Trooper Potts, Investigating Officer for the case is still on vacation but Trooper Ely also an investigating officer with the Leonardtown Barracks, State Police told me that he could give me the case number only and that there were no charges pressed by the parents because of the effect on the boys. There was no newspaper publicity. If additional facts are needed the National Office can request the information and it would have to be cleared through the Headquarters of the Md. State Police.

This is to make record of the situation that accured in troop 913 of the Leonardtown, Md. area. (Dec 16th, 69)

It was found that Scoutmaster Theodore W. White, Asst. Scoutmasters Charles Fulton and James Knowlton had committed indecent acts with boys of the troop.

This came to light when one father, Mr. [REDACTED] called me for a meeting and when we met, stated that Mr. Ted White had committed indecent acts with his son. He stated that he had talked with the States Attorney, Mr. Joseph Weiner and they had confronted Mr. White with the facts as they knew them. He, Mr. White, stated it was true and that he would go under the Doctors care. Mr. [REDACTED] decided not to press charge for the boys sake and because he personally knew Mr. White for some time. Officer [REDACTED] of the Maryland State Police was the investigating officer for the case and found that 3 or 4 boys were involved to some extent. It was also found that the Asst. SM, Charles Fulton, since moved to Montgomery County, was involved at summer camp last year (1969) for the same offense. He was contacted by the State Police and questioned but not charged but his statement is on record with the States Attorney. James Knowlton, an asst. SM also was involved and has since gone to college in Louisiana. Charges were not brought against any of the men but each has his statement on record with the States Attorney in Leonardtown, Md. (Dec 17th, 69)

On finding out this information I called the committee of the Troop to a meeting the next day and Mr. White was told not to come into contact with any of the boys of the troop from this time forward. Mr. Fulton called me from Montgomery County and stated he would no longer be active with an Scouting movement and knows he will be placed on a confidential listing. Mr. Knowlton, then ranger at Camp Roosevelt, called me and I set up a meeting between Mr. Howard Kautz and Knowlton. He stated his part in the activity and was immediatly released from employment and told he too would be placed on the confidential listing.

From the date this was found out, there has been no contact made by the three men to the boys to my knowledge. The committee worked hard to overcome this situation and to keep it from getting to much publicity both for the boys and for scouting. They were able to get the services of a State Trooper, John Simms, who attained the rank of Eagle and have gotten the confidence of most of the parents back in the Troop. John has signed up in the troop as Scoutmaster for the coming year and the committee is working with him to insure a good continuing program.
