We feel we must refuse the registration at this time, because of the incident which have taken place. This certainly would not reflect well on the Boy Scouts of America to have a leader who has been accused of the sexual molestation of scouts.

There can be a review of this situation after the final disposition takes place, if it is felt by Mr. Horton that he has been denied registration unfairly.

ACCUSATIONS AGAINST GARY HORTON

Gary Horton, Assistant Scoutmaster with Troop 14 of Hampton Park Christian Church has been accused of sexually molesting two Scouts on separate occasions in Troop 14, [REDACTED]


Mac Parcell, Scoutmaster of Troop 14 and Dick Ball, Unit Commissioner, informed me on September 12, 1985 that Gary had been confronted by the two of them concerning the accusations. Gary denied the accusations. It was decided that Gary should resign from the Troop for the sake of the Scouts. Gary agreed. I discussed the matter with Tom Broyles.

Apparently [REDACTED] confided in his best friend, also a Scout in Troop 14. The friend told his parents who then contacted [REDACTED] parents. [REDACTED] parents then confronted [REDACTED] who admitted the story to them. [REDACTED] parents then contacted Mac Parcell.

According to Detective Duane Frantz, of the Toledo Police Department, a second boy, [REDACTED], also a Scout in Troop 14, reportedly stated that Gary Horton molested him on a separate occasion. [REDACTED] ran away from home in December 1985 and was picked up by the Children's Services Board. He was questioned and when the subject of homosexuality was brought up, Gary Horton's name was mentioned.

Children's Services called the Toledo Police Department and Detective Duane Frantz of the Personal Assault Division contacted me on January 9, 1986. He stated that neither of the parents, [REDACTED] or [REDACTED], intended to prosecute, but were concerned that Gary Horton not be involved in the Scouting program. He felt that as long as Gary remained out of the Scouting program, no other action would be taken by anyone concerned.

I talked with Tom Broyles and Dick Larimer concerning the matter, and was asked by Dick to record in writing what I had been told.

12 While investigating a burglary, this Officer had the occasion to talk with listed witness, who is listed victim's referee concerning certain crimes that victim had committed. At this time I was advised by witness that in the course of talking with the youth, that he had admitted that he was sexually molested by listed suspect. He requested that I talk with listed PRO and make out an investigation report.

At [redacted] this Officer talked with listed PRO. He indicated that he had talked with victim who stated that two or three months ago while on a boy scout camping trip with listed suspect as the scout leader, he was sleeping in his tent when listed suspect entered, reached in while he was sleeping and fondled victim's penis. Victim also related that a friend of his [redacted] told him that about a year ago on a trip with listed suspect in St. John, Canada, suspect had pulled the youth's pants down and masturbated him, and then requested that the youth do the same to him. As far as the PRO knows, neither of these youths parents are aware of these happenings.
