

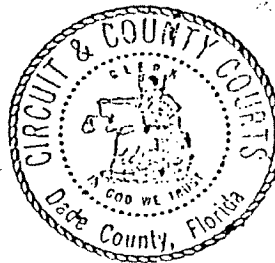

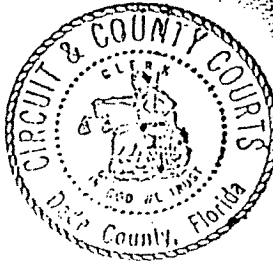

COMES NOW JANET RENO, State Attorney of the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida, by and through the undersigned Assistant State Attorney, and enters into the below-mentioned Plea Agreement with the defendant, Dave Aiken, with the advice and consent of his counsel, David Tucker, Esquire. The terms of the Plea Agreement are as follows:

1. This Plea Agreement is entered into by Howard Pohl, Assistant State Attorney, on behalf of the State of Florida and Dave Aiken, the defendant, with the advice and consent of counsel.

2. The defendant, Dave Aiken, will enter a plea of guilty to two (2) counts of Sexual Battery in case number 86-21128.

3. The defendant, Dave Aiken, will enter a plea of guilty to one (1) count of Sexual Battery and two (2) counts of Lewd Assault Act, in case number 86-21127.

4. The defendant will be sentenced to six (6) years State Prison followed immediately by fifteen (15) years probation on each count in case number 86-21128 and to six (6) years State Prison followed immediately by fifteen (15) years probation on each count in case number 86-21127. Said term of probation shall commence immediately upon defendant's release from incarceration. Said sentences are to run concurrent with one another. It will be the recommendation of this Assistant State Attorney and the Court that the defendant be incarcerated in a facility which will

enable him to receive Mentally Disordered Sex Offender counseling during the duration of his prison sentence.

5. The defendant shall report to the Department of Probation office in Dade County, Florida, within forty-eight (48) hours of said release. Failure to so report shall constitute a violation of probation.

6. The defendant will participate in, and successfully complete, an outpatient Mentally Disordered Sex Offender (MDSO) Program and receive any medical treatment, psychiatric treatment and counseling as recommended by Dr. Brainard Hinds.

7. The defendant will refrain from teaching in public schools and private schools, will not live with any minor children and will not enter into any profession, take any job or become involved in any hobby or activity involving the teaching of, supervision of, baby-sitting of, care of, custody of, control over, or placing him in contact with, minor children, for the duration of the probationary period.

8. The defendant shall not have any contact with the victims in the above-mentioned cases, or the victims' families.

9. The defendant will perform one hundred and fifty (150) hours of community service per year, for each year the defendant is on probation, for the duration of his probationary period, subject to the conditions stated above. Every effort shall be made by the defendant to perform the community service hours in the area of the needy or the elderly, i.e. Goodwill, Salvation Army, Camillius House, ^{Church work HHS DKT} etc. B.D.A. etc.

10. The defendant, Dave Aiken, will bear all costs of treatment and/or counseling and/or medication which may be necessary to successfully execute and complete this Plea Agreement.

11. The execution of this Plea Agreement constitutes an affirmative election by Dave Aiken to be sentenced within the Sentencing Guidelines, as modified, which became effective October 1, 1983, despite the fact that the crimes for which Dave Aiken is pleading guilty in cases number 86-21127 and 86-2112

may have occurred prior to the implementation of the Sentencing Guidelines.

12. The execution of this Plea Agreement by the defendant constitutes an understanding, acknowledgement and agreement to the special conditions of probation as mentioned herein, in addition to the standard terms and conditions of probation appearing on the "Terms and Conditions of Probation" form. Said execution also acknowledges the defendant's present ability and expected future ability to pay for the treatment and counseling as required by the terms herein.

Having read the above-mentioned terms of this Plea Agreement, and having been advised by my counsel, David Tucker, Esquire, I, Dave Aiken, freely and voluntarily enter into this Plea Agreement and agree to abide by all terms and conditions of this Plea Agreement, and agree that failure to comply with any terms or conditions within this agreement constitutes a violation of probation and will subject me to be sentenced to the maximum penalties provided by law for the crimes for which I am now pleading guilty.

This agreement being entered into freely and voluntarily on this 17 day of March, 1987.

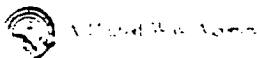

Ex-Scout leader held in sex case

MIAMI NEWS STAFF WRITER

A former Coconut Grove Boy Scout troop leader has been arrested by Miami police and charged with molesting two former Scouts during separate incidents over a three-year period.

David Aiken, 38, of 8415 S.W. 107th Ave., was charged by police last night with three counts of sexual battery and two counts of lewd and lascivious behavior, said battery detective Dan Dominguez. Aiken is a native Miamian and former leader of Boy Scout Troop 21 in Coconut Grove. He now works for Pan American World Airways as a reservations and sales agent, Dominguez said.

"From what I've seen, I would say that these kids have been damaged both physically and mentally, and it will take a lot for them to recover," Dominguez said.

According to documents in the possession of Miami police, Aiken was dismissed in July 1984 as the leader of Troop 21, a position he had held since 1979. A Scout complained to his mother that Aiken had used jock itch ointment on his genitals during a

camping trip in the summer of 1983.

That complaint was investigated by John Malone, director of field services for the Boy Scouts' South Florida Council. After completing his investigation, Malone dismissed Aiken but no charges were ever filed in connection with that incident, police said.

The charges Aiken now faces stem from incidents that occurred during 1980, 1981 and 1983. The two boys, who swore out complaints against Aiken, were not identified by police.

Dominguez said the first boy told police he was molested from October 1980 through October 1981, when Aiken lived in a house at 4094 Park Ave. in Coconut Grove. According to the complaint, the teen-age victim was working closely with Aiken, planning meetings, camping trips and hikes.

The boy said in the complaint that the planning sessions took place at Aiken's home. He told police that after a meeting in October 1980 Aiken took him into a bedroom and "persuaded" him to have sex.

The sexual contact continued almost every weekend until October 1981, when the boy left the Scouts, Dominguez said.

"He just gave up," the detective said. "He didn't report it, because he thought it was his fault and he didn't know how to deal with it."

Dominguez said the boy underwent several years of psychiatric counseling and filed his complaint in June. The boy still is being treated by a psychiatrist, Dominguez said.

The other charges stem from incidents that occurred in 1983 involving another teen-age boy, Dominguez said. According to the complaint filed by that teen-ager, the first sexual incident happened during a trip.

The boy said he had sexual relations with Aiken and the relationship continued when they returned home. The boy said most of the sexual activity took place in the

bedroom of Aiken's Coconut Grove home, Dominguez said.

The boy quit the Scouts in early 1984 and has recently begun psychiatric treatment, Dominguez said.

"He was very upset and he also blamed himself for it," Dominguez said. "He was embarrassed and he didn't report it because he thought his parents would kill him."

When both boys swore out complaints in June, Dominguez and his partner, Bradford Swink, began working with the Dade State Attorney's Office to prepare their case. They interviewed several other witnesses and yesterday obtained an arrest warrant for Aiken, Dominguez said.

Dominguez said Miami warrant officers Oscar Baez, Richie Santesteban and Raphael Martinez arrested Aiken at his Kendall home about 4:30 p.m. yesterday. Aiken offered no resistance and gave police a full statement last night, he said. He is being held without bond in the Dade County Jail today.

Aiken graduated from Coral Gables High School and served in Germany with the U.S. Army Transportation Corps from 1968 through 1970, police said. He returned to Miami and graduated from Miami-Dade Community College and Florida International University, earning a degree in criminology. He started working for Pan Am in 1973, police said.

Police still are investigating Aiken's activities while he was a troop leader and after he was dismissed. Dominguez and Swink are asking anyone with information about Aiken to contact them at 579-6530.

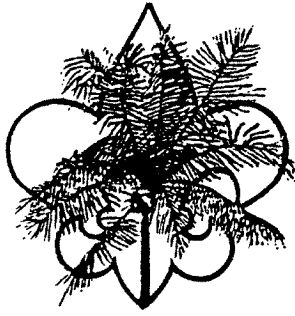

I, John Malone, met with Dave Aiken today to discuss accusations about his homosexual behavior with underage children and subsequent council action. I shared with Mr. Aiken the council responsibilities and chartered organization's obligation to maintain high adult volunteer leadership standards. I shared with him that as Director of Field Service I have a corporate responsibility to investigate as thoroughly as possible any and all accusations from within and outside the organization that pertain to volunteer Scouters. If any substance was found to the allegations and accusations, I had the responsibility to recommend to the Council Volunteer Leadership and/or National Council, Boy Scouts of America the following actions:

1. Resignation of the volunteer.
2. Suspension of the volunteer.
3. Termination of the volunteer

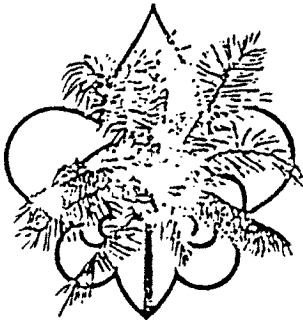
and if necessary turn over all information to the local judiciary body. I shared with Mr. Aiken the numerous rumors and innuendoes about his personal life and relationship with boys. I reminded him of the episode at summer camp in 1983 where he applied ointment to the genital areas of older Scouts. I shared with him, Dave Aiken, that I had in my possession a signed statement implicating him in a dormant homosexual relationship with [REDACTED] that dated back to 1972.

In concluding my conversation with Mr. Aiken I suspended him from all activities of the Boy Scouts of America subject to the approval of the Council Executive Board Leadership. In addition, I told Mr. Aiken I would share all information with the appropriate parties who needed to know.

Meeting concluded at 3:15 p.m. with Dave Aiken stating he had no homosexual relationship with [REDACTED]. However, he understood the South Florida Council's action and agreed with the action.

SUBJECT: Homosexual Relations with David Aiken

In 1970, at the age of 12, I left home. I was placed in Alpha House in Dade County as a ward of the state. At Alpha House I met Tony Chandler through one of the children residing in Alpha House. Tony Chandler was a big brother type to several kids at Alpha House. Tony Chandler tried to form a big brother type relationship with me. It failed. The reason for it failing was that Tony Chandler had a police record and the Alpha House psychologist was highly suspicious of him and denied me the opportunity of having any association with him.

In 1972, at the age of 14, Tony Chandler introduced me to Mr. David Aiken. I became a friend or little brother type to Mr. Aiken who served as an unofficial counselor type big brother to me. During 1972 and 1973 I maintained, at Mr. Aiken's urging, a sexual relationship with him. It is my belief that Mr. Aiken used sex for his own personal gratification and I used sex as a tool to be away on the weekend from Alpha House.

At the age of 15, I moved to Washington to live with a guardian. From 1973-1975 I lived in Washington, graduated from high school and had a productive three years.

In 1975, at the age of 17, I graduated from high school at Washington State and moved back to Miami. Upon my arrival in Miami, I lived with Mr. David Aiken at his grandmother's home for eight months. During this period, Mr. Aiken and I had an active homosexual relationship. Mr. Aiken convinced me to have this relationship under duress because I was only 17 and said if I did not maintain it he would turn me in as a runaway because I was under the age of 18. I believed Mr. Aiken and engaged in the sexual activities.

During this period of time Mr. Aiken took me to West Summerland Key (Camp Sawyer) for the weekend. At Camp Sawyer we maintained active sexual relationships.

At the age of 18 I terminated my relationship with Mr. Aiken in 1976. I had approximately three contacts since 1976 with Mr. Aiken. All three were of the social nature, with no sexual activities involved whatsoever.

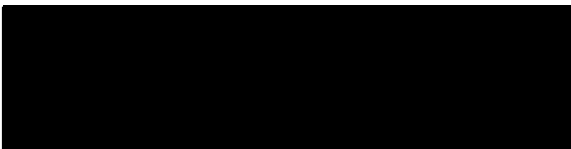
In 1983 I went to a psychologist for evaluation and subsequent treatment. After my therapy with the psychologist I became completely heterosexual (straight).

A couple of other incidents that I feel are important to my statement are as follows.

I, as well as Tony Chandler, asked Mr. Aiken on several occasions if he had ever had any sexual activities with any Scouts in his troop. Mr. Aiken never admitted he did, but he inferred that homosexual activities did exist between he and Boy Scouts. He was always evasive about answering a specific question with a direct answer.

The second item of importance: In 1980 or 1981 a friend of mine who was a Steward for Pan American Airways who knew David Aiken by association from the job (a mutual friend of ours), observed Mr. Aiken and a Boy Scout returning from a trip to Las Vegas. During the flight on the airline the Steward had the opportunity of discussing the trip and the Boy Scout with Mr. Aiken. Prior to this discussion the Steward observed Mr. Aiken and the Boy Scout involved in horseplay and other unnatural gestures and activities. After the conversation between Mr. Aiken and the Steward, the conversation became very cool and Mr. Aiken became very nervous. The Steward said to me that they were two of a kind or something fact simile.

I submit this information to Mr. John H. Malone, Director of Field Service, for his corporate use on behalf of South Florida Council, Boy Scouts of America. I hereby swear that this information is truthful and without malice.



Violations of any of the above, or future similar situations, will result in:



Furthermore, it is my recommendation that the following course be taken to notify Mr. Aiken:

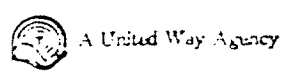

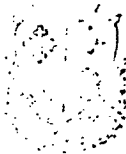

Each scout is instructed how to find the pulse, pressure point with his own fingers. When he finds the pulse under the skin he is to release the pressure point and the task is complete. Each scout completing First Aid would have made an A+ on his final knowledge of all course of First Aid. Because First Aid deals with working on other people, I tried to give the highest quality of training. It is better not to touch an injured person at all, than to give the wrong type of First Aid that may make the injured person worse. I feel proud about what the highest level of training for these men. I can also see that parents not trained in First Aid who having been through the course could question the need of finding the pressure point for the leg. Because of this, I have changed the course requirements to solve this area in question.
