On Oct. 21, I entered the apartment of Cerald Reeves with the landlady. Mr. Reeves was not at the apartment at the time. I was at the apartment on company business for the purpose of repossessing a movie projector which we had financed.

What I saw and heard from the landlady was shocking. Several pornographic magazines showing nucle men and young boys. . . . no women were in any of these magazines. There were rolls of movie film in the apartment with no label, so we do not know the content of the film.

The landlady says young boys were always around Mr. Reeves, sometimes in Boy Scout in forms. She says that he has had groups of boys in his apartment showing films and on at least one such occasion was that several of the boys were nude.

This is a serious situation and Mr. Reeves should not be in a position which allows him to corrupt any young boys, and certainly not Boy Scouts!

First Court, Miami, Florida 33150, to Mr. Reeves and another male companion. While Reeves was living in the apartment, many Scout-age boys visited the apartment and often stayed overnight. Reeves moved from the apartment about a month ago. Last week Rev. while opening his own mail, inadvertently opened two pieces of mail addressed to Mr. Reeves. He showed this mail to Bill Hofmann and I, and it is of a pornegraphic nature. It depicts 8, 9 and 10 year old boys in nude scenes. KAN NEWS

of General Electric Acceptance Corporation Today, Mr. called me and said that his company had to repossess some equipment from Mr. Reeves, Mr. Reeves' apartment was full of pornographic material including pictures on the wall and films. The apartment owner was shocked; and also noted that Mr. Reeves on many occasions had Scout-age boys visiting his apartment. The G.E.A.C. personnel who visited the apartment will send us in the next couple of days a letter describing what they found in the apartment.

Granting Commissions and Certificates of Membership

All persons serving in any official relationship with the Boy Scouts of America shall subscribe to the statement of religious principle . . . the Scout Oath and Law, and these Bylaws. Such persons shall be citizens of the United States, or . . . shall have legally declared their intentions to become citizens of the United States, or, in the case of minors, shall take an oath of allegiance to the flag and Government of the United States, or shall satisfy the requirements of Article XVI, Section 6, Clause 4 with respect to visiting adult aliens. Article XVIII, Section

Character Development, Citizenship Training, Mental and Physical Fitness

The purpose of the Corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8, 1910, and restated in the Act of Incorporation enacted by the Congress of the United States of America on June 15, 1916, as follows: "That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use by Boy Scouts." In achieving this purpose, emphasis shall be placed upon its educational program and the oaths, promises, and codes of the Scout program for character development, citizenship training, mental and physical fitness. Article I, Section 2.

Declaration of Religious Principle

The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of citizen without recognizing his obligation to God, In the first part of the Scout Oath or Promise the boy declares, "On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law." The recogmition of Qod as the ruling and leading power in the unitierse and the grateful acknowledgment of His favors and blessings are necessary to the best type of citizenship and pre wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the religious faith of the boy may be, this fundamental mead of good citizenship should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the religious element in the training of the boy, but it ोंs attitude toward that religious training. Its policy is that the home and the organization or institution with which the Subut is. connected shall give definite attention to his relies
