

1. Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to the Regional Director,

In your request, you may include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that your registration should not have been denied.

2. Upon the receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
3. You may attend the review hearing, but it is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
6. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of this decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

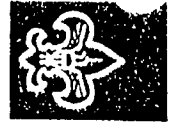

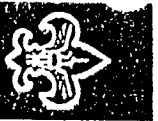

Dear Mr. Humphrey,

With regret, I feel obligated to make you aware of unpleasant and distressing incident that took place between my fifteen year old son, [REDACTED], and an adult leader, Donald Bodor. This incident took place on Thursday evening, August 17, 1989, at the Provisional Camp site, in Camp Kunatah located in The Ten Mile River Scout Reservation in Narrowsburg N.Y. I am bringing this incident to your attention since my son is a member Troop 157 in East Meadow N.Y. and met Donald Bodor through The Buckskin Lodge of the Order of the Arrow, and, also, because we did not know enough of the details of the incident until we had time to talk with [REDACTED] at home.

When we arrived at Kunatah Camp to pick [REDACTED] up on Sunday, August 20, we found him upset and anxious to leave without Donald, whom we had offered to bring home. [REDACTED] briefly stated that on the Thursday night before Donald had stated, with some graphic detail, that he was a homosexual, and that through further conversation, that lasted 2-3 hours, stated that he had interests toward [REDACTED]. When [REDACTED] tried to say good night and cut off the conversation, Donald then got up from his own cot and laid down next to [REDACTED] on his, upsetting [REDACTED] and forcing him to demand that Donald get off, which he did do.

What makes this so much more upsetting to all of us is the number of other things that [REDACTED] had commented to us about before that day-- how Don told him that there was a place on the LIS where homosexuals hung out-- how Don liked to give him little presents and signed his name with "love". We found their friendship unusual and almost too intense, but we thought their activities caused it-- we found Don immature for his 19 years of age, but since he is Chapter Chief of the O.A.

and [REDACTED] is the Vice Chief and since [REDACTED] helped Don get to work at Kunatah and since Don got [REDACTED] to switch to the Provisional Troop and they shared the lean-to, that all this caused a better friendship. In hindsight, we see a very different picture.

We considered the possibility that [REDACTED] misunderstood or over-reacted, despite his assurance he didn't. We asked Mr. William Kling, Scoutmaster of Troop 157, to look into the matter. He questioned [REDACTED]. We then met with Don, at Don's request, with [REDACTED]; my husband, [REDACTED]; myself; Mr. Kling; and a retired Lutheran minister, Herbert Kern, on Monday evening August 29, 1989. We asked Don to tell us what happened the night [REDACTED] became upset. Without having heard my son's version, Don confirmed the story and added other disturbing points: 1) Don insisted it was only a joke, although he admitted that he never tried to make that clear to [REDACTED] at the time; 2) Don stated that he had been molested at age 15 by an Merit Badge councilor, allegedly, Louie D'Esposito who is married to a cousin of Don's and that he never told anyone about it; 3) Don insisted that what happened at that time never appeared to be so awful because it is something that "brothers do to each other all the time."

We also found Don's persisting calling and alleged lack of insight as to why [REDACTED] was upset with him disturbing, particularly since he called other boys and asked about it. When [REDACTED] choose not to talk with him, Don then showed an increase in interest with [REDACTED] 12 year old brother, [REDACTED] (I interrupted an over hour long conversation between them on the telephone, not realizing at first that [REDACTED] was not talking to one of his own friends.)

[REDACTED] is very upset over the experience and feels that Don's friendship, in hindsight, had a definite purpose and intent.

We're deeply concerned over the possibility of other young boys being approached by Don in the future, as well as Don's possible need for help.

I would also like to state that in many respects, [REDACTED] don is a fine young man, who has earned the rank of Eagle Scout. How sad that he was an alleged victim of such an experience.

We hope that through you, BSA will find a way to be protective of other boys and at the same time be affective in finding a way to get what ever help Don so far hasn't been offered.
