Fredricktown, Mo., man charged with abusing boys

FREDRICKTOWN, Mo. (UPI) — A 27-year-old former Cub Scout leader and part-time Little League baseball coach is charged with sexually abusing two boys, ages 6 and 8.

The suspect, David Pinson, is being held in the Madison County jail in lieu of \$100,000 bond. He was arraigned Monday on six counts of sodomy.

Pinson, who works at the Wal-Mart store in Fredricktown, was a Scout leader and part-time baseball coach until he was arrested.

Sheriff Gary Asher said Pinson was a deacon in the New Home Baptist Church in Saco and a volunteer firefighter for the Cherokee Pass

Volunteer Fire Department. The victims were two friends of Pinson's son, Asher said. Neither boy had been in Pinson's Scout troop or on his Little League team.

Asher said the acts of sodomy, which Pinson is charged occurred Aug. 30, Sept. 1 and Sept. 2.

"We think it had been going on for a month," the sheriff said.

Authorities said they learned of the incidents after the two boys, tried unsuccessfully to recruit a 4-year-old friend to "play" with them and Pinson. The younger boy told his parents, who alerted authorities.

I have enclosed a copy of the original Complaint charging Pinson with six counts. These charges were prepared and filed while I was at a Prosecutors' Seminar.

After reviewing the statements of the children involved, copies of which I have enclosed, I have prepared an Amended Complaint charging the Defendant with three counts -- one count of sexual abuse in the first degree and two counts of sodomy.

You will note the sexual abuse involved one child less than twelve years of age, and the sodomy charges involved another young boy who was less than fourteen years old.

The Defendant has given a video taped confession, which we have not had time to transcribe. As soon as the statement is typed, I will send you a copy of same.

Judge Elrod has appointed the Public Defender's Office to represent Mr. Pinson.

The State's position will be that the Defendant should be sent to the Missouri Department of Corrections for these crimes. This is the position I have taken on prior sexual offenses involving minors.

Tentatively, Judge Elrod has set Pinson's preliminary hearing for September 18th. Please advise whether you will be entering your appearance on behalf of the Defendant in this matter.



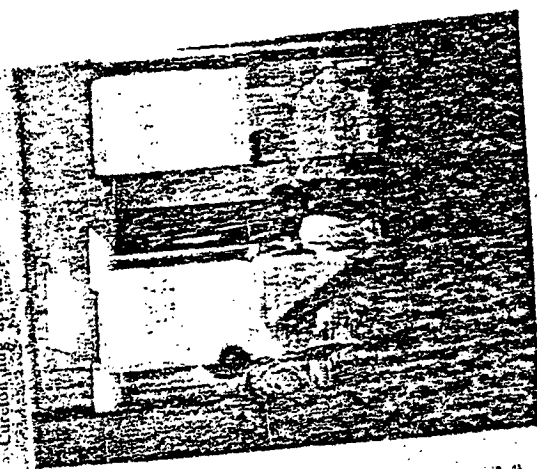

Pinson pled guilty to the charges and remained in the Madison County Jail from the time of his arrest through court appearance. Bond had been set at \$100,000. Pinson was represented by Farmington attorney Lindell Duniven. In his statement before sentencing, Duniven said he felt that incarceration would not benefit Pinson nor cure his problem but that the defendant could be helped through counseling.

Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Rob Fulton stated, however, that people "must know that if they do abuse children, they will go to prison."
