# Man arrested after attack of teen-ager

Gerald L. Brown. 38, RR 2, St. Anne, was arrested Wednesday evening for aggravated criminal sexual assault in connection with the rape of a 15-year-old Kankakee girl.

The girl told Kankakee County Sheriff's police that she was raped by a 38-year-old St. Anne man at about 8 p.m. Wednesday at some sand hills near Cable Line Road near Wichert in St. Anne Township.

The attack occurred, the girl told police, after the man told her he was going to stop at a friend's house while en route to St. Anne.

Instead of stopping at the friend's house, he turned into a wooded area, stopped the car and turned off the engine.

The girl said the man then opened the glove compartment of the car and removed a white piece of paper, exposing a leather-like case about 6 inches in length that contained a knife. She said the offender then closed the glove compartment, grabbed her and raped her.

The victim said she had met the man at the home of a relative in St. Anne a few weeks ago and that he gave her a ride on his motorcycle and told her that, if she ever needed a ride, to call him.

The girl said she called him Wednesday evening and asked her to drive her to St. Anne to visit her boyfriend.

The man picked her up in a car at a service station on Court Street near Washington Avenue about 7:30 p.m. and drove her to the Wichert area, where she said she was attacked.

According to the girl, the man told her after the rape that he would give her some money not to tell anyone about the incident but she refused. She said he then dropped her off near the home of one of her relatives in St. Anne.

The boy, arrested at his home in the 100 block of North Greenwood Avenue at 3:11 p.m., is now being held in the Kankakee County Detention Center on \$250,000 bond.

The rape of the St. Anne Township woman Tuesday occurred about the same time that another woman was sexually assaulted in the 500 block of North Washington Avenue by an assailant having the same general description as the 16-year-old boy, according to police.

Kankakee police, however, said the 40-year-old victim in the first incident was not able to get a clear look at her offender.

According to police, the rural St. Anne woman had noticed the door to her mother's home on North Washington Avenue was ajar. When thewoman entered the home to investigate, she was grabbed from behind, dragged into a bedroom and raped.

Kankakee County State's Attorney William Herzog said that the bond on the earlier sexual assault charge was \$15,000. That meant that the boy had to post \$1,500 in cash or property to obtain his release from jail at that time.

# Three arrested in connection with car thefts

### Applicant Procedure for Requesting Review Of Decision Denying Registration

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may if he or she does not agree with the decision request a review from the regional director by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the local council decision.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the regional decision. The decision by the National Council is final.
