

Dear Sir:

I am asking that you place the name GARY LaBEAU on our Confidential List of men who are to be no longer registered in Scouting.

Mr. LaBeau has worked at our camp for one year as Waterfront Director and in the past two years as our Camp Director. On Wednesday, July 14, 1971, at 3:00 a.m., I received a call from Mr. LaBeau. His call stated that he had been "set-up" by our Counselor-In-Trainings' in camp. I went directly to camp and interviewed Mr. LaBeau and the boys in question and other camp staff members, all of whom convinced me that they had either had direct contact with Mr. La Beau's homosexual tendencies, or that they had observed or heard about his homosexuality.

I have tapes to the effect that Mr. LaBeau abused his position as Camp Director, and have share some of this proof with our council president, Judge Robert A. Grant. I have confronted Mr. LaBeau with the thought that the Boy Scouts of America could not live with any shadow of suspicion; Mr. LaBeau did not rebut the allegation, and seemed more concerned about his position as Sea Scout Skipper and school teacher. Please advise if you would like these tapes.

Mr. LaBeau is also currently registered as an Explorer Advisor for a Sea Scout Ship in Detroit, Michigan. I have discussed this matter with him; he has agreed to excuse himself from Scouting henceforth. I do, however, think that the Detroit Council should be notified of his name being placed upon that Confidential List so that he will not be embarrassed by Scouters calling upon him and asking him to assist in the program.

Please advise me of any further information you need so that I may comply posthaste.
