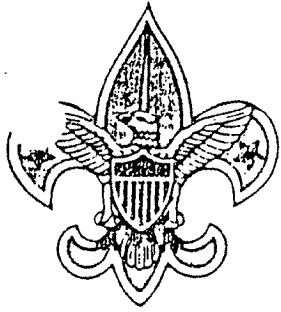



REF: REGISTRATION SUSPENSION - MICHAEL THOMAS KERR
RECOMMENDATION AND
DUANE DALE TROYER

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Michael T. Kerr was employed as District Scout Executive by the W. D. Boyce Council from April 1, 1979 until his termination, October 13, 1980. During his professional tenure here, he was assigned to The Tomahawk District, serving Tazewell & Mason Counties, State of Illinois. He resided at 1417 N. 12th St., Pekin, Illinois, maintaining his residence at that address following his termination as a Professional Scouter. He remains, as of this date, well known to many in the area as a Scouting representative and some may not even be aware he is no longer employed by the BSA.

D. Dale Troyer, while residing in Bloomington and active in several positions in that District has also been very active in the Tomahawk District. He has served for many years as the Scouting Coordinator for his Masonic Lodge's Scouting program in Minier, Illinois. He served as the Tomahawk District Commissioner with Mike Kerr, during 1980 - 81 and remained a District Unit Commissioner when asked to serve as Assistant Council Commissioner for Commissioner Training during the Summer of 1981.

FACTS;

This matter was brought to our attention with the receipt of the "Park Dist. Tickets" news article which appeared in the Pekin Times newspaper, April 26, 1982. This article was mailed to us with the anonymous note attached.

We began investigation with a contact to Officer William Maddox, Pekin Police Department and Post Advisor for the Law Enforcement Explorer post in Pekin to see what additional information he might provide. He agreed and soon reported back that both defendants has already appeared in the 10th Judicial Circuit Court in Tazewell County on April 28. From the record of court proceedings, Maddox related that the testimony of the arresting officer included:

Both had been apprehended on Pekin Park property, after closing hours and while engaged in an act of oral sex. He also related that Troyer had been (partially) clothed in the uniform of an adult leader in the Boy Scouts of America.

Both defendants had plead guilty of the charges of being in the park after dark and indecent conduct, were fined and released.

ACTION:

The testimony of the arresting officer and the plea of guilty to these charges indicate that neither Troyer or Kerr fit the high standards of leadership required for membership in the Boy Scouts of America. The Council President was appraised of the facts and, with consideration that some information had already been published, a newspaper report of convictions was expected and the annual Scout Show of the District was to be held on May 1 with both individuals expected to attend, that it would be better for all concerned if suspension of registration and Scouting activities would be immediate

Therefore, the National Council suggested letter of suspension was prepared and signed by the Council President.

The letter to Duane Dale Troyer was hand delivered by Director of Field Service Dan Miller and Corn Belt District Executive John Alline on the evening of April 29, 1982. The letter to Michael Thomas Kerr was hand delivered by Finance Director Gordon Brown and Tomahawk District Executive Gary Schmidtke, also the evening of April 29, 1982.

Both individuals accepted their letters with little comment, no denial or protest. Verbal review of the standards of leadership and the right to seek review of the case was presented by Miller and Brown as the National Procedures suggest. Both individuals were requested to not take part in future Scouting activities without a successful review of their case.

The W. D. Boyce Council, BSA, respectfully requests the R^Egistration and Subscription Service to honor the suspension of these two individuals.
