This is to inform you of two of our adult leaders who have been involved in sexual encounters with our youth members.

The first is Alan Douglas Baker, who as far as we can determine, was registered as a Webelos Leader in both Packs 211 and 99. Upon being made aware of the problem in Pack 211 the other leaders obtained his resignation from Pack 211. Copy enclosed.

Shortly thereafter, we were made aware that he had similar problems in Pack 99 and he was immediately removed from that Pack and our roster. Enclosed are three news stories regarding his situation with the final one on his conviction and sentence.

The second one is Gerald F. Murray, Jr. who was Scoutmaster of Troop 136. Three reports are enclosed describing the incident. Also enclosed is a copy of his letter of resignation as Scoutmaster of Troop 136. He is presently undergoing treatment and the parents of the two boys are not, as we are told, planning any legal actions against him.

With this information I'm sure you will determine their status as far as the confidential file is concerned.

STATEMENT SCHOOLSHING TROOF 136/294. ALTERDATION OF FRIDAY JULY 16, 1982 PREPARED BY: JOHN BLODGETT, CAMP DIRECTOR OCCURANCE AT THE PIONEER SCOUT RECENTATION

t 5:45 A.M. I was awakened at my cabin by Mr. and Mr. They informed me that Mr. Jerry Murray had "molested" one of the scouts in Troop 294. Specifics of said action were then discussed and these comments can be found in the documentation provided by Mr. and Mr. I was informed that Mr. Murray had supposedly attested to these facts and had since left the campsite premisis. I was informed that this action had taken place at about 4:00 A.M. and that the leadership had not brought it to my attention until they felt that the scout in question had satisfactorly calmed his emotions. I was also informed that the parents of this scout had been notified of said action. Upon realizing the potential severity of accusations I informed Mr. and Mr. that I would dress immediately and proceed down to the Units site.

At 6:05 A.M. I notified the Scout Executive, Mr. Richard Larimer at his home of the skatchy details at hand and proceeded to Frontier Headquarters where I met informed me that the scout in question was . Mr. Troop 294. I was made aware that Mr. was with him to assure the young man that nothing was wrong. Mr. stated that he and Mr. upon leaving my cabin proceeded to the front gate and there found Mr. Murray waiting for his wife to pick him up and return him home. It was at this time that I was made aware of the mutual decision of Mr. Mr. Mr. and Mr. that Mr. Murray should be requested to leave the Pioneer Scout Reservation. It was also mentioned at this time that Mr. had advised Mr. Murray to issue his letter of tenure upon his arrival home. Mr. indicated that the Committee Chairman of Troop 136, Mr. Dennis Duszynski, had been notified of the situation and that both he and Mr. would be arriving separetly. Mr. expressed his concern for the other scouts and mentioned that individually and descreatly each scout in both Units would be checked for information. I then informed Mr. of the need for his statement to be placed in writing and he concurred.

Following this discussion I suggested that we proceed to the campsite to check on the scouts and leaders status. Upon leaving Frontier Headquarters we met Mr.

He informed us that was resting and seemed to be reassured.

Mr. then confirmed Mr. testimony and agreed to place his thoughts in writing as well.

With the Scout and leaders now having full control of the situation I advised Mr. The to check with Mr. Murray to see if he might wish to place in writing any thoughts which he might feel pertinent. Upon checking at the gate it was determined that Mr. Murray had departed the property. This was suggested at 6:45 A.M.

At 7:20 A.M. Mr. had a conversation with tent mate admitted to his father that similar actions had also occurred to him during the night. No other Scouts in either Troop indicated any difficulties when they were asked for information.

Mir. arrived at 7:45 A.M. and was appraised of the proceedings. He seemed to be satisfied with the actions taken by the leaders. Both Mr. and Mr. were offered the services of our Camp minister Stan Clark should they see it necessary. Both declined.

At 9:25 A.M. Mr. Duszymski arrived at the Camp. He expressed four concerns, of which only three can be remembered. They are:

- 1.) A concern for the Scout/Couts.
- 2.) A concern for Mr. Murray.
- 3.) A concern for the strength and continuation of Scouting with both Units

Mr. Duszynski expressed his desire for a letter of resignation from Mr. Murray and indicated his willingness to discuss the matter with Mr. Murray upon his return home. Mr. Duszynski did express his interest in having another member of he committee with him during the proposed conversation.

Upon completion of said conversations both Mr. ..., and Mr. provided me with their written affidavit concerning the issue. I contacted the Toledo Area Council office and rediscussed the entire situation with Mr. Larimer. I appraised Mr. Gil Smith, District Executive of the situation and indicated to him that I had suggested that the leaders of both Units work with him upon their return home.

I believe that these are the facts as witnessed.
