

Thanks for much for the complete report concerning Mr. Bennett. We are setting up a file, so he cannot again register with the Boy Scouts of America.

We have checked with the council which serves San Cruz, California, and find that Mr. Bennett was registered with them as a Scoutmaster in 1981 and 1982 in Troop S0650. He was listed as an Assistant Scoutmaster in 1983. They have no word on him, since that time.

The Scout Executive, Dean Crafton, also checked with the District Attorney and found that there was a misdemeanor conviction which he plea bargained. The District Attorney also indicate that under no conditions should he be registered at the present time.

We also called Brian Allen who is the Scout Executive in Santa Clara. He carefully reviewed all of his old employment records, but could not find an individual by this name who was ever employed by the council. I also checked with the Personnel Division in the national office and they also could find no evidence of employment by the Boy Scouts of America.

I have no indication in this office of whether Mr. Bennett was registered in 1987 and 1988. We only keep the last three years of registration records in the national office on microfilm, and to find anyone without a specific location is very difficult.

Thanks again for all of your help. I hope you will send me anything else which you receive. Do not hesitate to contact me, if you have any further questions.

I am attorney who has been retained by the family.

residing in Seoul, Korea. While living in Korea, oldest son, came in contact with a Mr. David William Bennett. We are aware that a company called Summit Memory Systems had sent Mr. Bennett to Seoul to be seconded to Goldstar Telecommunications. While in Korea on this assignment, Mr. Bennett became the scoutmaster for Boy Scout troop which commonly met on the U.S. Military facilities in downtown Seoul (i.e., the Yongsan Army Base).

As your organization should be aware, Mr. Bennett was convicted of sexual abuse of a minor in 1987. As a result of this conviction, he was sentenced to three years' probation. While in Korea, Mr. Bennett broke the terms of his probation by ceasing his treatment and severing contact with his probation officer. More tragically, he sexually molested who is only twelve years of age. This molestation of the late the hands of his scoutmaster David Bennett occurred over a period of several months at the outset of 1991. In that his behavior constitutes a serious crime under Korean law, Mr. Bennett was questioned by the Korean police and he fully confessed to sexually molesting the Korean police and he fully confessed to sexually molesting the Korean police and Bennett.

Obviously this matter has brought severe emotional and financial damage to and the entire family. I have been instructed by my clients to seek full legal redress for their injuries and I am in the process of preparing a civil complaint on their behalf against inter alia the Boy Scouts. Your organization's liability arises from its negligence in this matter. We demand to know what steps the Boy Scouts take generally (and took in this case specifically) to ensure that the people who supervise and come in contact with scouts are not going to engage in sexual abuse of the boys.



I've been on a fast track of late and am not positive if I sent you a copy of the David Bennett letter of denial of registration or not.

This one is very sticky and sounds as though one parent is talking about a possible suit.

The CID does not share a great deal of information, but the situation is briefly as follows: five boys from four families have been involved . . violations of Republic of Korea Criminal Code 305 (Indecent Acts with a Minor).

In spite of the fact that all involved in this case are civilians, the Army is going "all out". The attached "point papers" are the result of church (LDS)/parent meetings with military officials of Yongsan, . . 8th Army. Full counseling services are available thru the Army. CID is doing "follow-up" work with some families that have returned to the states and were thought to have close ties with Bennett.

Things came out in the CID investigation:

- Bennett had been arrested in 1982 for child molestation. Case dropped.
- He was accused and convicted in 1987 of child molestation in Santa Cruz, CA in a case that was not Scouting related.

According to California Law Enforcement authorities, he "absconded" in 1988 . . later showing up in Korea.

I flew to Korea to attend a meeting of the church/parents/military, held on 12 Sep 91. During the time I was there, I visited with: Family Advocacy Program Manager, Agents Butman and Downing, of CID, and the President of the Church, Col Dunn. This was done prior to the meeting to be "up to speed" as much as possible. Three of the four families involved were present at the meeting. As you can see from the "point paper" from that evening, their concerns were with the screening process used by the BSA. They had a particular desire to know if the National Crime Information Center was used.

Jerry Sakamoto, SDE in Korea, is keeping me up to date as things develop. Bennett has disappeared, but Jerry talked to the Korean National Police (KNP) on Friday, 20 Sep 91, and they think he is still in Korea. The word on the street is that he has left the country.



Attachment to Letter

The following information is provided should you desire a review by the Western Region, BSA, of the decision to deny your registration.

- 1. Within 60 day, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to: Western Region, BSA, P.O. Box 3464, Sunnyvale, CA 94688-3464. In your request you must include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon the receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
- 3. If the regional review committee determines that a review hearing is necessary the committee will advise you whether or not you may attend. In some instances, no useful purpose should be served by having the applicant present. The hearing is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee for you, if you attend, will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, in the event you attend, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
- 5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 6. If you are dissatisfied with the decision of a regional review, you may request a further review by the national Council. The decision of the National Council will be final.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: REGISTRATION REVOCATION NOTICE TO DAVID W. BENNETT

DATE: TUESDAY, 20 AUGUST 1991

- 1. At approximately 1535 hours, Robert E. Harding (Korea District Vice-Chairman and Far East Council Executive Board member) and Jerry J. Sakamoto (Senior District Executive) served a letter terminating David W. Bennett's membership with the Boy Scouts of America to David W. Bennett.
- 2. The location was the Yongsan, Korea Police Station, Foreign Affairs office.
- 3. Also given to David W. Bennett was a letter from Jerry J. Sakamoto requesting the turn-in of all camp records and monies. Mr. Bennett's response to this letter was that he needed a couple of days to get things together.
- 4. Mr. Bennett's response to the membership termination letter signed by Council Scout Executive Roger Wall was "When these charges prove false, then what?"

Mr. Harding replied that this matter needed to go through the system.

The above statement is true to the best of my knowledge.

POINT PAPER Child Sexual Abuse

<u>PURPOSE</u>: Updated information resulting from 12 September parent meeting.

FACTS:

- CIDC reported the following information:
- -- KNP reviewed translated criminal record for the 1987 case of child molestation in which Mr. Bennett was found guilty and given 3 years probation.
- -- Mr. Bennett served 1 year of his 3 year probation in California. In 1988 California Probation Dept allowed Mr. Bennett to leave for Korea on three conditions:
 - 1. Continue counseling
- 2. No further contact with children without another adult present.
 - 3. Continue contact with California Probation Dept
- Mr. Bennett failed to comply with all three terms of probation.
- -- CIDC is checking with California Probation Dept to determine status of probation and interest in the case.
- -- Mr. Bennett did not keep a 10 Sep appointment with KNP for further questioning. To date, KNP cannot locate Mr. Bennett.
- -- The U.S. Embassy has been informed of Mr. Bennett's disappearance in case he should try to procure a new passport.
- A parent added that Mr. Bennett once lived in Canada and may have a second (Canadian) passport.
- BSA Executive Council Representative from Japan attended the meeting. He presented information regarding BSA volunteer screening procedures. Most of the parental questions were directed toward BSA screening procedures.

- BSA and parents reported that between \$1,500 and \$2,000 appears to be missing from BSA funds managed by Mr. Bennett.
- PAO reported that generally, the Korean press uses restraint when reporting stories involving children under 19 years, but that exceptions occur.
- A parent reported a conversation with KNP that leads him to believe KNP may use the press to look for Mr. Bennett.
- Three families are continuing to receive anonymous phone calls.
 - Appreciation was expressed for EUSA's efforts in this case.


CONCLUSIONS:

POINT PAPER Child Sexual Abuse

<u>PURPOSE:</u> Updated information re: KNP investigation of allegations of child sexual abuse by BSA Scout Master.

FACTS:

- CIDC received a hard copy of Mr. Bennett's criminal record from the state of California.
- Records indicated two prior arrests for child molestation. One in 1982, in which charges were dropped; and one in 1987, in which Mr. Bennett was found guilty.
- A translation of portions of the criminal record into Hangul is in progress, and will be made available to KNP by 4 September; KNP authorities appear to be near charging and indictment.
- On 29 August, and his son appeared at the KNP office for a scheduled interview with Mr. Bennett and their respective attorneys.
- -- Mr. Bennett reportedly responded in part to the merits of the allegations by the boy.
- -- Mr. Bennett's attorney approached the attorney regarding an out of court settlement.
- An article reporting allegations against a BSA Scout Master appeared in the 1 Sep 91 edition of the Stars & Stripes (Encl).
- 23 children have been interviewed, 8 leads for interviews of families in CONUS, and 2 children located in Taejon, pending interviews.

CONCLUSION:

- The state of California may still have jurisdiction due to the terms of the 1987 sentence. CIDC is contacting the Parole/Probation Department of California to make that - determination.
