MEMORANDUM DECISION

Case: Reinstatement of Registration of
Mr. Eric Hillebrenner

The review committee has investigated the allegations of sexual misconduct of the petitioner which purportedly took place during 1979 and 1980, and submits this written report of its decision.

The committee considered evidence presented by a 15 year old male with whom the petitioner allegedly had contact during that time. The review committee also considered the evidence given by Mr. Eric Hillebrenner in his January 25, 1988, meeting with the committee. During this meeting the members were able to question Mr. Hillebrenner, and he was allowed the opportunity to present anything he deemed relevant to the committee. This meeting was designed to allow a free flow of conversation between the committee members and Mr. Hillebrenner while remaining structured to address the issues of the reinstatement question.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

After full consideration of the facts presented, the committee has made the following findings of fact in regard to the allegations against Mr. Hillebrenner.

1. The petitioner did have substantial contact with the 15 year old male, who was 8 and 9 years old at the time. This contact was at petitioner's home and elsewhere

when they were together without anyone else present.

2. The testimony of the 15 year old was found to be credible, and no sign of ulterior motive could be detected. This finding was made concerning the allegations after careful review by the committee, two of whom have dealt professionally with child sexual abuse.

3. The testimony of the petitioner was found by the members of the committee to be suspect and not reliable. Several members noted that when the petitioner addressed the subject of sexual abuse as alleged, he became red-faced and cotton-mouthed, as well as exhibiting somewhat feminine characteristics through the meeting.

4. The petitioner's lifestyle through his own testimony has in great part been devoid of any romantic relationships with the opposite sex, and has centered in large part on his mother and young boys. The committee finds that these characteristics, as well as his physical manifestations while addressing the subject, are consistent with the allegations which have been made.

5. The facts of this case present the appearance of serious impropriety on the part of the petitioner, and support a finding that he does not possess the moral or emotional qualities necessary to afford positive leadership to youth.

DECISION

The committee, based on the foregoing facts, hereby denies the application of Mr. Eric Hillebrenner for reinstatement of his registration with the Boy Scouts of America.


To Whom It May Concern:

Eric Hillebrenner was employed at [REDACTED], Inc. from June 1978 through July 1983. Eric was the warehouse supervisor, with an average of ten persons under his direction.

During the summer months, which was our primary show-season, Eric would also head up many of our "show" crews which would travel throughout the U.S. to set up and sell our goods, and represent the business at Indian Powwows and other related events. This involved supervising the preparation and execution of considerable levels of inventory, personnel, and other logistical details involved in some trips which would often last several weeks.

Additionally, he helped greatly with his personal enthusiasm and dedication to our business. On numerous occasions he would use his own vehicle and time to make weekend trips to represent Treaty Oak (by himself) at Scouting events, Indian Hobbyest events, etc. These trips ranged from south Florida to North Carolina and Louisiana. While he was reimbursed for his out of pocket expense, the time and effort expended by Eric were his personal contribution to a business he was committed to, as well as to the organizations he helped with his attendance.

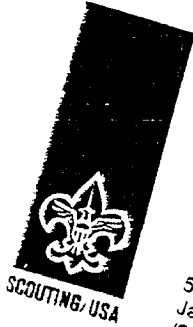

At 5:30 p.m. I met Reverend Joe Jursa, Pastor of Calvary United Methodist Church, Daisy Pugh, Scouting Coordinator for the church and Arthur W. Pugh, III, Unit Commissioner for Troop and Post 418 sponsored by Calvary United Methodist Church. We met in the church parking lot, and were driven by Arthur Pugh to the residence of Mr. Eric Hillebrenner whose address is [REDACTED] Orange Park, Florida 32073

After ringing the doorbell we were invited into the house by Mr. Hillebrenner. We sat in the living room, provided him a copy of the letter from Council President A. Dano Davis, dated August 25, 1987, regarding the suspension of Eric Hillebrenner's Boy Scout Registration. Mr. Hillebrenner read the letter. He was asked if there was any comments or questions. He said he was expecting to hear from us. He was aware of the accusations by [REDACTED] regarding immoral activities. The conversation was pleasant and without antagonism. Mr. Hillebrenner asked if it would be possible to have his registration reinstated after this issue was cleared up. He was informed that there were procedures for reinstatement, if he were to contact the Scout Service Center at that time, he would be provided the proper information to pursue that course of action.

The group departed the Hillebrenner residence together at about 5:45 p.m. and returned to the church parking lot.

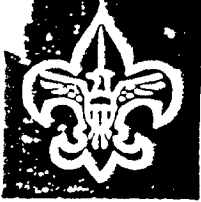
