Dear Mr. Ernst:

Sometime ago we corresponded with you concerning separation notices for Ray Weeks and for Frank Tercey and Judith Tercey. Your concern at that time was whether or not these individuals were recommendations for the Confidential File. (Please refer to copies of your letters attached to this letter.) The wheels of justice sometimes grind rather slowly and we wanted to be able to give you all the details when these felony cases were completed.

In the case of Raymond Lawrence Weeks, former Scoutmaster of Troop 295, he was originally arrested September 27, 1975 on multiple felony counts of homosexual activities with several Scouts of the Troop. Mr. Weeks resigned after confrontation with the Troop Committee. We found out later on that he had a prior felony record of this type of thing in 1969. Since September he has been going through the usual sequence of pre-trial hearings, not guilty pleas, psychiatric counseling continuances, etc., etc. He was finally sentenced on June 21. 1976 on two counts. Has received five years probation with six month incarceration. He is currently in jail. He is not considered to be mentally disordered. Conditions of probation are: Maintain counseling; maintain employment; not associate with youth under age 18 or any youth organizations. He is now a permanently registered sex offender under Section 290 of the Penal Code. Reference Case #CR35856, San Diego Superior Court.

Concerning Franklin Keith Tercey and Judith Ann Tercey. Frank had been the Cubmaster of Pack 279 and his wife, Judith had been the Den Leader Coach for the same Pack. They were arrested on December 18, 1975, each charged with multiple felony counts of various forms of sex perversion. It seems

that Mr. & Mrs. Tarcey had a series of sex orgies in their home over a three year period involving themselves, minor children and two other minor girls in the neighborhood. They also took several hundred color photographs of these various actions. Stevenson PTA President Muriel Spieth and Associate District Executive Carl Rich visited the Tarcey's at their home on December 29, 1975 and obtained their resignations from the Scouting program. The authorities declined to prosecute Judith Tercey and the last we heard she is somewhere in northern California. Prosecution proceeded for Frank Tercey. He has now been convicted (as of June 18, 1976) on one count of unlawful intercourse with a minor. He is not considered to be mentally disordered. He has received five years probation with six months in custody; custody to begin on December 20, 1976. He may not associate with youth under age 18 or any youth organizations. He is not required to register as a sex offender. Reference Case #CR36597, San Diego Superior Court.

Also attached are the confidential record sheets for all three individuals. I hope this information will be sufficient. If there are any questions please feel free to contact us. There has been no newspaper publicity concerning these three cases.
