The Scout in Troop 35 involved in the case of Anthur Joynes, Scoutmaster, showed erratic behavior at home. His mother became concerned and questioned her son concerning his outside activities. The mother talked with the Family Aid Society of Fairfield, where they live, and complained to the director about the Scoutnester, indicating she had a suspicion that the Scoutmaster was not of good moral character. The Family Aid Association called me and I immediately called Arthur Joynes and arranged an appointment.

When I confronted him with the accusation of molesting a Scout sexually, he admitted it was true. I explained to him that he would have to resign from the Boy Scouts of America immediately, and also talk with his pastor. The pastor and I have discussed what should be done and we are in accord. Arthur Joynes resigned, promised not to see the Scout involved or any other Scout and seek psychiatric treatment. To my knowledge he has done this. Arthur Joynes does not intend, at this time, to leave this area. His employer knows about Arthur's weakness and agreed to continue his employment provided Arthur gets treatments.

If there are any other steps you feel we should do, please adviše us.
