

Mr. Dole was referred to Spoon River Center for Community Mental Health by the local leaders of Boy Scouts of America. Mr. Dole had admitted to sexual activities with young males while on camping outings.

Mr. Dole was seen for a total of seven (7) sessions with this therapist and one session with Dr. Robert Edwalds. These sessions took place between July 19, 1984 and October 22, 1984. During these sessions an extensive psychosoical summary was developed (copy attached). Goals for the sessions included addressing any depression resulting from the community discovery of the activities and an attempt at determining a proper diagnosis and changes Mr. Dole might consider making.

A Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory was administered. The report (copy attached) is one which sheds some light on Mr. Dole's role in life.

Mr. Dole is rather quiet and at first was not very verbal. However, he spoke freely after the first session and was readily able to discuss all aspects of his life. Following an early reaction of anxiety and depression at the time of the parents' charges, Mr. Dole has not had a lot of difficulty handling this situation. At no time was there any doubt of his concern for his loss of scouting activities, but it was not something that appeared to cause great distress.

Dr. Edwalds' report (copy attached) contains a diagnosis of "pedophilia, ego-syntonic". He also states that the "patient can adjust his behavior in accordance with the reality principle". This would appear to be what Mr. Dole has done over the past year by avoiding situations in which opportunities were presented that would allow for intimate contact with teens.

Hopefully, these materials will be of some assistance with the decision which faces scouting leaders. Mr. Dole is no longer actively engaged in

Summary, Focus, Strategy for next session.
This appears to be a valid profile. The validity scales are similar to those of naive, unsophisticated people who are feeling bad. In people with little education and poor work achievement, this configuration is not unusual.
The evaluation of clinical scales shows tendencies toward withdrawal and social isolation. These people are usually very shy and inept in social situations. Unlike those who know what to do, but are emotionally inhibited, these people usually do not have social skills and need to learn them. They tend to be especially inept with the opposite sex. They tend to be chronically depressed and to see this as an integral part of themselves. This may detract from the motivation to change.
If rapport can be developed with this client, I would suggest that he may need to begin building rudimentary skills very gradually, over a long period of time.
Melton Erickson has written up an interesting treatment of a young man in the book, "Undommon Therapy", Chapter 4, Character Revision of The Young Adult. He describes the case of a 23 year old, poorly educated laborer. The therapy begins with teaching this client to maintain an adequate diet and home environment. Over a period of years this client completes his education, establishes social relationships and substantially improves his existence. The step by step description of building his character may have some relevance for this case.

PSYCHOSOCIAL SUMMARY

In high school Ed only dated four times during his Senior year. He reports he initiated on two occasions heavy petting, which included breast and genital manipulation. Mr. Dole reports that he found this very exciting. Following high school Ed has dated only one girl but none in the past nine months. Mr. Dole states that he still feels very shy around girls and does not know what to say or is afraid

Mr. Dole states that his first sexual activities were on a camping trip when he was fifteen years old. A group of four boys engaged in mutual masturbation. Since that time he has engaged in these same acts with two of these people on two different occasions.

During the last four to five years, Mr. Dole has sexually fondled four or five young scounts while on camping trips. These young men were 14 or 15 years of age. Mr. Dole states he found the mutual masturbation exciting but felt very guilty about it later. About one year ago he began to avoid situations that could lead to these affairs and reports no such incidences in the past year. However, he reports that he has used games and rough-housing to allow himself to touch the young males.

Mr. Dole reports he is interested in penis size and describes himself as average. He states he masturbates about once a week and reports no mental images or fautasies. He reports that he has had access to female parrography in the past.

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

We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of leadership which BSA seeks to provide for the American youth. Please also understand that this decision and the reasons for it, will be maintained as confidential.

We are pleased to hear that you have sought professional counseling, and in recognition of the effort that you are making, we would be willing, at some point in the future, to review the possibility of your registration being reinstated on a probationary basis, subject to the professional opinion rendered at that time.

If you wish to have the decision that has currently been made reviewed, please write to me explaining your position, and include information that would support your claim that your registration as a BSA leader should be reinstated.



The troop committee of Cambridge Boy Scout Troop 101 mer is a special session on July 9, 1984. This meeting was called at the request of some of the parents of scouts in the troop. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss some events that took place while the troop was at Loud Thunder Scout Camp during the week of June 24-30, 1984.

Our assistant scoutmaster, Ed Dole, was the only adult leader to attend camp with our troop for the entire week. At the meeting we learned that Ed had attempted to sexually harass some of the scouts in the troop both at summer camp and at other events in the past. There seemed to be two areas of concern on the part of the parents present and the troop committee, and these were that the boys be protected from this situation, and also that Ed seek some help for his problem.

After discussing at length the events that happened, and also after hearing statements from five different families, it was the opinion of the members present that Ed should be immediately removed from any leadership position with the troop. We also felt that Ed should seek professional counseling for this problem. Ed walked into this meeting about this time, and he was informed of the decision. He agreed to withdraw from the troop and said he would be willing to seek counseling.

Since we have discussed this situation on the telephone, you are aware of the events that have taken place since that meeting. The purpose of this letter is to ask that Ed Dole's name be taken off the list of registered adult leaders of Troop 101. It is the opinion of the troop committee that he can no longer be associated with the troop, either officially or casually at this time.

Thank you for your personal concern in this matter, and we all hope that Ed can get the help he needs through counseling so that he can some day again become an active scout leader.


On June 30th 1984, _____ came back from camp at Loud Thunder and told me that he hated Ed. I asked him why? - He bothers us mom, was his answer. - What do you mean by bother? - Well, he tried to put his hands in our pants. Did he do it to you? - No, but he did it before when he took me to the movies. But, at camp he did it to Did you see it? - Yes, he answered.

This type of harrassment is not new to us since he had made advances to on numerous occasions starting with the trip to Ely last year. I had told to tell him that we knew about it and that he had better stop it immediately or he would find himself into troubles. I had hoped that maybe this situation was not too late to remedy. But I was wrong and should have said something to you then.

I feel that under those circumstances Ed should be taken out from the scouting program and put under medical care. If he refuses then, criminal charges should be made before he has the opportunity to hurt a young boy in our community
