collision caused the van to go out of control and struck on the passenger side, according to a report.

The car was driven by Mantanty, a Stockton resident. He was treated at Lodi Memorial Hospital and released.

There were no passengers in the car, which was totaled at the accident scene.

The CHP report did not list the name of the truck driver. The truck sustained damage and the driver injured.

There were no arrests given, but the case is under investigation.

Molestation charges against scout leader

man, who has been a Boy Scouts of America troop leader for 18 years, has been arrested and charged with molesting eight scouts ranging in age from 11 to 14. [redacted] appeared in court on Wednesday but did not enter a plea to the charges. [redacted] are an attorney and return to court for arraignment March 6.

According to Sacramento County Deputy District Attorney [redacted] [redacted] and bathed some of the youths, and spanked others as they stood nude. All of the incidents allegedly occurred at Trueman's home last year. Last year, [redacted] remains in custody in lieu of bail. His arrest on Feb. 27 came after about a month of investigation, [redacted] said.

[redacted] admits molestations

[redacted] leader and scoutmaster has admitted that he molested eight boys and punished some of them by making them stand naked, according to court documents. [redacted] no contest to eight felony charges. [redacted] in [redacted] for his volunteer [redacted] initially denied molesting the 14-year-old boys in his home. But court records said he later told investigators he had bathed some of the boys, tickled their genitals and made them stand naked when they misbehaved. "I do what I do because I'm searching for satisfaction," [redacted] said. "I'll help the boys, I need to feel needed in return."

A 70-year-old Berkeley scoutmaster will have to register as a sex offender and another Northern California Boy Scout leader has received a 10-year prison sentence in connection with molesting young boys.

who has been a scoutmaster in Berkeley for more than 30 years, pleaded guilty on August 9 in Berkeley-Albany Municipal Court to two counts of child molesting involving a young boy who was in his troop. will be sentenced next month.

was originally charged with two other counts of molestation involving two other boys, but those charges were dropped as part of a plea bargain that will place on five years probation and will require him to register as a sex offender, said Berkeley Police Lieutenant Michel de Latour, who was chief investigator in the case.

Meanwhile, former Galt scoutmaster who was that city's 1988 "Citizen of the Year," was sentenced to 10 years in prison Wednesday in Sacramento County Superior Court after pleading guilty to nine counts of lewd
