Berkeley Springs Water Is Her Li

BERKELEY SPRINGS — Gladys Whittington really enjoys her job. So much so, that during the past three decades she has never really considered quitting her job as an office worker for the town's water department.

Even now, when she could consider retirement after 30 years service, the thought doesn't enter her mind — at least not too often.

In June 1959, Whittington first started working as a clerk for the town's water department, which was then owned by a Washington, D.C., company.

"When I first started working for the water department, my job was to collect the money when customers came in to pay their water bills," she

Thirty years later, Whittington finds her responsibilities including billing, filing and bookkeeping, las well as being a secretary. "Now I do everything. I'm a Girl Friday now," Whittington said with a claugh.

The work associated with her job has remained basically the same through the years, but the amount of work has increased. When she started, the town had 600 water customers. Now the town has 1,200 customers, she said.

whittington still uses an old manual billing machine to produce the water bills, which are mailed quarterly. "It's a cheap way, but a good bit of work is involved with it," she said. "They are now thinking about going to computers. They told us they're having trouble getting parts now for the billing machine."

Water customers can count on receivin water bills. "Our billing has always gonetime in the 30 years that I've been here quite a record." Whittington said proudly.

Her (avorite part of her job is mee public. "In fact, that's why I don't retire." s

Customers, especially the elderly, like when they come in to pay their bills, Wh said. "Old people like to get out to pay thei she said.

Through the years, many customer brought their children with them to pay the "Now those children who used to come in with parents in the past come in and bring their conow," she said.

While she likes to prepare the bills an them because she looks forward to seeing when they come in to pay, the worst part of is collecting money from people with fir difficulties. "There are people who don't ha money. There's some people that do have time paying," she said.

Most of the time, her job has been routine. allows her to work at her own pace. White said. However, customers, who for the most are nice, have disrupted the routine at creating some memorable moments. White said.

For instance, one day after a man paid he walked out the door and stepped off the curb and fell over dead, Whittington said.


