RE: Material for the Confidential File

After conferring with the Cub Master of Pack 190 State Fair District, Mr. Daniel W. VanderWeel, the Director of the Big Brother- Big Sister Program Chenoweth Watson, Metropolitan Council of Churches, and from information obtained from the Detroit Police Department the following confidential information has been gathered on one, Floyd Milton Pepper.

Mr. Pepper applied for and was accepted as the Assistant Cub Master of P-190 State Fair District, late in the fall of 1966. He had had some previous scouting experience, and at present has a younger brother enrolled with P-190. Until recently, he lived at home with his parents at 20495 Irvington, Detroit, Michigan. It is our understanding that he has been asked to leave the home by his family and is now residing in an apartment somewhere in the City of Highland Park, Michigan, exact address unknown.

He was asked to resign as Assistant Cub Master of P-190 sponsored by Truth Lutheran Church, after committee action was taken early in December, 1966 after the committee had found the man to be completely undesirable for mental, physical and social reasons. The following information was obtained from Chenoweth Watson, Executive Director, Big Brother- Big Sister Program. This program is presently prosecuting Mr. Pepper for immoral acts with the young man involved in the program. We also understand that he has been removed from the role in his church for similar actions. The following information is a matter of record with the Detroit Police Department.

1. In 1959 at the age of 16 Mr. Pepper was arrested for dishonorable conduct - accosting young men. He was fined \$10.00 and released. This offense occurred in Madison Heights.

2. In 1961 at the age of 18 he was arrested for breaking and entering of a business. He received 2 years probation and was fined \$100.00 in court costs and \$87.00 in restitution.

3. In October, 1961 he was arrested for violation of parole and sentenced to thirty days in the Detroit House of Correction.

4. In December, 1962 he was arrested and convicted for accosting and soliciting another man. He was sentenced to sixty days in the Detroit House of Correction.

5. In 1964 he had many traffic violations on his record.

6. In 1965 many traffic violations were on his record.

7. In November, 1966 he was involved in a hit and run automobile accident, involving a car taken without the permission of the owner. At this time the case is still pending.

We understand that he is listed on Police Records as a known homosexual. Additional facts that we have been able to come up with on Mr. Floyd Milton Pepper include:

1. He falsified his date of birth and age on his adult application for Membership Scouting. He is 24 years old and on his adult application, he indicated that he was 26 years old. He has recently filed for bankruptcy and we understand that this action has been cleared.

2. He has one child, and at the present time is going through a divorce suit.

3. He is the member of the Outlaws Motorcycle Club.

4. He has a very bad case of Syphilis.

It is my belief after thorough investigation of Mr. Floyd Milton Pepper that his name should be placed on our confidential list, and that he should be refused membership in the Boy Scouts of America.

ARTICLE II — PURPOSE: CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT — CITIZENSHIP TRAINING — PHYSICAL FITNESS

"The purpose of this corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8, 1910, and restated in Section 3 of the charter granted by Congress June 15, 1916, as follows: "That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use by Boy Scouts' by placing emphasis upon the Scout Oath or Promise and Law for character development, citizenship training, and physical fitness." — *Constitution of the Boy Scouts of America.*

GRANTING COMMISSIONS AND CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

The *Constitution and Bylaws of the Boy Scouts of America* authorize commissions and certificates of membership only to those who subscribe to the Scout Oath or Promise, and Law, the declaration of religious principle (as printed below), and its Constitution and Bylaws and are citizens of the United States, or have legally declared their intentions to become citizens of the U. S.

ARTICLE IV—DECLARATION OF RELIGIOUS PRINCIPLE

"Section 1. The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of citizenship without recognizing his obligation to God. In the first part of the Boy Scout's Oath or Promise the boy declares, 'On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law.' The recognition of God as the ruling and leading power in the universe and the grateful acknowledgment of His favors and blessings are necessary to the best type of citizenship and are wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the boy may be—Catholic or Protestant or Jew—this fundamental need of good citizenship should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the religious element in the training of the boy, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that religious training. Its policy is that the organization or institution with which the Boy Scout is connected shall give definite attention to his religious life.

"Only persons willing to subscribe to this declaration of principle shall be entitled to certificates of leadership in carrying out the Boy Scout program."

THE SCOUT OATH

On my honor I will do my best
To do my duty to God and my country and to obey the
Scout Law;
To help other people at all times;
To keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and
morally straight.

THE CUB SCOUT PROMISE

I () promise
To do my best
To do my duty
To God and my country,

To obey the Law of the Pack.

THE SCOUT LAW

1. A Scout is trustworthy.

A Scout's honor is to be trusted. If he were to violate his honor by telling a lie or by cheating or by not doing exactly a given task, when trusted on his honor, he may be directed to hand over his Scout badge.

2. A Scout is loyal.

He is loyal to all to whom loyalty is due, his Scout leader, his home and parents and country.

3. A Scout is helpful.

He must be prepared at any time to save life, help injured persons, and share the home duties. He must do at least one Good Turn to somebody every day.

4. A Scout is friendly.

He is a friend to all and a brother to every other Scout.

5. A Scout is courteous.

He is polite to all, especially to women, children, old people, and the weak and helpless. He must not take pay for being helpful or courteous.

6. A Scout is kind.

He is a friend to animals. He will not kill nor hurt any living creature needlessly, but will strive to save and protect all harmless life.

7. A Scout is obedient.

He obeys his parents, Scoutmaster, patrol leader, and all other duly constituted authorities.

8. A Scout is cheerful.

He smiles whenever he can. His obedience to orders is prompt and cheery. He never shirks nor grumbles at hardships.

9. A Scout is thrifty.

He does not wantonly destroy property. He works faithfully, wastes nothing, and makes the best use of his opportunities. He saves his money so that he may pay his own way, be generous to those in need, and helpful to worthy objects. He may work for pay, but must not receive tips for courtesies or Good Turns.

10. A Scout is brave.

He has the courage to face danger in spite of fear and to stand up for the right against the coaxings of friends or the jeers or threats of enemies, and defeat does not down him.

11. A Scout is clean.

He keeps clean in body and thought; stands for clean speech, clean sport, clean habits; and travels with a clean crowd.

12. A Scout is reverent.

He is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion.

APPROVAL

The application of the Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Explorer Advisor, and their assistants and Den Mothers should be approved by the chairman of the unit committee. Applications of unit committeemen must be approved by the head of the institution or sponsoring body. Council Scouter should be approved by the proper council authority.

REGISTRATION FEES

If applicant already holds an unexpired registration certificate in another capacity, no fee is required with this application, unless he is ceasing activity in the other capacity. In such case he should pay a proportionate fee to the expiration of this registration.

Annual adult fee is \$1.00, but for periods of less than one year, registration will be proportionate to the period to be covered, as shown on the front side.
