The investigation began when the first boy, now 12, described a June 1988 incident in which he said Shaw exposed himself.

It widened when investigators talked to the second boy, now 15, who said Shaw unzipped the boy's pants and touched him. Both boys testified during the trial.

Douglas County Associate Circuit Judge Roger Wall said he will sentence Shaw on Aug. 1 after getting a presentence report.

He doubled bail to \$3,000, and continued the \$10,000 bail on two felony rape counts Shaw faces in

connection with incidents involving an 11-year-old girl. Shaw remains free on bond.

Defense attorney Jon Van Arkle said he will file for a new trial

Shaw, who did not testify during the two-day trial, showed no reaction when the verdict of the eightman, four-woman jury was announced after 40 minutes of deliberation.

During closing arguments. Van. Arkle and Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Cynthia Rushefsky presented opposing interpretations of the incidents involving the boys.

Speaking of the incident involving the older boy, Van Arkle said it was a mistake, and not an effort by Shaw to attain sexual gratification.

"It's just this isolated incident."

he said.

While Van Arkle said his client was victimized because he had lost his job, his career and his reputation even before going to trial, Rushefsky urged the jury to realize the boys were the victims.

Shaw was involved in a pattern or activity that was an affront and offense to two young boys, Rushersky said.

The boys, both living in one-parent homes, and their mothers trusted a law enforcement officer they also considered a friend, Rusnefsky said.

"We end up trusting people because we have to trust them," she said. "Sometimes, they're not trustworthy."

Wade hopes that doesn't mean they are giving up on the search. She wants the Marines to do all they can to find her husband.

"If they could just find the body," she said. "It's not going to hurt any less, but at least I'd know and it would be over."

Until she does know, Wade, who works as a medical secretary and doctor's office manager, is hesitant to make any plans. For now she is relieved she and her sons Kasey, 10, and Jon, 8, are living in Billings near family and friends.

High school sweethearts who married in November 1976, the Wades are Billings natives.

Kevin Wade, 33, has been in the

Marine Corps for 14½ years. A 1975 Billings High School graduate, he was a star baseball and basketball player, his wife said.

"He was the kid in town that everyone knew." she said.

This is the first time the couple has been separated. Wade said. They have been stationed at several bases in the U.S. When Kevin Wade was notified he had to spend a year in Japan without his family, Pam Wade and the boys moved to the Christian County town from Glenview, Ill. Kevin Wade has been in Japan since January.

Pam Wade also is unsure what to tell her children.

"The boys know there's a possibility daddy's not coming home, but we haven't talked about it much," she said

Accepting the fact that he may not come home will be difficult, she said. Her 8-year-old still wants to pick up the phone and try to call his father.

"He's been gone for six months. They don't realize how final it could be"

# Former deputy found guilty of sex offenses

#### By Mike Penprase The News-Leader

A Greene County jury decided in less than an hour Wednesday to convict a former sheriff's deputy on charges of sexual abuse and indecent exposure involving incidents with two young boys.

Former Greene County victimwitness officer Donald Ray Shaw faces up to one year imprisonment in the same jail where he once worked on the second-degree sexual abuse and indecent exposure charges.

During closing arguments, the attorneys debated who was the victim—Shaw or the two boys who were 10 and 13 years old when the inci-

dents occurred. But the head of a local assistance agency said after the trial that people who try to help victims also were victimized.

Having an officer who dealt with victims and witnesses charged with sex-related crimes embarrassed many people, Springfield Rape Crisis and Sexual Abuse Center Director Judy Compere said.

Compere, who worked on cases with Shaw, said the case points out that no area of life is immune from sexual abuse. Children have to be listened to when they report such incidents, she added.

Shaw, 40, resigned as a Greene



# Deputy pleads Inocent to two sex offenses

Sheriff's Deputy Donald Ray Shaw pleaded innocent Monday in Greene County Associate Circuit Court to two misdemeanor charges of second-degree sexual abuse and indecent exposure involving boys aged 13 and 10.

Shaw, 38, of Willard, resigned his position as victim/witness officer Aug. 1 after being suspended. Sheriff John Pierpont said.

Shaw, who surrendered himself on the charges Monday, was freed on \$1,500 bail. Trial was set for Oct. 25. The charges were filed last week after an investigation by the Missouri State Highway Patrol.

The charges aren't work-related, although one of the alleged victims is the son of a co-worker, Pierpont and Prosecutor Tom Mountjoy said. Pierpont received the first report from a co-worker of Shaw. An internal investigation began, but as it progressed, Pierpont conferred with Mountjoy.

decided an independent agency should be called in.

The sexual-abuse charge accuses Shaw of subjecting a 13-year-old boy to sexual contact — touching — between Oct. 31, 1987, and Dec. 20, 1987. The indecent exposure charge involves an alleged offense June 11 in the presence of a 10-year-old boy.

Maximum punishment on each charge is a year in jail and a \$1,000 fine.

"Any time a law enforcement officer is charged with a criminal offense, we worry a great deal about how it affects the public trust," Mountjoy said.

The prosecutor and sheriff emphasized the alleged neidents weren't work-related.

"There's no way that Sheriff Pierpont or anyone else can know what individuals do on their own time," Mountjoy said. "How these matters are handled when they come to our attention is the most important factor. This particular case has been thoroughly investigated, and charges have been filed. It will be prosecuted as any other case."

Mountjoy said the Greene County Sheriff's Department is an excellent agency, and Pierpont "is a person nd a sheriff of high integrity. These events should not ast any reflection on him or the sheriff's department as whole."
