Child molester given 38 years in prison

Oaks man convicted on 89 separate counts

BY AMY SIEGEL

VENTURA - A Thousand Oaks man and longtime Boy Scouts leader was sentenced Friday to serve 38 years in prison for repeatedly molesting two young girls over several vears.

Charles Robert Caballos, 58, had been convicted after a trial in August of 39 separate child molestation charges.

Cebailos, who a probation report says suffers from arthripriasis and is overweight jounds, is likely to spend est of his life behind bars.

He will be eligible for parole in 19 years, when he is 77 years old. At that time, his victims, who are now 11 and 15 years old, will be 30 and 34 years old, respectively.

Deputy District Attorney Michael Frawley asked Superior Court Judge Robert Bradley to give Cebailos a prison term long enough so the victims would "not have to see him on the street until they are well into

their adult years. Time is not going to heal the victims' emotional scars," Frawley said.

in a 19-page letter to Judge Bradley, Caballos maintained his innocence and denied the

charges, as he had at his twoweek trial. He accused the victims' aunt - who had urged the girls to tell police of the molestations - of manipulating the girls and of "brainwashing"

'I fael at this time as I have ail along that I am innocent and a victim of circumstances," Cebailes wrote. He did not address the judge on Friday, and neither aid the victims. Ceballos did not openly react to Bradley's lengthy sentence.

Cebailos' attorney, Jenny Scovis of Thousand Oaks, asked his make for lemency, saving Ceballos is not a "violent" or 'mean" man.

Bradley also told Caballus to pay \$10,000 to the state victims' Restitution Fund, ordered \$225 in fines and ordered him to submit samples of his blood and saliva for testing to check for various diseases.

The jury also found true several special allegations that the motestation included intercourse with one gart and that the crimes were committed under duress or with force. The two charges for which he was acquitted were conceded by the prosecution because Casaliss was out of town at the time of the aileged incidents.

Jurors said after the trial that they believed the girls and not Capailos.


