Please find enclosed the conviction notice and court documents relating to Drake Harkness, former Scoutmaster of Troop 31 of the Mount Baker Area Council. His last membership number was 002715, which expired on January 31, 1987. He is not currently registered.

I would like to have Mr. Harkness placed in the confidential file and not be allowed back into the Boy Scouts of America. I talked to Mr. Park in the legal counsel office, and he said to get this request to you.

On Monday, March 9, I gave the information to my Scout Executive, Tom Halazon, to notify him of the conviction so that he could send this request to you. When I handed it to him (the newspaper article), he crumpled it up, said he saw it already, and then said "Why don't you just put it up on a billboard for everyone to see." Since that time nothing has been done regarding Mr. Harkness. He was involved with the pre-camp inspection, he even signed it. Several board members, our camp ranger and other volunteers believe that there is no reason that Mr. Harkness be allowed to be in Scouting, as long as we keep him away from the boys, because he has done so much for camp and is a nice guy.

I am not of this opinion, and cannot believe a council executive and camp ranger would allow him to still be involved because he has had counseling and served his sentence. Please let me know if I can send a letter to Mr. Harkness regarding the Boy Scouts of America's position regarding his status as far as being registered, involvement on council properties or in being at scouting functions.

James G. Rosario, 37, 305 Gladstone St., was sentenced Wednesday to 21 months in state prison for second-degree assault. He pleaded guilty to the charge Jan. 30. Rosario was accused of assaulting an ex-girlfriend Dec. 21. Police said he hit her over the head with a ceramic pitcher, kicked her while she was on the ground, stabbed her in the chest with a kitchen knife, and slashed her arm, severing two fingers.

Diana L. Silver, 23, 1142 Nevada St., pleaded guilty Wednesday to first-degree theft. She was accused of receiving \$4,032 in unwarranted public assistance between January 1985 and February 1986 by not reporting some household income to the Department of Social and Health Services. Whatcom County Superior Court Judge Marshall Forrest sentenced her to 19 days in Whatcom County Jail and repayment of the \$4,032.

Peter O. Robinson, 49, 5824 Seamount Drive, Ferndale, pleaded guilty Wednesday to two counts of a sexual offense. He was accused of having sexual contact with a minor girl.

James Larson, 53, 2083 Shuksan St., Ferndale, pleaded guilty Wednesday to two counts of a sexual offense. He was accused of having sexual contact with a minor girl.

Thursday to two counts of having contact with a minor low immoral purposes. He was sentenced to 365 days in Whatcom County Jail. The sentence was deferred on condition Harkness complete sexual deviancy treatment. He also was ordered to spend 14 days in jail with work release. Harkness was

accused of having sexual contact with a minor boy.

Thomas A. Van Horn, 18, 2501 Alvarado Drive, pleaded guilty Thursday to possession of stolen property in the first-degree. He was sentenced to 30 days in Whatcom County Jail, with 15 days converted to 120 hours of community service. He was detained by Western Washington University police Feb. 1 and charged with driving a car that had been reported stolen in California.

Jerry D. Catlett, 26, 1408 E St., was sentenced Thursday to one year in Whatcom County Jail for first-degree trespassing. A jury found him guilty of the charge Feb. 3, but found him innocent of firstdegree burglary and second-degree assault. He was accused originally of forcing his way into a Bellingham house Oct. 24 and attempting to stab an occupant. During the trial, a defense attorney said the Catlett had been upset because the occupant had been providing drugs to a female friend of the defendant's.

Dennis H. DeGraaf, 34, 521 Sterling Drive, was sentenced Wednesday to one year in Whatcom County Jail, with the time converted to inresidential mental health treatment, for a charge of second-degree burglary. He pleaded guilty to the charge Feb. 4. DeGraaf was granted a lighter-than-usual sentence in part because his cooperation helped police obtain convictions of two other people, Kenneth A. Linse and James T Tollisen, in the case. They also pleaded guilty to stealing items from a house on Jaeger Street. A fire was set at the house, causing \$12,600 damage. Prosecutors said they did not have enough evidence to prove arson in the incident


