Dear Tom:

Confirming our conversation, Monday May 2, I am representing Don Schauer in relation to the recent controversy regarding the Sea Scouts.

While Mr. Schauer is certainly not in agreement with each of the findings and recommendations of the Council Committee, he is very much interested in attempting to resolve this matter and get it behind him.

There are two issues that stand in the way in that regard.

The report states in the first full paragraph at the top of page 2, that a parent of a Scout complained to the San Rafael Police Department regarding certain allegations made regarding sexual conduct. Mr. Schauer would like to the record made clear that the complaint was not regarding any alleged sexual conduct on the part of Mr. Schauer, but instead regarding statements allegedly made by Mr. Schauer about another person's conduct.

Secondly, Mr. Schauer, would, as a practical matter, like to resign. However, he does not want his resignation to be one that is conditional in any way, other than it being understood he is resigning as an active representative at the time of his resignation. He recognizes that the appointment of a person as a registered representative of the Boy Scouts is at all times discretionary with the organization.

In short, Mr. Schauer requests that the record regarding the factual findings of the committee be clarified and that he is willing to submit his resignation as a "common sense" way to resolve this matter. However, he is

### ISSUES

The questions before the Committee are as follows:

- 1) Was there evidence which would necessitate the suspension of Mr. Shauer's membership?
- 2) Were the actions of Mr. Tom Powell, Scout Executive. Sonoma Mendocino Area Council in accordance with the procedures of the Boy Scouts of America and were these procedures followed in an appropriate manner?
- 3) In light of the mandate to the Committee Members that their judgement be based on a "common sense" approach is there another alternative available which will retain the highest possible standards of membership?

## STATEMENTS PRESENTED

Don Shauer's position regarding the suspension of his membership and the allegations which necessitated the procedures employed by Mr. Tom Powell, Scout Executive:

It is clear from Mr. Shauer's letter of February 12, 1988 requesting the review of his suspension that he desired a forum in which to present what he believes to be mitigating circumstances and evidence to the allegations. Mr. Shauer further felt that the procedure denied him the opportunity to defend himself and was in essence unjust.

At the meeting Mr. Shauer admitted to the use of alcohol during the Thanksgiving 1987 weekend cruise. He further referred to physical hazing tradition of Ship 1 called the "Coast Guard Inspection". This activity, which included head locks, tickling, hitting and pinching various body parts, has a twenty year history with this ship. Apparently the adult

leadership including Mr. Shauer were participants in this hazing.

Mr. Shauer in reference to conversation between himself and an officer of the San Rafael Police Department (name unknown) regarding a complaint filed by one of the youth or his parents denied the allegation of implying that they had engaged in oral copulation. He strongly denies that he made any suggestion of this type of activity. He further states that he denied to the police officer that the physical hazing including the officer's description of pinching the nipple was in any manner intended to be abusive or cause injury.

Mr. Shauer in his defense stated the Junior Officers (adult leaders) of his ship failed to assist him in carrying out the adult leadership required of a Sea Scout Ship. He, in fact, asserts that they undermined his leadership and in effect mutinied against him. This was apparently the result of a desire on the part of one or several of these individuals to assume the role of skipper.

Several parents of youth members of this unit appeared to offer their support for Mr. Shauer. A Mr. Berry, a committee member at the time of the incidents, expressed concern that the only persons invited to the meeting with the "concerned parents", Scout Executive and Council Commissioner were of a select group of opponents to Mr. Shauer's leadership.

Mr. Ron Harris, the chairman of the committee for Ship 1, offered his support that Mr. Shauer was indeed having problems with several of his Junior Officers and that there was apparently a power struggle in process.

The majority of other persons attending this review were Commodores and Skippers from other Councils and Ships in the San Francisco Bay Area. The thrust of their statements had to do with their willingness to attest to Mr. Shauer's character. They were also expressing a dissatisfaction with the procedure whereby an adult leader's membership is suspended because of allegations.

Mr. Shauer's presented a letter of resignation to the review committee requesting that his resignation from the Boy Scouts of America be accepted in lieu of a suspension of his membership. I refused this letter of resignation at this point stating that I felt it would be inappropriate for the review committee to accept his resignation in light of the fact that our assignment was to review the propriety of his membership suspension.

## COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Issue 1: There is adequate evidence which would support the suspension of Mr. Shauer's membership in the Boy Scouts of America. The admitted use of alcohol on an outing with youth is ample reason. In light of todays concern about child abuse, to allow the physical hazing (Coast Guard Inspections) by other youth is unacceptable. For adults to participate in this form of hazing is negligent.

- Issue 2. The actions of Mr. Tom Fowell. Scout Executive, were within strict accordance with the procedures of the Boy Scouts of America. As explained to those in attendance because of our responsibility for the development and well being of the youth members any adult leader's membership will be suspended upon allegation.
- Issue 3. The "common sense approach" by this Committee is to recommend that Mr. Shauer's membership be terminated by withdrawing the suspension and accepting in lieu thereof his resignation from the Boy Scouts of America with the understanding that he is not to apply or receive membership in any adult capacity in the future. It is the opinion of this Committee that this action will allow Mr. Shauer to save face with his peers (the other adult Sea Scouts) and will also accomplish the desire of the Boy Scouts of America to remove him from Scout Leadership.



A meeting of parents, officers and members of Ship One (Compass Rose) concerning conduct of Skipper Don Schauers. Lee McCann. Council Commissioner, and Tom Powell, Scout Executive, were invited to hear comments. List of participants attached.

Upon gathering, Tom Powell explained the desire of the Boy Scouts of America to insure each unit has leadership that meets the standards of the BSA. While council representation was present to hear and record what comments were to be made, it was important to stick to facts and be as precise in dealing with the matter as possible.

As the discussion developed, the following were points of concern by the participants concerning Mr. Schauer:

#One - Charges that Mr. Schauer drinks alcohol on cruises and has been intoxicated.

#Two - Mr. Schauer has had improper physical contact with crew including touching vital parts.

#Three - Mr. Schauer had verbally threatened and degraded crew members.

#Four - Mr. Schauer has broken the law by bringing a gas powered generator aboard ship and using it while under way.

#Five - Mr. Schauer has misappropriated ship property to personal residence.

Two quotes are:

"Usually on every cruise there is one night or two nights that he is intoxicated." Exec. Officer.

"Youth do not want to be around the man."

The general concern was that Mr. Schauer was not providing safe, reliable and adequate leadership which motivates the youth, but in fact was a negative influence on members.

Letters and written comments were presented to Mr. Powell and are included in this report.


The meeting concluded by Mr. McCann and Mr. Powell thanking participants for their concern and assuring participants that proper procedures would be followed to insure correct leader-ship of Ship One.

Participants were advised not to discuss the matter further as it should remain confidential to only those involved in corrective proceedures.

I attended a meeting at the home of the haut at A list of attendees is attached.

The purpose of the meeting was discuss the conduct of the leadership of Sea Explorer Ship #1, primarily the skipper Don Shauer.

Tom Powell, Scout Executive was given writen statements by members, officers and parents of Ship #1. The sum and substance of the verbal declarations were, #1 Mr. Shauer has routinly conducted a "Coast Gaurd Test" discribed as hard physical pinching an punching of members of the crew over the entire body, including the private area. It was stated that this would continue for up to ½ hour. #2 Foul and abusive language berating officers and members of the crew, when ever they would question an order or direction that was given by Mr. Shauer. Frequently Mr. Shauer would state. "I am skipper and my word is law" or "On this ship I am God" #3 On many cruises or work parties, Mr. Shauer would be under the influence of alchohol, many times to the extent that he was not stable on his feet. It was stated that he routinely had beer and hard achohol on board the ship, while under way with youth members. #4 Statements were made that officers and parents had asked questions about the finances and ships property and equipment, and were given evasive answers.

I explained the relationship and responsibilities between the BSA, the community and the sponsor. This includes the option of revoking membership to adults that do not meet the standards of the BSA. Tom Powell also participated in the duscussion, pointing out current proceedures for suspending membership.

I recommended that the proceedure be completed as soon as possible. I asked if the parents present were registered members of the committee and the answer was affirmative. I asked if there was leadership willing and qualified to take over the operation of the unit to insure that the members continued receiving a parogram, the answer was again affirmative.

It was unanimousely agreed that the members of the unit have displayed the highest degree of character and leadership, for having stuck with the ship, in some cases for more than  $2\frac{1}{2}$  years, under these conditions.

I met with Committee Chairman of Ship One, Ron Harris, to review with him the discussion last evening (12/17/87) of parents, adults and youth concerned with the leadership of Don Schauer.

I explained to Ron the allegations concernign alcohol use while on cruises, the improper physical contacts and the verbal threats towards crew members. I explained the procedures of the Boy Scouts of America in such situations, indicating the need for immediate suspension of Don Schauer from the program. I also told Ron of the opportunity Don will have to have the decision reviewed by the council. Ron, while not personally being able to verify from personal experience, all the allegations, did say that he had seen Don have a couple of beers while on work parties. Ron also concurred that the action being taken by the council was what must be done as prescribed by the BSA and to protect all involved, including Don Schauer.

Upon gathering, a letter of suspension was read aloud by Tom Powell to Don Schauer. A check of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) was given to Don to return his 1987 registration and to pay back registration submitted for 1988.

The procedure for requesting a review of the decision denying registration was also reviewed and given to Don.

Copies of the letter and procedures are enclosed. Don Schauer asked on what grounds the suspension was evoked. A general reply tha suspension becomes necessary in cases that may involve breaking the policies of the Boy Scouts of America including use of alcoholic substances, child abuse both physical, mental or sexual or the breaking of various laws of the land. Don Schauer said he in fact had used alcohol and other substances while aboard the boat. Other substances were not identified.

It was explained that the suspension was meant to protect all involved until the matter could be properly cleared. The opportunity for a review was again discussed.

Mr. Schauer was advised that he needs to turn over all equipment or records in his possession to Ron Harris. Committee Chairman.

Ron asked if the suspension meant total exclusion from Scouting. The answer was yes.

Mr. Schauer expressed his decision to leave Scouting forever, not to have a thing to do with it in the future.

Mr. Schauer also expressed a hope that the Ship and program could continue, but warned of depending upon inadequate leadership.

The letter of suspension, check and procedures were in Don's hand when the meeting adjourned.

# APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee . in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may—if he or she does not agree with the decision—request a review from the regional director by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the local council decision.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review of the National Council by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the regional decision. The decision by the National Council is final.

Sunday night, 29 November, I was surprised to see one of my two foster boys, walk in the door when I had expected to drive to the dock and call for him at the termination of the cruise.

A man, later identified to me as \_\_\_\_\_ and his son, entered the house behind \_\_\_\_. They had brought home.

explained to me that John Faith, a crew member, had come to him when he picked up and that evening and related the following:

- (1) That Shauers had been drinking Saturday night and,
- (2) That Shauers had used inappropriate language with the boys,
- (3) That Shauers had hit the boys on the Saturday night in question.

him to join Sea Scouts. Was not far behind in his request to join.)

On the way to my place, and and filled in with the rest of the details.

After discussing the matter with three police officers with whom I work, a county social service worker, and an investigator from the Marin County Sheriff's Office( in which jurisdiction the incident occurred), I asked the Marin Sheriff's Office to make a report.

Two night later, a deputy from Sonoma County Sheriff's Office, acting in behalf of the Marin S.O., came to the house and the above details, both from and were given to him, in person. It and the deputy. He asked me if I wished to have the report on file for "information only" or did I want it to go to the Marin District Attorney. I advised him I wished the district attorney to be involved as I felt that the act, as did some of my compatriots, fell within the purview of Penal Code Sec. 647A, child annoyance, as both and and had asked Shauers to stop, and he still persisted.

The Sonoma County Deputy, Bob Sotello, who took the "courtesy" report for the Marin Sheriff, felt it was more nearly

within the wording of Sections 240-242, Assault and Battery. He so filed the report.

Soth and I felt we were well within our rights in filing the complaint. I feel that any one of the three acts is sufficient grounds, for calling Mr. Shauers to task, as he is supposed to be a role model for these young people whom he is directing in Sea Scouting, which I consider, generally speaking, to be a fine program for young men.

I have had a prior head-to-head discussion on the telephone with Mr. Shauers regarding his turning the youngsters loose, on work party days, before parents were supposed to call for them and then leaving them to their own devices for some 1-2 hours. I told him that in my experience with school children, we remained with the youngsters until the last parent had picked up the last child, regardless of the hour. His comment was: "I'm not a baby sitter!" I agreed but since he has made the commitment to take charge of these minors and lead them, then I would suggest that he fulfill the task. He has, on occasion, left them in charge of another minor, soon to be an adult, and who had command responsibilities of the crew. I wonder as to the wisdom and legality of just such an act.

I had received other reports of Shauers' drinking aboard the boat while on previous cruises. Prior to the 28 November incident, I had not, nor had I found the opportunity to discuss with Mr. Shauers, the reports of his drinking aboard during a cruise. Nor have I discussed the above incident with him.

It is Saturday, Nov. 28, 1987.

We had just docked at the Yacht Basin in San Rafael. I went down to help Shauers in the galley. While we were down came down to the galley. Mr. Shauers asked him to go to the store to get him some stuffing and beer. After we ate, we had to take showers. After the showers, we got liberty. The time was 7:00 p.m. We came back about 9:30 p.m. We got in our bunks. Mr. Shauers came down and started harassing us. He gave me three dead legs, twisted my hand, gave me several "titty-twisters" and called me a "cocksucker." And said I gave a "blow job." He then went to watch wrestling. And I said a good name for him would be "Don 'The Animal' Shauers and he spit beer in my face. Every time I saw him he had a beer in his hand. He acted like he was drunk. was with and me when Shauers was harassing us. was with me when he spit the been in my face.

The above statement is, to the best of my recall, a true representation of the incident.

I read the above statement to and he asked that I add the additional details, the differences you find between his copy that he printed on the word processor without any prompting and my "translation" of that document.
