An ex-Boy Scout leader whe - leaded no contest Wednesday to clish gas he sexually abused troop members - uld face up to seven years in state prise.

David Charles Liter, 34, of Treahna Road in Pensacola, was charged with repeatedly abusing a 16-year-old in 1987, a 13-year-old in 1987 and 1988, and a 10-year-old between 1977 and 1979.

Escambia Circuit Judge John Parnham will sentence Liter op July 5. Prosecutor Tom Berrigan will recommend a 7-year term, the maximum under state guidelines, but defense attorney Ron Davis will argue for a less severe sentence.

Between 1987 and his arrest last February, Liter led a troop that met at St. Anne's Roman Catholic Church, Before

that, he participated in Boy Scouting and Little Flower Catholic Church.

Liter, a house painter not regularly employed, gained troop members' confidence, then abused them, Escambia County Sheriff's Department Investigator Larry Lattimer said. Some incidents on curred on Box Scout camp trips aut others at the suspect's home, the officer said.

When Liter was arrested, parents of Boy Scouts described him as a tircless, dech eated leader and said they were shocked at the allegations against him.

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Court records contain letters to the prosecutor or defense attorney from nine people, most of whom urged that Liter receive; house arrest or psychiatric treatment rather than a prison sentence. Liter has, been held in the Escambia County Jail

Re: your letter of January 10, 1989 asking for the name of the Scoutmaster mentioned in my letter to Robert Williams, dated January 5, 1988 (supposed to be 1989--my error).

I fully intend to give you a name plus names of other witnesses that I can only hope will support my allegations. However, you did not answer the question I posed to Mr. Williams and that is, please explain his statement: "We're going to get immediately and swift removal, within 24 hours." I need to know what steps you will take and what my sons and I must be prepared for. Of equal consideration is this man's family. He has a wife and a child now, I am told, and His mother's health is poor.

Also, before I give you his name, I want consideration given to the fact that he approached the Catholic priest I mentioned before my sons came to me. He also offered to confess his crimes before his committee members but was discouraged from doing so by both myself and the priest and I'm afraid we have done him and others a great disservice because of our ignorance. He, as well as the boys he harmed should have received counseling.

I'm sure you will do what is right. I only want to know what will be done so my sons and I can be prepared.

According to Transcript #319 of the GERALEO show, you were a spokesman for the Boy Scouts of America on December 6, 1988. On page 12 of that transcript, you are quoted as saying: "We have a program now that hopefully will tell parents across the nation what we're doing. We're talking about immediate reporting. This is not going to happen anymore. We're going to get it immediately and swift removal, within 24 hours."

I am a parent of two former Boy Scouts who were aware of their Scout Master's molestation of troop members several years ago. His troop sponsor was informed and he was thrown out of the troop. A Catholic priest came to this Scout Master's defense and advised secrecy. He also Edvised my sons to go to confession. This occurred in 1980 and we were not as well-informed as we are today.

The reason I am writing to you is because a few weeks ago my son told me he has often seen this same Scout Master leading groups of young boys around town. I contacted my brother who is a corrections counselor in Graterford, Pennsylvania. He conontacted two other psychologists who advised that something be done immediately because, unless this man gets counseling, there is a very good chance that he will harm another child or children, if he has not done so already (please read enclosed literature).

I would like to know what, if anything can be done about this situation and your advice would certainly be appreciated.

However, the church's pastor, the Rev. Raymond Mullins, said, "I'm not discussing the matter."

Parents of the troop members and they were stunned by the allegations against the tireless scoutmaster.

"David is an incredibly nice person," said Patricia Cotton, "He gave us his time, his efforts, money. That this dark side surfaced in our troop is just beyond compactension."

Lattimer said has investigation was just beginning although he has interviewed about 40 of the troop's 60 members and he plans to talk to all of them. The Scouts range in age from 8 to 18,

Liter gained the boys' confidence, then abused them, Lattimer said.

"It was never an Fil-breakyour-neek or forceful situation," he said.

The incidents have taken place tor at least the past 11 years, Lattimer said. Some of incidents occurred on Scout camping trips and others at the suspect's home, • said

Liter is a house painter but is not regularly employed, Lattimer said. He devotes most of his time

to Scouting and does odd.jobs. Bowman, of the Boy Scouts' council, said the allegations were the first he's heard against an area scoutmaster,

"We got a lot of good volun-teers," he said, "We get a bad apple and it burts them, It's like somebody spit on their badge or something.

"One day I'm sitting here working on an award of merit for a little boy from Navaure that jacked up a car and pulled his brother out, and the next day I'm dealing with this,"

Bowman said be depends on individual troop committees to though he eventually approves their applications, too. But, he said, when he signed off an application, he was basically saying the applicant had followed proper procedure in filling out forms.

Bowman said there are some 4,000 adults working in the coun-cil's area. He said the adults are asked on application forms if they've got a criminal history.

But, he said, "We're not an investigative unit. It's really a verbal screen."

Bowman soid all local applications are forwarded to the Boy Scouts' antional office. He said the national office matches the applications with a "confidential file" of Scout officials charged with criminal acts. That helps prevent known child abusers from being-hired as Scout leaders, hitsafid.

The Liter investigation began Jan. 23 as the result of favo anonymous telephone calls, one to the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services and the other to Crimestoppers, Lattimer said.

Rowman said he immediately suspended Liter, Sheriff's javestigators then identified two alleged victims.

Williedo Mirando, another scoutmaster who plans to take over Liter's duties, said the allegations surprised him.

"There are a lot of people who are upset about it," he said, "They trusted him so much,"

He said he noticed, however, that Liter seemed to like to spend a great deal of time with the boys after meetings, .

"But, as far as the boys, there was nothing I could see he was doing wrong," he said. Mirando said he objected to

media coverage, because such coverage would prevent the issue from going away.

"We would like to let it ride it

out so hopefully the boys will logget all about it," he said. Troop members' parents met Tuesday night with Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services child-protection workers and with Dr. John Duffy, a clinical psychologist invited by HRS.

The main thing I emphasized to the parents was that regardless of their feelings about the scoutmaster, it was important to listen to their kids and not be disbelieving," he said. "I told them to keep

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BRIEFLY More allegations arise against ex-scout leader

An investigation into allegations that a recently suspended Boy Scout leader sexually abused troop members broadened Monday, a sheriff's officer said.

David Charles Liter, 34, the former scoutmaster, is being held in the Escambia County Jail under \$150,000 bond. He is charged with three counts of rape, two charges of lewd and lascivious assault on a child and three counts of sexual activity with a child.

Liter is accused of assaulting two members of a troop that meets at St. Anne's Roman Catholic Church within the past two years. He also is accused of assaulting another scout in 1977. Escambia County Sheriff's

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Department Investigator Larry Lattimer said Monday that he has interviewed every St. Anne's troop member who has agreed to talk with him. He said he has received telephone calls from adults who say Liter assaulted them while they were scouts, and he plans to interview them more extensively. March 29, 1989

> APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the trust and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may if he or she does not agree with the decision request a review from the regional director.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council. The decision by the National Council is final.
