Attached please find a confidential record sheet for one Bryan G. Phillips with a copy of his court-martial order from the U.S. Army.

Mr. Phillips is not currently associated with Scouting and has not been since 1986 when he served as a rifle range instructor for our summer camp program. (Bryan Phillips was assigned by Fort Devens per our annual request to supply a rifle ranger instructor for camp.)

Mr. Phillips is currently in jail pending a Grand Jury hearing resulting from civilian charge filed by two different families. One of the alleged victims is a Scout but to the best of our knowledge no other Scouts are involved. None of the incidents were related to Scout properties or events, and we have a positive relationship with the one Scout family involved and Fort Devens.

Sergeant Bryan G. Phillips, [REDACTED] US Army, Signal Company, Support Battalion (Provisional), 10th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces, Fort Devens, Massachusetts, was arraigned at Fort Devens, Massachusetts, on the following offenses at a special court-martial convened by Commander, Fort Devens.

Charge: Article 134. Plea: Guilty. Finding: Guilty.

Specification 1: Indecent assault upon [REDACTED] on 25 July 1987.
Plea: Guilty. Finding: Guilty.

Specification 2: Indecent assault upon [REDACTED] on 14 January 1988.
Plea: Guilty. Finding: Guilty.

SENTENCE

Sentence was adjudged on 9 May 1988. Bad conduct discharge, confinement for 3 months, and reduction to E1.

ACTION

Only so much of the sentence as provides for reduction to E1, confinement for 30 days, and a bad conduct discharge is approved and, except for the part of the sentence extending to a bad conduct discharge, will be executed.
