


APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUEST FROM REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not be denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the President of the local Council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may, if he or she does not agree with the decision, request review from the Regional Director.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council. Decision by the National Council is final.

At a Scout Committee meeting of Troop 59 held on August 23, 1984, at 8:00PM, the following people were present: Rev. Paul R Tobin, pastor; Deacon Ron Sherwood, Institutional representative; Mr Frank Dixon,

In response to the recent report about Scoutmaster David Van Swearingen, the Committee felt obliged to make some observations concerning the circumstances and to offer recommendations regarding future procedures. Exact dates and details are omitted: the general guidelines, however, are spelled out.

Observations:

- 1. There was poor judgment in that the Scoutmaster left camp with the scout when the parent rightfully expected the scout to remain in camp.
- 2. There was a failure to notify the parent about the change in location or to bring the scout home.
- 3. There was a presumption on the part of the Scoutmaster to act withcut the parent's permission.
- 4. There was negligence on the part of the Scoutmaster in allowing himself to be in circumstances that could be construed as compromising or damaging.
- 5. There was the unfortunate result of the scout being listed on a police report.
- 6. There was a bad judgment on the part of the Scoutmaster in involving the scout's grandparents causing them to become upset.
- 7. There was an excessive amount of time spent with scouts both in scouting and other activities.

Recommendations:

- 1. That in response to the above observations some appropriate action be taken by the Scouting Committee.
- 2. That there be imposed on the Scoutmastera period of probation for six months, beginning September 1, 1984. During this period the regular activities should be carried on by the Scoutmaster, but during this time dealing with parents should be carefully monitored.

- 3. That efforts be made to procure an assistant Scoutmaster and other adult advisors.
- 4. That a letter of apology be sent to the Committee at Regina Coeli by the Scoutmaster.

In light of the support of the parents of the scouts and the confidence of the Committee and the loyalty of the Scout Troop it is felt that the removal of the Scoutmaster would be an extreme and undesirable response.

It is the sincere hope of the Scouting Committee at Regina Coeli Church that Troop 59 be enabled to continue to function basically in tact and that the Scoutmaster be retained for the foreseeable future.
