Enclosed you will find paperwork on Daniel Donahue, former Scoutmaster of Boy Scout Troop 259, chartered to the Nashua Association for Retarded Citizens in Nashua, New Hampshire.

On May 14, 1985, Mr. Donahue was arrested for allegedly molesting a male minor. Upon learning of his arrest, we took the immediate action of suspending his registration and notifying him of the same via a hand-delivered letter (see copy enclosed) to him in jail. He made no comment at the time but did sign that he had received the letter (see document enclosed).

We have held up notification to you pending his actual indictment since, with his wife's refusal to post bail, he has remained in jail since his arrest. Now that he has been indicted (see news clipping enclosed), we are forwarding all paperwork to you.

## Man faces sexual assault charge

A 55-year-old Nashua man was arrested at 2 a.m. today for allegedly molesting a boy yesterday, according to Detective Maj. Robert C. Barry.

Daniel J. Donahue of 11 New Hampshire Ave. is charged with aggravated felonious sexual assault, Barry said. He would not say where the alleged attack took place or provide any other details.

Police are seeking a teen-age boy in connection with a burglary Saturday morning at a Verona Street home.

Barry said the boy, described as weighing about 140 pounds and dressed in cut-off blue jeans and a blue T-shirt, entered the home of

Esther M. Gorman, 4 Verona St., at about 11.

The boy grabbed Mrs. Gorman's pocketbook while she slept, Barry said, but she was awakened when she heard a noise and went downstairs. She spotted the boy, yelled at him, and he dropped the pocketbook and ran out the back door.

Investigators are also probing a burglary Sunday night or Monday morning at the main concession stand at Holman Stadium.

A window was forced open, and it appeared a walk-in refrigerator had been entered. It was not known what was taken.

"The formula will benefit the neediest school districts regardless of the amount of money involved," said Sen. William Johnson, R-Northwood.

**CONCORD (AP)** — The Senate passed a bill to restructure the state's program to aid local school districts but it still is not clear how much money the state will provide.

On a voice vote, the Senate approved a House bill that would roll all of the state's education bills into one formula, including foundation aid, sweepstakes money, special education aid and the schools' share of the business profits tax. The formula would be based on a community's tax base and the value of taxable property.

The bill's supporters say it will help ease the burden of property taxes in poorer communities.

The new formula also makes ad-

The House bill calls for \$50.2 million a year in state aid while Gov. John Sununu has made \$39.1 million available in his budget.

Randy Bell of the School Board's Association said that under the House plan, about 80 towns would lose about \$2 million in three or four years. At \$39.1 million, about 130 communities would lose about \$4 million, he said;

Nashua has been charged with kidnapping a 17-year-old girl and raping her five times.

This week, a Hillsborough County Grand Jury handed down five rape indictments and one kidnapping indictment against Duff, 33, formerly of 16 D Street, Nashua.

Duff was out on work release from the Hillsborough County House of Correction on April 16 when he allegedly raped the girl in the woods off Osgood Road. The indictments allege Duff abducted the girl on Elm Street and forced her into a truck. Duff then allegedly hit the girl and threatened further harm before the rapes.

Duff is currently being held in the Hillsborough County Jail in lieu of \$50,000 bail. No arraignment or trial date has been set at this time.

# Queen City Woman Is Indicted On Negligent Homicide Charge

The Hillsborough County Grand Jury returned 152 indictments in its June session including a negligent homicide indictment against a 27-year-old Manchester woman.

Cheryl Laplante of 232 Lowell St. is charged in connection with the May 17 death of pedestrian Laurence Stevens, 75, of 10 Paxon St.

Stevens was struck outside the Store 24 at 331 Main St., Nashua, at 11:41 p.m. by a car operated by Laplante. He was pronounced dead a half hour after the accident.

According to the indictment, Laplante was "under the influence of intoxicating liquor" at the time of the accident.

Other indictments were returned against:

Brian Bartlett, 35, of 43 Bacon St., Nashua, one count of aggravated felonious sexual assault in connection with the alleged sexual intercourse with a 9-year-old girl in late January.

Daniel T. Donahue, 55, of 11 New Hampshire Ave., Nashua, one count of aggravated felonious sexual assault in connection with an alleged assault May 14 in Nashua against a 12-year-old boy to whom he was related.

green assault in the stabbing of Phillip Saplenza of Manchester May 23 in Manchester.

Charles W. Smith, 26, of 72 High Pine St., Nashua, one count of assault for allegedly shooting Bruce Berube of Nashua in the leg with a shotgun on April 14.

Judy Ann Acevedo, who also used the last names Mardones and Planders, of Manchester, on two counts of welfare fraud, alleging she obtained more than \$3,000 in welfare assistance after failing to report her full income and employment to state officials in 1981 and 1984.

Elizabeth Graham, also known as Elizabeth Gathuler, 34, of Little Falls, N.Y., five counts of welfare fraud. She allegedly obtained a total of \$8,903 in public assistance, food stamps and subsidized housing by withholding information about her full-time employment in 1981-83.

Henry L. Slivewski Jr., 28, of 99 Westwood Drive, Manchester, one count of welfare fraud for allegedly receiving \$2,392 to which he was not entitled between December 1983 and May 1984 by failing to report his employment to state officials.

Dana Dorval, 20, being held at the Valley Street Jail, four counts of burglary, one count of theft, in connection with burglaries of Nashua homes and a Boys Club in January and February.

Alan Martilla, 20, of 72 Lock St., Nashua, on five counts of burglary involving Nashua homes between September and December.

Victor Blanchart, 19, being held at Valley Street jail, three counts of forgery in connection with checks totalling \$1,700.

Timothy P. Cote, 19, held at Valley Street jail, on single counts of burglary and theft, and three counts of theft, second offense.
