I, your complainant, Brian Killacky, have been a police officer for 14 years and have been involved in the investigation of sexual exploitation of children for five years for the Chicago Police Department, Special Investigation Unit of the Youth Division. I have attended the FBI academy and have lectured at the FBI academy on human topology and the sexual exploitation of children and also lectured at Chicago City Colleges, Illinois State Police and the Chicago Police Department training academy. I have initiated hundreds of investigations and hundreds of arrests involving the sexual exploitation of children. Of the cases that have been prosecuted, over 95% have resulted in conviction. On February 15, 1987, a Confidential Informant (hereinafter referred to as C.I.) who has been used in the past to successfully prosecute and convict at least 50 adult child molesters and pornographers contacted myself regarding an individual who was attempting to sell magazines depicting child pornography. On February 19, 1987, the C.I. and I met with an individual now known as Dean Dunham at Chicago, County of Cook. He introduced himself to the C.I. and myself and handed me three magazines depicting child pornography. Magazine number 1 was titled Boy Scout Manual, depicting children who appeared to be under the age of 18 engaged in sexual conduct. Magazine number 2 was titled Yum Yum Chickens, and depicted children who appeared to be under the age of 18 engaged in sexual conduct. Magazine number 3 was titled London Lads and de icted children who appeared to be under the age of 18 engaged in sexual conduct. In exchange for those magazines, Dean requested \$300.00. During a conversation with Dean, he indicated that he had gotten this material from a Dan Hemley from Joliet, Illinois, on Friday the 13th and said that this man had more child pornography. At this point, Dean was placed under arrest and charged with violation of the child pornography statute.

Upon arrival at the station, Dean was advised of his constitutional rights which he waived. He then related that he traveled to Joliet, Illinoi on or about February 13, 1987, where he met with a man named Dan Hemley, who delivered to him the three magazines which he attempted to sell to me. He further related that Hemley lived at , Joliet, Illinois, and that his phone number is . He related that he has known Hemley for many years and that Hemley was a "chicken Hawk". Your complainar knows from his education and investigation experiences that is street terminology for a man who sexually prefers children. Dean related that in August of 1985, he had been in Hemley's residence at and that Hemley had tied him up for two days. He had broke loose and contacted the Joliet City Police Department. (CR# 85-35987) During that time he had observed child pornography magazines stored in a wooden trunk within Dan Henley's residence which is located on the first floor of 511 Jasper. He further related that Dan Hemley was sexually involved with a young boy from the neighborhood. On February 20, 1987, I spoke with Investigator Tom Quillman of the Joliet City Police Department who indicated that in fact the case report previously mentioned was made by Dean Dunham on August 19, 1985, complaining of a criminal sexual abuse. Investigator Ouillman told me that on February 20, 1987, he did a visual observation of observed a 1974 Oldsmobile bearing Illinois Registration house with green shingle siding. I spoke with Agent James Turner of the Illinois State Police who related to me that he checked the phone number with the Illinois State Intellegence Division and received information that this telephone number registered to D.R. Hemley . On February 20, 1987, I recontacted Dean Dunham and at of this time, he related to me that Dan Hemley resided on the first floor JRF

that there was another family that lived on the second floor.
Through your complainant's education and undercover experience over the
past five years as an investigator assigned to the Special Investigative Uni
of the Chicago Police Department Youth Division I have consistently observed
the following characteristics of individuals who collect and disseminate chi
pornography. Persons who collect child pornography rarely, if ever, destroy
pictures depicting children engaged in sexual activities. My investigations
have disclosed that during the execution of search warrants child pornograph
purchased many years earlier has been recovered from child pornography coll-
ectors. Some of the reasons child pornographer collectors retain their
material is for sexual gratification while viewing the material, lowering th
inhibitions of the children that come into the residence, as a medium of
exchange with persons of similar interests and economic gain for the sale or
distribution of child pornography.
Your complainant believes that if a search warrant is executed at the
residence of Dan Hemley located at
Will, evidence of proof of residency and violations of the child
pornography statute would be recovered.
