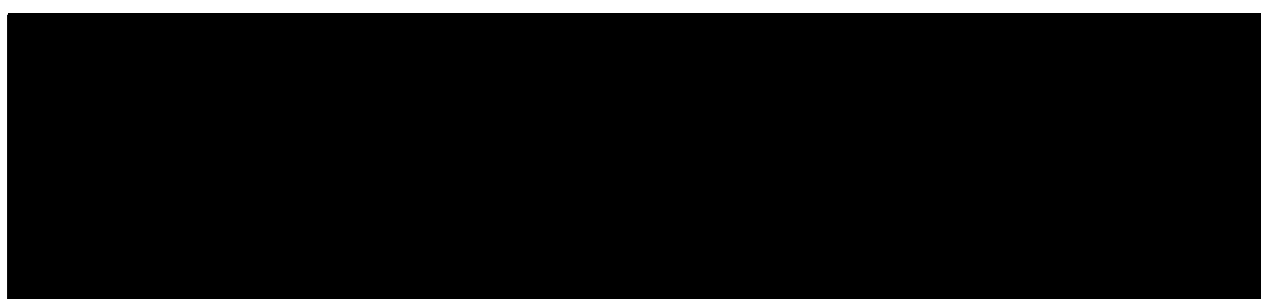

Dear Mr. Love,

I was surprised, shocked, and very disappointed to receive your letter of July 16, 1990 (a copy is enclosed).

I was shocked because I think this issue deserves more than a standard form letter, shocked because I had expected an opportunity to meet personally with the review committee that would be deciding my fate, shocked that you would allow a decision to be made on this matter without a face to face meeting.

I am writing to you to ask that you reexamine my request for reinstatement. I and others believe that the Boy Scouts of America has turned their back on this issue since it began last August -which resulted in my receiving only a token effort from the regional and national level review committees.

On numerous occasions I have made requests for copies of all policies, guidelines, and directives regarding the process of reinstatement. To date, I have yet to receive any of the requested information from the local, regional, or national offices.

Without this information I have been put at a disadvantage in my preparations for my appeals. I was forced to rely on the precedents set by the East Central Region when preparing my appeal to you. Because the East Central Region had met with me in person I had fully expected the same type of meeting to take place with the national review committee.

I believe that an issue this important, both to me and the BSA movement, calls for a face to face meeting. Especially since a letter could not possibly begin to explain the reasons why I, and many others, believe it is in the best interest of the Boy Scouts of America to reinstate me as a volunteer leader.

The entire situation regarding my suspension and reinstatement has been mismanaged by the Central Ohio

Council. This concerns me because I believe this mismanagement had a direct impact on the information that the regional and national level review committees received from the local council regarding this issue. I also believe that the mismanagement which took place on the local level biased the entire review procedure. However, I am looking forward to meeting with you to discuss my specific concerns.


In closing, I would ask that you please keep an open-mind with regards to this issue, and I am asking that you personally investigate this matter further.

Once again I am making a request for a copy of all policies, guidelines, and directives which refer to a volunteer's suspension and reinstatement. I would also like to know the basis and reasoning behind the national review committee's recent decision to uphold my suspension.

As a Scout, I was taught that to be a good leader it is my business to find out the other persons point-of-view before we actually press our own. I am hoping that as the leader of our great movement you will take the time to find out my point-of-view.

I am putting my trust in you to do the right thing. I will be awaiting your speedy reply.

Dear Mr. Hart:

Mr. Stroup received your letter of March 22, 1990, announcing your vote to "uphold the decision of the Central Ohio Council denying [his] application for membership." Obviously, Gary received this news with sadness. He intends to seek a review before the National Council. However, without a detailed explanation of the basis for your committee's decision, Gary cannot possibly comply with your directive to write to the National Council "explaining why [he] believe[s] the decision is in error."

In order to effectively pursue his right of review, I request that you provide me with a detailed explanation of the basis of your decision. At this stage, Gary simply cannot adequately address your concerns without knowledge of the facts underlying the original decision to suspend his registration and your committee's subsequent vote to uphold that decision.

As evidenced by the attached letters, neither you, Mr. Barbernitz, nor Mr. Hickman ever stated the basis for suspending Gary's registration or terminating his employment with BSA. In Mr. Barbernitz's reply letter to me, he states: "After the jury trial you my activate your request for a review." Gary was acquitted at trial. Your committee convened; and upheld a decision, the basis of which has never been articulated.

Dear Mr. Love:

I am writing on behalf of my client Gary Stroup to ask that you initiate the National Council's review procedures of the East Central Regional decision to uphold the Central Ohio Council's suspension of Mr. Stroup's Registration with the Boy Scouts of America. I have enclosed copies of the correspondence which tracks the history of this situation.

As you can see from the correspondence, Mr. Stroup's BSA Registration was suspended after he was accused of criminal offenses alleging sexual misconduct. The allegations did not arise from contact during scouting activities; and they did not result in convictions. Mr. Stroup was acquitted at trial on all charges.

Because Mr. Stroup was acquitted (one boy's testimony was so infirm that all charges connected with him were dismissed mid-trial by the Judge) and because he was not involved in a scouting activity, we believe the decision to suspend his registration is in error. On his behalf, I ask that the National Council review this decision. I would also appreciate it if you could send me whatever guidelines apply to this review procedure so that Mr. Stroup can effectively present his position.

In the near future, I will be mailing to you letters supporting Mr. Stroup from various BSA members. Mr. Stroup is widely known in the Central Ohio Scouting community. He was employed as the Program Director at the local BSA camps during the summer months;

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

Grew up in Columbus, Ohio.

Works as a chef at [REDACTED].

Is attending Columbus State University then plans to go to Capital University. Major in elementary education and minor in business science and math.

Has a lady friend but she is not a girl friend.

He met [REDACTED], mother of the [REDACTED] involved, as a fellow employee in the Inner-School Scouting program of the Central Ohio Council. Both were paid leaders.

He has served as program director and several other camp positions for Central Ohio Council. He worked at Camp Lazarus for several years.

Has been in Scouting since he was 7 years old and is an Eagle Scout.

In 1981 he was on a camp staff and worked at the National Jamboree.

In 1982 he was assistant aquatics director at camp.

When [REDACTED] were graduating from Webelos to Boy Scouting, he arranged with their mother to "recognize" their achievement by taking the boys to a movie and then to his apartment for an indoor campout. Following this overnight experience the boys were returned to their home. This occurred on June 15, 1989.

In August, 1989 [REDACTED] saw the video tape "A Time to Tell." After viewing the tape she discussed with her sons a report they had given to her concerning Gary Stroup's actions on June 15. Childrens Service Bureau was called. An investigation followed and Gary Stroup was arrested and charged with "Gross Sexual Imposition" on 7 counts.

He relayed to us the statements made in court by [REDACTED]. All indications to us are that these boys did not make up these charges. The pattern is very incriminating—taking 2 eleven year old boys to a movie, returning then to his apartment with no one else present, giving them R rated movies to view on the VCR, allowing them in his bedroom and off his bed to review his patch collection and memorabilia.

Even though he was found "not guilty" by a jury, we feel he should not be permitted registration in the Boy Scouts of America under any circumstances.

He violated the rule of two even though he denied it was a camping trip.

He indicated that he frequently has boys come to his apartment for overnight stays.

Mr. Stroup feels [REDACTED] was jealous of his Scouting abilities. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is also a teacher but is on leave because of some mental problems--these were prior to the incident. An older brother of [REDACTED] attempted suicide a few months prior to this incident.

I am very pleased to inform you that Gary Stroup was acquitted at trial on the allegations that led to the suspension of his registration with the Boy Scouts of America. I have enclosed for your records certified copies of the judicial documents evidencing his acquittal on all charges.

As you may know Mr. Stroup initially faced seven counts alleging improper conduct -- four counts connected with one boy's allegations and three with the other's. All four counts connected with the first boy ([REDACTED]) were dismissed mid-trial by the prosecutor because his testimony was too weak to justify submitting those counts to the jury. The jury returned Not Guilty verdicts on the remaining three counts.

On behalf of Mr. Stroup, I respectfully request that his registration be reactivated and that he be allowed to resume the responsibilities of his employment with the Boy Scouts of America. If there are formal procedures for processing the appeal of Mr. Stroup's suspension, I ask that you send me copies of the regulations governing this procedure so that I may properly represent Mr. Stroup's interest in reactivating his registration.

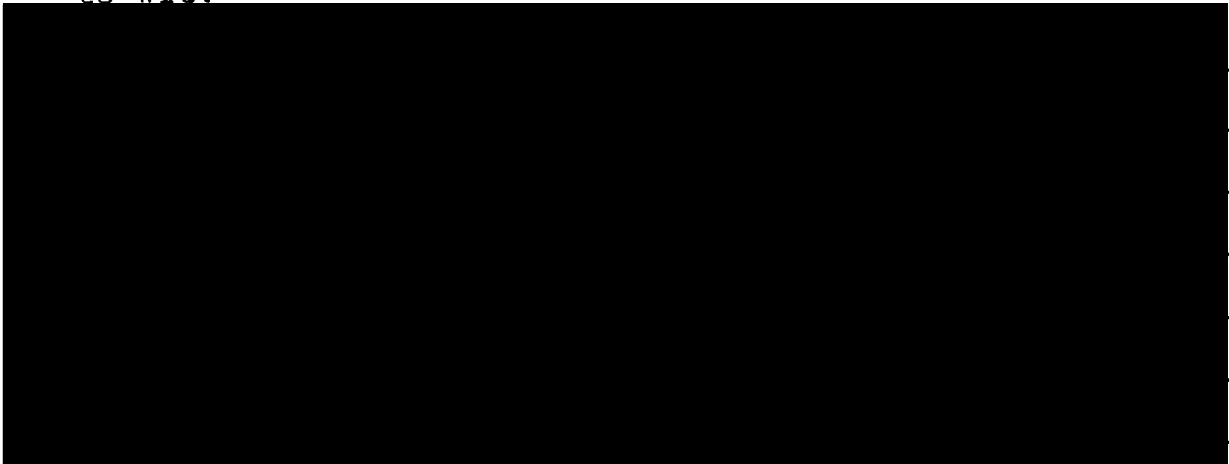

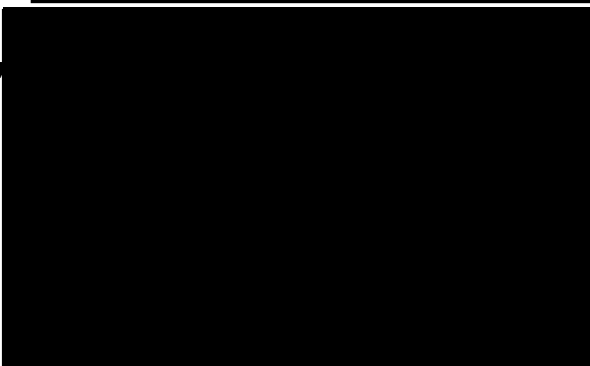
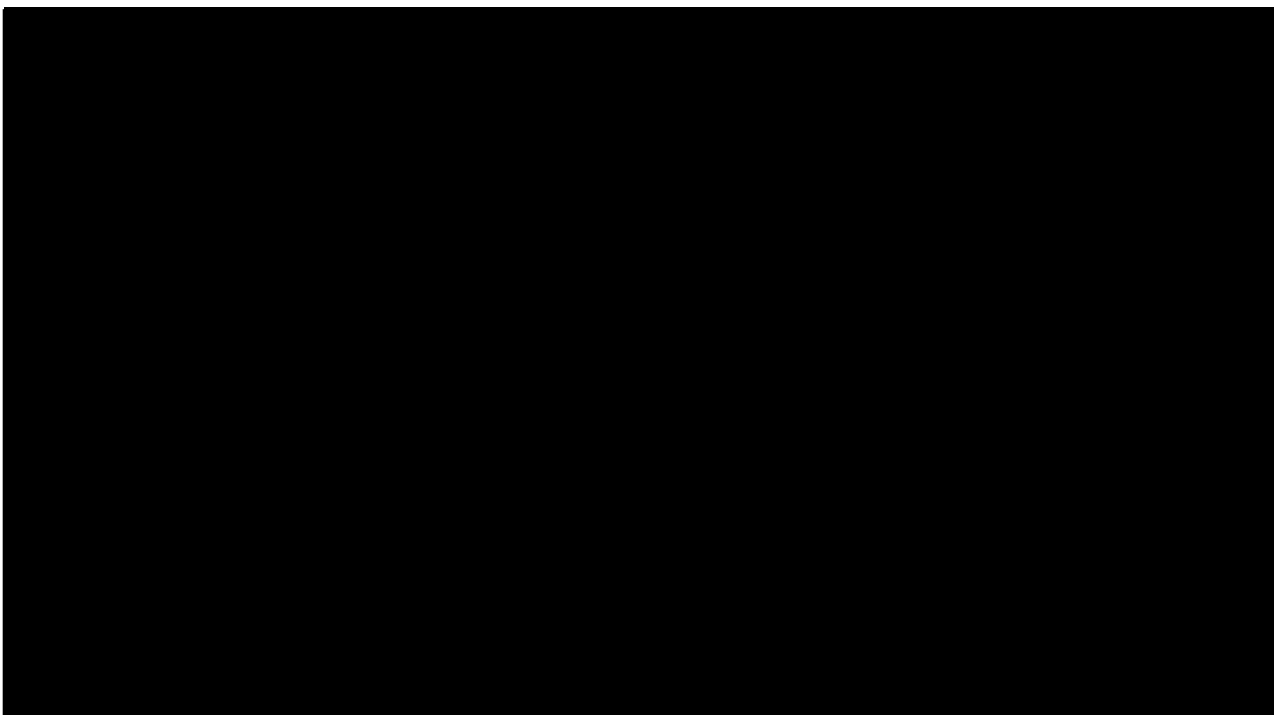

I represent Gary Stroup in connection with the allegations that led to the suspension of his Registration with the Boy Scouts of America. Gary and I are confident that truth will prevail with an acquittal at trial on these false allegations.

Once vindicated in court, Gary will request a reinstatement of his Registration with the Boy Scouts of America. To that end, I request, on his behalf, that the Council review his suspension announced in your letter dated August 23, 1989.

I realize that I am making this request beyond the sixty days from the date of that letter. Please accept my apology on his behalf. Gary long-ago gave me a copy of that letter and I advised him to allow me to respond on his behalf because of the pending criminal charges. My response was delayed by the fact I deemed it necessary to await the arrival of the Prosecutor's Response to my Demand For Discovery filed in the pending criminal case. I received their Response in my office on October 28, 1989.

In your August 23, 1989, letter, you requested that Gary explain his version of the facts supporting his claim that he Registration should be reinstated. Simply stated: he is not guilty. Gary did not mistreat or abuse [REDACTED] in any way whatsoever. Rather, acting on the same sentiments that animated his life-long involvement with the Boy Scouts, Gary went to the movies with these boys in celebration of their graduation from Webelos to the Tenderfoot level. Gary knew [REDACTED] both from Scout camp and through his professional relationship with their mother, [REDACTED], also an employee

Again, on his behalf, I request that you review the suspension of Gary's Registration as a member of the Boy Scouts of America. Perhaps it would be best to await the outcome of the criminal proceedings. However, if you think it is appropriate to conduct the review before the jury trial, please let me know so Gary can avail himself of the opportunity to clear his name.

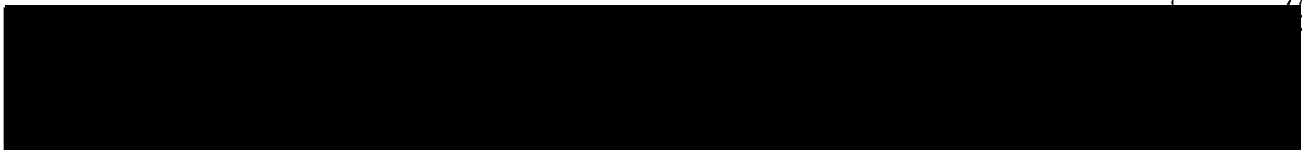




