REGULAR CONDITIONS OF PROBATION - G.S. 15A-1343(b)

The defendant shall: 1. Commit no criminal offense in any jurisdiction. 2. Possess no firearm, explosive device or other deadly weapon listed in G.S. 14-263. 3. Remain gainfully and suitably employed or faithfully pursue a course of study or of vocational training that will equip him for suitable employment. 4. Satisfy child support and family obligations, as required by the Court. If the defendant is on supervised probation, he shall also: 5. Remain within the jurisdiction of the Court unless granted written permission to leave by the Court or his probation officer. 6. Report as directed by the Court or his probation officer to the officer at reasonable times and places and in a reasonable manner, permit the officer to visit him at reasonable times, answer all reasonable inquiries by the officer and obtain prior approval from the officer for, and notify the officer of, any change in address or employment. 7. Notify the probation officer if he fails to obtain or retain satisfactory employment. 8. At a time to be designated by his probation officer, visit with his probation officer a facility maintained by the Division of Prisons. If the defendant is to serve an active sentence as a condition of special probation, he shall also: 9. Obey the rules and regulations of the Department of Correction governing the conduct of inmates while imprisoned. 10. Report to a probation officer in the State of North Carolina within 72 hours of his discharge from the active term of imprisonment.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF PROBATION - G.S. 15A-1343(b1), 143B-262(c)

The defendant shall also comply with the following special conditions which the Court finds are reasonably related to his rehabilitation:

- 11. Surrender his driver's license to the Clerk of Superior Court for transmittal to the Division of Motor Vehicles and not operate a motor vehicle for a period of \_\_\_\_\_ or until relicensed by the Division of Motor Vehicles, whichever is later.
- 12. Submit at reasonable times to warrantless searches by a probation officer of his person, and of his vehicle and premises while he is present, for the following purposes which are reasonably related to his probation supervision:
  - stolen goods
  - controlled substances
  - contraband
  - Not use, possess or control any illegal drug or controlled substance unless it has been prescribed for him by a licensed physician and is in the original container with the prescription number affixed on it; not knowingly associate with any known or previously convicted users, possessors or sellers of any illegal drugs or controlled substances; and not knowingly be present at or frequent any place where illegal drugs or controlled substances are sold, kept or used.
- 14. Supply a breath, urine and/or blood specimen for analysis of the possible presence of a prohibited drug or alcohol, when instructed by his probation officer, and pay the cost of that analysis.
- 15. Successfully pass the General Education Development Test (G.E.D.) during the first \_\_\_\_\_ months of the period of probation.
- 16. Complete \_\_\_\_\_ hours of community or reparative service during the first \_\_\_\_\_ days of the period of probation, as directed by the community service coordinator and pay the fee prescribed by G.S. 143B-475.1(b)  pursuant to the schedule set out under monetary conditions above.  within \_\_\_\_\_ days of this judgment and before beginning service.

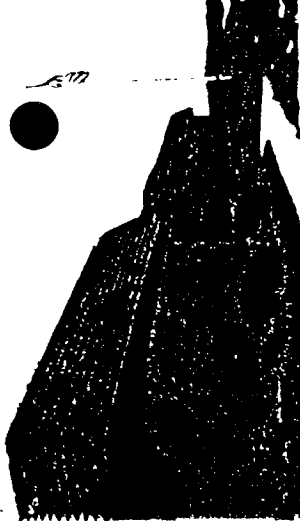

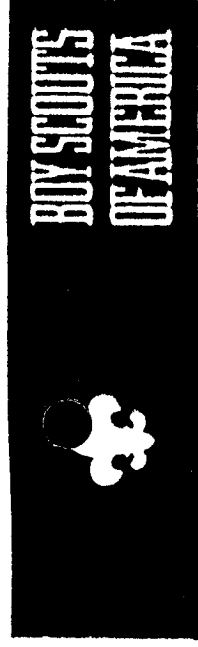

Listed below is a report concerning an incident that took place at Camp John J. Barnhardt on July 22, 1990 at approximately 11:30 p.m. The report concerns the fondling of a Boy Scout age 14 by the name of [REDACTED] Kannapolis, N. C. 28081, phone number [REDACTED]. He was allegedly fondled by an adult by the name of Eugene Rapson, [REDACTED] Kannapolis, N. C. 28081, phone number [REDACTED].

Acting Scoutmaster in Camp was Byron Trent Clay, [REDACTED] Kannapolis, N. C. 28081, phone number [REDACTED] and Committee Chairman David Williams, [REDACTED] N. C. 28081, phone number [REDACTED]. The Camp Director for camp John J. Barnhardt is Rodney Almond, [REDACTED] Monroe, N. C. 28110, phone number (Office) [REDACTED] and (home) [REDACTED]. This report was given to the Boy Scout Camp Director by [REDACTED].

On July 22, 1990, at approximately 11:30 p.m. David Williams and myself and one other Camp staff member were sitting at a table in our Campsite playing cards when we noticed that one of the older Scouts, [REDACTED] came over near the table and was acting a little funny. I asked him if there was something he wanted and he said no, he left. Approximately 30 minutes later when I went back to my tent, I found [REDACTED] in the tent with tears in his eyes. I asked him what was the matter and he stated that he could not tell me. I persisted and told him he had to tell me what the problem was. He said that he could not sleep in the tent with Mr. Eugene Repson, a 65 year old adult that had come to camp with us. When I asked why, he resisted telling me at first but finally said that he was laying in his bed almost asleep when Mr.

Rapson came over and began fondling him. I called Mr. Rapson outside the tent and confronted him with the story that had been given me by the boy. He claimed that he was just giving the boy a rubdown and was not fondling him. He even stated that the boy had given him permission. I went back to the boy and talked to him to get a full report on what actually happened. The boy, [REDACTED] told me that earlier in the evening, he was approached by Mr. Rapson who wanted to know that if he did something to him would he tell anyone. [REDACTED] said I can't say I want tell anyone because I don't know what you want to do. Mr. Rapson asked the boy several times if he would tell anyone. The boy constantly replied that I don't know what you are talking about.

[REDACTED] was almost asleep when he was awakened by Mr. Rapson fondling him. This scared the boy and he told Mr. Rapson he had to go to the bathroom. That is when he come out of the tent and went over to the Scoutmaster's table the first time. [REDACTED] was told by Mr. Rapson not to tell anyone so the boy was naturally worried and scared about telling.

[REDACTED] was in the tent with Mr. Rapson because he was a Junior Leader and felt that he would be alright in the tent with another adult. We also felt Mr. Rapson was a good adult.

After hearing the final story from the boy, I approached Mr. Rapson and told him he would have to pack up his stuff and would have to leave the Camp. After he packed up, I asked him to sit at one of the tables with another one of our Assistant Scoutmasters. I then reported the incident to the Camp Director and the Camp Director reported the incident to the Scout Executive.

I would also like to add that when I finally got Mr. Rapson to pack up his things, he seemed to be very defensive and stated that he was an old man and that his life was about over and that he would just have to get out of Scouting anyway. He has been registered with this troop for approximately 3 months.

At approximately 1:00 a.m., the Scout Executive was called and came to the Camp where he interviewed the Scoutmaster and personally escorted Mr. Rapson out of Camp and carried him to his home in Kannapolis. Mr. Rapson has been suspended from all Boy Scouting activities until the completion of this investigation.

The Southeast Regional Boy Scouts of America has been notified of this incident as well as the Boy Scouts of America.
