We are pleased to advise you that your employment as a professional trainee has been approved by the Boy Scouts of America and the Executive Board of the Nashua Valley Council.

Your signature on all copies of this letter will indicate your acceptance of this position with the following terms of employment:

You will assume your duties with this council in a Class 1 position on November 1, 1980 with an annual salary of \$11,000, payable in equal installments on the 15th and last day of each calendar month. Salary adjustments, if any, will be determined by the Council Executive with the approval of the Executive Board.

You will be responsible to the Council Executive, and will serve as a professional trainee until successful completion of the National Executive Institute, normally within three months from date of employment. During the professional trainee period, employment may be terminated by either party upon two weeks written notice stating the reasons for the termination.

The Council will reimburse you for the expense of moving from Clinton to the district you will serve provided the estimate has been approved in advance by the Executive Board or its authorized representative.

You will be offered and are encouraged to enroll in the employee benefits program of the Boy Scouts of America which includes basic and supplemental life insurance, a major medical plan, long term disability, accident insurance, and a basic and supplemental retirement plan, and to contribute to the cost of such programs to the extent determined by the Executive Board. You are also encouraged to participate in the fellowship of the Scout Executives' Alliance.

You will be reimbursed for authorized expenses by submitting expense statements monthly to the Council Executive for review and approval.



The Council will provide you with an insured council-leased automobile for which you will be personally responsible while it is assigned to you. For the privilege of using such leased-auto for personal driving, you will reimburse the council \$15.00 flat rate per month, plus ten cents per mile of personal driving. Details of the plan are in a separate "Leased Auto Agreement."

After April 1, 1981 you will be allowed ten working days vacation, annually, with pay. Allowable vacation time increases with tenure as outlined in the Compensation and Benefits Guide.

Upon completion of the National Executive Institute and the issuance of a commission by the Boy Scouts of America, you will serve as District Executive. After commissioning, employment may be terminated at any time by either party upon 30 days written notice, stating the reasons for such termination. At council option or upon your being decommissioned as a professional Scouter, the 30 days notice may be waived by payment of one month's salary, plus compensation for any unused and/or accrued vacation, less any outstanding amounts due the council.

In earning and receiving your commission as a professional Scouter, you agree to work cooperatively with your fellow professionals and the duly elected or appointed officials of the council in accordance with the policies, practices, regulations and charters and by-laws of the National and Local councils.

Based on your position description and standards of performance, a review of your performance will be conducted by your supervisor at least once a year.

For personal and professional growth, you will be given the opportunity and will be expected to participate in regularly scheduled training conferences, courses and seminars and, subject to Executive Board approval, will be reimbursed by the council for your expenses.

In accepting this employment, you agree that you do not, and will not, have any material outside interest, direct or indirect, which might create or be construed to create conflict with your duties and responsibilities with the Boy Scouts of America.

We extend a most cordial welcome to you as you undertake your new responsibilities and look forward to a long and successful association.

In May, I was visited by a Sergeant from the Shirley Police requesting information on Mr. Cooper who was wanted by then for child molestation. He had left Shirley "in the middle of the night" per the police. They had traced him to Winchendon where his son is registered with our Troop 35. We were led to believe he might attempt to register with that Troop, hence my letter.

At the moment, I doubt we can supply documentation to justify your refusal of registration. So far as i can determine, any prodeedings have yet to run their course. 


