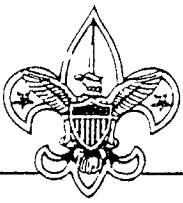

# Ex-Scout leader in Berlin sentenced in sex assault

NEW BRITAIN — To the dismay of one victim's family, a Superior Court judge Friday gave a former Berlin Boy Scout leader the minimum prison term in the sexual assault of two boys who were members of his troop.

Judge Wendy Susco sentenced David P. Maule Sr., 46, of 23 Wilcox Court, Berlin, to five years in prison, suspended after nine months, and probation for five years. The nine-month imprisonment is the minimum required by state law for those found guilty of second-degree sexual assault.

After the sentence, relatives of one of the boys appeared angry and distraught. A grandmother, in tears, complained about what she said was

an unjustly light sentence. An uncle began shouting at sheriffs and was led from the Superior Court building by a deputy.

Susco said she understood the relatives' feelings, but added that justice would not be served by giving Maule a lengthy prison term. Susco said Maule needs psychiatric treatment and that such treatment for first-time sex offenders is "virtually non-existent" in state prisons.

Maule's lawyer, Hubert Santos of Hartford, said Maule has been receiving treatment in the sex-offenders program at Meriden-Wallingford Hospital and will continue in the program after his release from the Connecticut Correctional Institution at Somers.

23 after two New Britain boys, who were 11 and 13 at the time, filed complaints against him, court records show. He pleaded guilty in Superior Court in New Britain in June to four counts of second-degree sexual assault and two counts of risk of injury to a minor.

The sexual assault charges stemmed from four separate incidents in April and May 1986. Arrest warrant affidavits state the sexual assaults in April took place with each boy on a secluded road in Berlin, while the two incidents in May took place during a Boy Scout outing at Cockaponset State Forest in Haddam.

Maule, originally was charged with 18 counts of sexual assault, attempted sexual assault and risk of injury to a minor. In a plea bargain, the charges were reduced to four counts of second-degree sexual assault and two counts of risk of injury to a minor.

Susco ruled that Maule must continue in the program for sex offenders for the length of his probation. Also, Maule must not have any unsupervised contact with boys during the five-year probation and must, with their parents' permission, send letters of apology to the two victims. The final condition of Maule's probation is that he must contribute \$100 to the state Criminal Injuries Compensation Board.

Susco said that a factor in the light prison sentence was that, in pleading guilty, Maule had not put the boys or their families through the ordeal of a trial.

Assistant State's Attorney Peter Soulsby likened Maule to a thief because he had robbed the boys of their innocence, but agreed with Susco that Maule needed counseling more than a long jail term.

But, as did Susco, Soulsby said he strongly sympathized with the boys' parents.

"I can understand the frustration," Soulsby said.

# Berlin Scout Leader Accused In Sex Assaults Steps Down

BERLIN — A local Boy Scout leader charged with sexually assaulting two members of his troop has stepped down from his post, court records show.

David P. Maule Sr., 45, of 23 Wilcox Court, pleaded not guilty in Superior Court in New Britain June 6 to 18 charges of sexual assault, attempted sexual assault and risk of injury to a minor, court records show.

Maule, who was released on \$2,000 cash bond after his arraignment, agreed to step down as scoutmaster of Troop 13 in return for lower bail, said Judge Jonathan Kaplan, who presided over Maule's arraignment. As a condition of his release, Maule also promised to avoid association with any youth organizations, court records show.

Monday, Maule denied resigning as troop leader. He refused further comment, referring questions to his attorney, Hubert J. Santos of Hartford. Santos did not return repeated telephone calls from The Courant Monday and Tuesday.

Peter Schoech has taken over as scoutmaster of Troop 13. He said Tuesday he was shocked at the alle-

gations against Maule.

"I've known him since he was a kid. We grew up together. None of us can believe any of this," Schoech said.

Arrest warrant affidavits state the charges stem from complaints filed by two New Britain boys.

The boys, aged 13 and 11, spoke separately to police in mid-May after seeing a program on sexual abuse, the affidavits state.

The affidavits say each boy told police a similar story. Each boy said Maule picked him up on several Tuesday nights and drove him to a deserted road in Berlin, where most of the incidents took place. The incidents took place during a two-month period before the complaints, the affidavits state.

They also say Maule frequently asked permission to take the boys out Tuesday nights for ice cream or to work on Boy Scout merit badges.

A complaint filed by the 13-year-old boy resulted in Berlin police's charging Maule with one count of second-degree sexual assault, five counts of fourth-degree sexual assault, one count of attempted sexual assault and seven of risk of injury to a minor, court records state.

The same teenager reported two other incidents he said occurred at a home in New Britain. As a result of those complaints, New Britain police charged Maule with one count of

fourth-degree sexual assault and one count of risk of injury to a minor, court records state.

The 11-year-old boy reported two incidents that led to charges by Berlin police of second-degree sexual assault and risk of injury to a minor.

Second-degree sexual assault is defined by state statutes as sexual intercourse with a minor and is a felony. Conviction carries a mandatory nine-month jail sentence.

Fourth-degree sexual assault is defined as intentionally subjecting a minor to sexual contact. It is a misdemeanor and carries a sentence not to exceed one year in jail or a \$500 fine, or both.

Risk of injury is a misdemeanor and is punishable by a maximum of 10 years in prison or a \$500 fine.

Maule was arrested May 23 by both Berlin and New Britain police. Berlin police filed additional charges May 31. Maule had pleaded not guilty to all charges.

A pre-trial hearing before Kaplan has been set for July 8 in Superior Court in New Britain.

A spokesman for Boy Scouts of America, Richard P. Behrens, said Tuesday there is a possibility Maule could be reinstated if acquitted of the charges against him.

"It's hard to say at this point," Behrens said.

### Man faces June 6 court date

BERLIN — An East Berlin man faces a June 6 court appearance after being arrested by Berlin and New Britain police on Monday for a sexual assault charge.

David Maule, 45, of East Berlin, was arrested by Berlin police on charges of a second-degree sexual assault and of injury to a minor, according to a police report.

After posting a \$25,000 bond, Maule was arrested by New Britain police and charged again with second-degree sexual assault and injury to a minor in that city, a New Britain police spokesman said. Berlin police said the arrests stem from separate incidents.

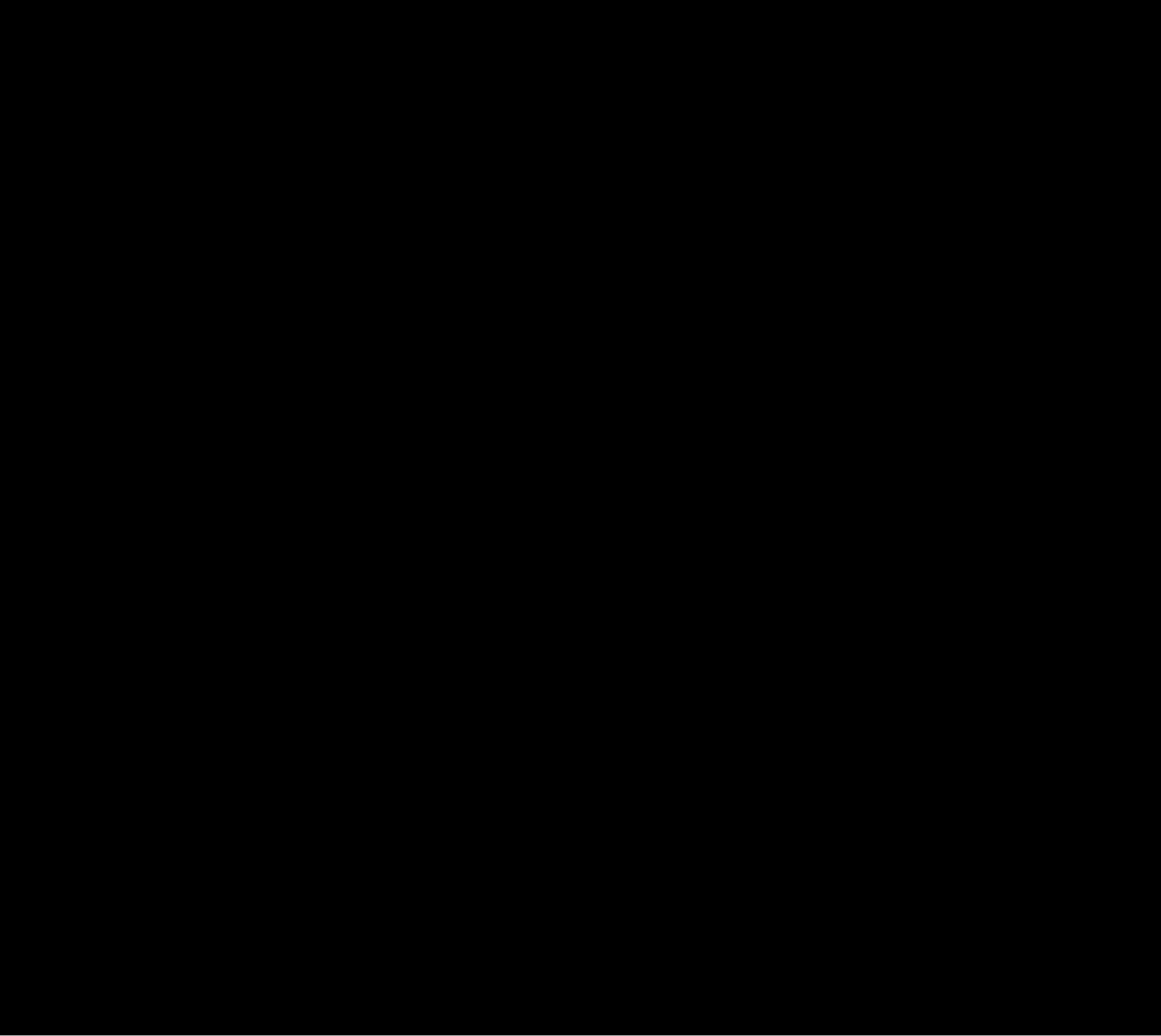
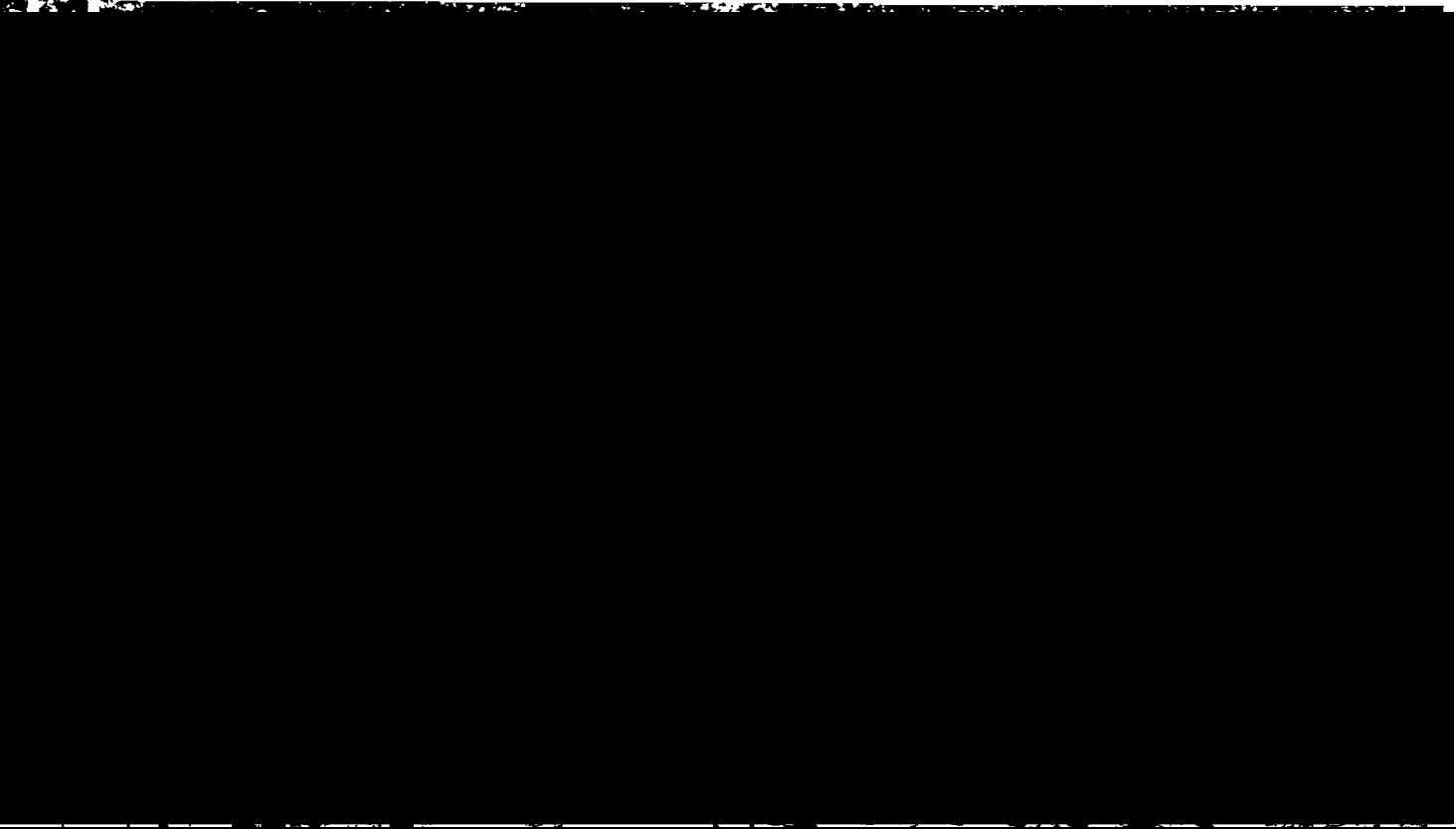
