Dear Charlie:

I have carefully read the file on Mr. Sparks, and have also had it reviewed by David Park, our legal counsel. We have some serious concerns.

It is indicated in the file which we have that Mr. Sparks sexually molested according to the written testimony. I don't find anywhere it has been denied that he did this.

He also apparently was having this underage youth at his apartment, and by himself, so that we had one adult, and one youth member together, which is against our policy.

I know there is a fine line between the conversion of youth to adult related to the basic Boy Scout policy, but at the present time we are using the age breakdown based on the age of 18, and when individuals can become adult members.

We really don't have anything that indicates whether the council told Darrell why he was being suspended, or his reaction. Just because the individual would not press charges or talk to the council individuals, or to the Department of Public Safety, are not legitimate reasons for reinstating him.

JAN 0 6 1992 ERIN O'RILEY I hate to put you in this position, but I feel that at this time we must have a complete statement of the reason the review committee decided to reinstate Mr. Sparks. At that point, we will be most happy to re-analyze this situation, but at the present time we do not feel that a letter should be written to Mr. Sparks reinstating him.



#### INCIDENT INVOLVING DARRELL SPARKS

Incident took place on Wednesday, August 14, 1991, in Wilmington, Delaware, in Darrell Sparks' apartment, , Wilmington, DE 19808. , age 17, of Reistertown, MD 21136, came into camp on Friday, August 16, and when cabin assignments were made, he asked not to be assigned to that cabin. Jim McGinn assigned him to another cabin. On Monday, August 19, Jim talked to and he told Jim that he and Darrell had been wrestling and watching television, and he was hitting at Darrell with a bean-bag chair and probably even kicked at him. Darrell used his foot and rubbed his leg and fondled his genitals with his foot. said NO, don't do that. Darrell stopped and said he shouldn't talk to anyone and should see a clergyman. About 2:15 p.m. a man called and asked to speak to Jim, and he wanted to know if he knew he had a staff member making advances at a male staff member under age. Jim said that he had been advised and was looking into it. He told Jim it was Darrell Sparks but wouldn't give the youth's name. It we didn't do something, he would begin calling parents. I told Jim we would be down tomorrow and to make sure another adult was in this cabin. On the advice of council attorney, Bill Poole, I contacted Randy Murrill, and we went to camp on Tuesday, August 20, to talk to and Darrell Sparks. Tuesday, August 20 - Randy Murrill and Jim Gentry arrived in camp and talked He pretty much covered what he had said to Jim McGinn. Randy and I brought Darrell in and told him an allegation had been made and that the council has evidence he does not meet the standards of membership in the BSA. We indicate this was confidential. I gave Darrell Sparks a letter along with a statement (procedures for a review) and told him he should stop all Scouting activities and leave camp as soon as possible. Refunded registration fee and he gave it back, so it was mailed to him under separate cover. Randy Murrill and I had call his parents as he had said nothing to them. He got his mother at home and she said she would call his father and have him call me. called and said he had called his lawyer and he didn't know what they were going to do. I told him steps had been taken to remove the individual from camp. I offered counseling should they decide it was needed.

Dear Mr. Gentry,

On August 20, 1991 this department received a referral from the State of Delaware, Division of Child Protective Service wherein it was alleged that age 17 was the victim of an offensive touching perpetrated by Darrell Sparks, age 21. Both and Sparks were counselors at Camp Rodney at the time of the incident.

Ouring the past month, numerous telephone attempts and one letter (via Certified Mail) to the residence to arrange an interview with were met with negative results. Without a first hand interview with the victim, an eyewitness or physical evidence there is no crime.

Sparks has retained an attorney to represent his legal rights as well as his personal interests in this case. Therefore an interview with him was not possible. Without the elements described in the previous paragraph, it must be assumed that Sparks is innocent of this criminal accusation.

The case has been reclassified as a miscellaneous investigation and closed. In the certified letter received by on 9-9-91, this case disposition was explained.

Thank you for your assistance in this investigation. Please do not hesitate to call if this department can be of further assistance to your agency.



Regarding the Owens case, sentencing is scheduled at Superior Court on November 1, 1991 at 0930 hours. If you plan to attend, feel free to call me and I'll meet you at court that morning.



If you wish to have this decision reviewed by a BSA regional review committee, please write to the regional director within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be granted. The procedures for a review of this decision are attached.

### PROCEDURES FOR A REVIEW

The following information is provided should you desire a review by the Northeast Region, BSA, of the decision to deny your registration.

- 1. Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to: Northeast Region, Boy Scouts of America, P. O. Box 350, Dayton, NJ 08810-0350. In your request you must include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon the receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
- 3. If the regional review committee determines that a review hearing is necessary, the committee will advise you whether or not you may attend. In some instances, no useful purpose would be served by having the applicant present. The hearing is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you, if you attend, will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, in the event you attend, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any person whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
- 5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 6. If you are dissatisfied with the decision of a regional review, you may request a further review by the National Council. The decision of the National Council will be final.


