Local man arrested

day morning on suspicion of molesting an 11-year-old boy at a Tuolumne County campground five years ago when he was a Boy Scout camp

It was the second time this year that Charles William Robb, 27, of 1313 Sequoia Place, has been charged with molesting boys during camping trips.

On May 1, Robb was arrested by Sacramento County authorities on four felony counts of molesting boys between 8 and 11 years old. The alleged incidents occurred during an overnight YMCA activity in Sacramento in March.

Robb remained free on bail after booking on the Sacramento charges. A \$20,000 warrant for his arrest on the Tuolumne County charges was issued recently and Robb was arrested by Davis police at his home

The Tuolumne incident reportedly occurred in 1981 when Robb was a camp counselor for the Boy Scouts of America in Merced County, according to Tuolumne County sheriff's investigator Tom Kaufmann.

The Merced Boy Scout troop came to Camp John Mensinger in the high country of Tuolumne County for a weeklong camp, Kaufmann said. The victim, an 11-year-old camper, reported two incidents to camp authorities but because molestation was less understood then, Robb was not prosecuted, although he was asked to resign from his position as COURSEION

After the Sacramento cases came to light, Tuolumne County authorities sought a warrant for his arrest on two counts of lewd and lascivious acts with a child under the age of 14 for the 1981 incidents, Kaufmann

According to reports, Robb has been accused of similar crimes in Atwater, Turiock and Modestes: Authorities say he would resign from one scouting troop, move to a new community and join-enother troop after each accusation came to light.

Arraignment in Tuolumne County has been set for early next month, Kaufman said.



Davis man accused of molestatior

SACRAMENTO - A Davis youth worker has been accused of four counts of sexually molesting children during an overnight activity at a YMCA gymnasium, authorities reported.

Charles William Robb, 27, of 1313 Sequoia-Place, was-freed on \$25,000 bail Thursday after a Sacramento. County Superior Court hearing. Robb, an assistant program director

ith the YMCA and a volunteer Boy cout leader, is accused of molestation involving five boys ranging in age from 9 to 16 years old.

Davis police aided Sacramento County authorities in Robb's arrest Thursday afternoon.

Robb was charged with performing a lewd and lascivious act on a 9year-old boy; molesting an 11-yearold boy; and two counts of molesting and annoying children, The Associated Press reported.

Authorities said the alleged incidents occurred March 14 at an "overnighter" activity at the Almond Avenue YMCA facility in suburban Orangevale.

According to a 41-page investigative report submitted to the court, molestation allegations involving Robb — but no formal charges had also been raised when he worked with troops in Atwater, Turlock and Modesto. According to the Reagan tha report, Robb was asked to incre see eral frome. then would just another troop elapwhere the AP said.

A court date has not yet been set.
