A former Scouter in the South Florida Council recently moved to Marianna, Florida. He has visited our Scout Service Center three times and has written several letters. I have not encouraged his participation in Scouting here because of an off-hand statement I heard in Ft. Lauderdale prior to my move to Alabama from South Florida Council.

The man in question has made a generous offer of 80 acres of land to the Alabama-Florida Council. The offer is in a deed but has some restrictions. One of the restrictions is that he be allowed to come and go at his leisure and be allowed to keep a house trailer on the property as long as he lives.

Upon learning about this restriction along with another in which he specifically requests proper recognition for this gift to Scouting, my council President requested all the information I could gather pertaining to the man's moral character.

If you have pertinent information in your file, which was submitted by the South Florida Council, concerning Guy E. Conkey, III, I'm sure it would be beneficial to us in making a decision as to whether to accept the property. It goes almost without saying he will want to become a board member if the deed is accepted.

New Camp Developed For Scouts

Herald-Tribune Staff Writer

Local Boy Scout and church youth groups have a new camp ground available in north Florida due to the volunteer efforts of the son of a Sarasota couple.

Gay Conkey, whose parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clark T. McConnell, reside at 1131 North Lake Shore Drive, Sarasota, is developing 60 acres of rolling, pine-studded woodland in Jackson County near Marianna as a "youth work facility for church and scout youth dedicated to Christian endeavor."

Conkey, retired as a hospital technician with the rank of Master Sgt. from the U.S. Air Force Hospital at Hurler AFB, offers Boy Scouts and church youth groups free camping privileges on his property. According to Conkey, approximately 100 campers, including two groups from Hurler, have already enjoyed his property.

Conkey, a lay preacher "who witnesses whenever he can," is associated with the First Baptist Church of Marianna as advisor to a young men's organization called the Royal Ambassadors. He said the group of boys aged 12 to 13 function much as a Boy Scout troop with uniforms, regular meetings and organized activities.

Conkey said he first conceived his youth campground, "the culmination of a dream," during Vietnam service from 1963 to 1966, an experience he said "spurred" his decision to establish such a facility.

He purchased the wilderness site four years ago, moving there in a small tent following his retirement one year ago. He now is in the property, which is zoned Rural Residential. At the site, he is just now putting in electric lines to the property, a hand-built kitchen has also stepped for a water supply, and electric generating plant.

He said the property has a two-acre, spring-fed lake and ponds in which live wild life, including deer, turkeys and pheasants, woodpeckers. Since moving in, he has established a well, picnic tables, restrooms, facilities, a rifle and archery range complete with backlogs and nature trails. In many camps, campers enjoying his hospitality pitched in to help develop these facilities, Conkey said.

Conkey has written John C. Dibley of Sarasota, executive director of the Sunny Land Council, Boy Scouts of America, to offer his camping facilities to any local scouting groups that might be in the north Florida area, but Dibley said to his knowledge no local group yet has used the property.

Conkey's property is located near the Oklawaha to Marianna Highway 71 miles north and of Tallahassee, 62 miles south of Marianna, Fla. He told the Herald-Tribune anyone wishing to schedule a visit could telephone him at Area Office, 115, Marianna, Fla., 92422.

Thank you for your September 19 letter regarding Guy E. Conkey III.

You suggest in your letter that the case which has developed around the misconduct of this Scouter is not sufficiently substantiated. If it is absolutely necessary that we get a statement from the boy, I guess both the council and the Scouters involved would choose not to substantiate the case any further.

You should know, however, that the committee chairman of Troop 444, Major [redacted] indicated that he had talked to the boy and the boy had described the liberties which Conkey had taken. Further, Conkey's friend and counselor, [redacted], indicated to me here in the office that Conkey had admitted deviations from the norm in this act.

I'm attaching the form which you sent. I hope that along with this information it will be of assistance. Please let me know if there's anything further we can or should do.


On several occasions we have talked with Agnes Fagan regarding an incident that took place at our camp this past summer, involving Guy E. Conkey, III., who is registered in Troops 55 and 444. Subsequent to the incident, which incidentally is outlined in the attached documentation, I have personally looked into this and I am convinced that Guy Conkey is not fit to be a leader in Scouting. Guy is not a violent individual, but he's certainly questionable in his relationship with boys.

A local Scouter by the name of [REDACTED] and a friend of Conkey, has been in to see me regarding the character of Guy Conkey. On all occasions I indicated to him that no decision has been made as to what we would be doing as a council related to Conkey's registration. [REDACTED] has suggested that Conkey seek psychiatric help, which according to [REDACTED] he has done.

It is my understanding Major [REDACTED] chairman of Scout Troop 444, that the boy has indicated to him that Conkey was "doing more than wrestling" during the incident. [REDACTED] has indicated to me that Conkey has said to him that he had taken liberties with the boy of a sexual nature.

Paul, I have attached the documentations we have in the office regarding this case. If further information is needed, please don't hesitate to write or call.

THE FOLLOWING IS A STATEMENT REFLECTING THE ACTIONS OF TWO STAFF MEMBERS, A SCOUTMASTER AND SCOUT IN AN INCIDENT THAT OCCURRED AT CAMP SEBRING ON JULY 5, 1973.

On the fifth of July at 7:30 P.M. I was approached by two camp staff members- [REDACTED]-concerning a possible homosexual activity they had just witnessed. Both staff members appeared emotionally upset as they related to me the following information:

Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had just finished an Indian Pagenant dance practice and were walking past the Camp Chapel to the Rifle Range. They were attracted by sounds coming from behind the Camp Chapel. Upon investigation they saw a scoutleader (Mr. Guy Conkey) and a scout [REDACTED] kneeling on the ground. Their curiosity aroused, they investigated further and found Mr. Conkey lying on his back with his legs wrapped around [REDACTED] (Both Mr. Conkey and [REDACTED] were fully clothed and remained so throughout this entire incident.) Mr. Conkey was observed holding onto [REDACTED] buttocks with both hands. He was also seen moving his hand toward his own genital area several times. No exposure of the genitals was observed however. Mr. Conkey was then seen to kiss the boy. Shocked by this type of action, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] retreated in two different directions. In their haste they made noise and alerted Mr. Conkey of their presence. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] quickly joined together and, upon reaching the Campfire Arena, looked back and saw Mr. Conkey and [REDACTED] some 100 feet back, walking toward them. (It was at this time that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] began looking for me.)

After finding me and relating their story, I instructed them to stay in camp while I approached Mr. Conkey concerning the matter. Until now I had never met Mr. Conkey. He seemed very meek, shy, and very apologetic as I confronted him with the information previously told me. He denied everything. His version of what happened is the following:

██████████ was upset at not being able to participate in the Aquatics Carnival. To soothe his feelings, Mr. Conkey took ██████████ to the Chapel area to pray briefly and to console him. To pickup ██████████ spirits, Mr. Conkey offered to take him on a brief Nature walk. After the walk, Mr. Conkey and ██████████ engaged in a "fun" wrestling match which eventually attracted ██████████ and ██████████ as they were passing the Chapel area.

(Because of the differences in their stories, I called a special meeting at which the four of us attended.) At this meeting each version was presented. Again the accused (Mr. Conkey) denied the charge. Council was called to determine in which direction to go. (It was approximately 11:00 P.M. when this call was made to Mr. T.J. VanHouten.) Mr. VanHouten was notified for two reasons: 1. Normally the Council Executive would be called first but Council was in the process of an Executive changeover, and 2. Mr. Conkey knew Mr. VanHouten personally and requested that he be notified of the matter. (Mr. Conkey was extremely nervous at this time and I felt it best, for all concerned, to recognize his request.)

On callback from Council, it was suggested that an official statement of the incident be taken. The Highlands County Sheriff's Department was called. Two police officers arrived- Officer Terry Wolfe and an assistant. Officer Wolfe questioned ██████████ ██████████ and Mr. Conkey, in that order. Once again Mr. Conkey denied all charges made by ██████████ and ██████████.

(At this time a second police car arrived.) The boy involved [REDACTED], up to now, was not involved in the proceedings. The officers felt he should now be brought in for questioning. [REDACTED] was brought in from his campsite and questioned by the four officers. The questioning lasted approximately 20 minutes, and was conducted in private, ie, just [REDACTED] and the four officers. Following the questioning, I was called over by the officers and informed that [REDACTED] had completely agreed with Mr. Conkey's story. They said they each questioned [REDACTED] (often asking him the same question but phrasing it differently) and in their opinion he was telling the truth. The officers then suggested that since a stalemate condition existed they felt it best to stop the investigation for the evening. (It was then 2:30 A.M.) They said that a team of two Department investigators would be shown the statements the following morning. If these investigators felt that further investigation should be made, they would return at that time. They did not return.

The following day Council informed me that they felt it best that Mr. Conkey leave camp as soon as possible. I informed Mr. Conkey of this request. He complied-leaving camp Friday evening, July 6th.

Thursday night, after a practice for the Friday night Indian Pageant, I along with [redacted] observed Guy Conkey with a scout headed towards a trail which leads to the Rifle Range. Knowing that the rifle range was closed my suspicion grew because I don't know of any other reason to use the trail. [redacted] & I went down the trail to find Guy Conkey & the scout. I noticed them behind the chapel. I told [redacted] We both ran past the two and down to the rifle range on a fire lane that Guy Conkey & the scout were standing on. When [redacted] & I reached the rifle range we looked back to see the two. They were not there and I couldn't figure where they had gone for there was only scrub land surrounding them. [redacted] & I backtracked to find them. I noticed Guy Conkey & the young scout in an area surrounded by scrub. I pointed them out to [redacted]. We went to a better located area to see what was going on. Guy Conkey was laying on his back in white sand and the scout was lying on top of him face-down. Guy Conkey had his legs brought close to his body and at first the two appeared to be wrestling. I saw Guy Conkey moving his hands down & putting them on the scout's rear-end. They rolled to their sides with Guy Conkey's back to us. I noticed Guy Conkey's arm between the two down at the genital area. A couple minutes later they rolled back to their first position, again Guy Conkey put his hands on the scout's rear-end.

then I saw Guy Conkey put his hand between
the scout's legs up at the crotch with Guy Conkey's
fingers being seen from the back of the scout's.
They stopped, got up, brushed each other off at
which time [redacted] I left in opposite directions.
I watched Guy Conkey & the scout as I walked
for a few more minutes, then was out-of-sight distance.
[redacted] & I got back together & saw Guy Conkey &
the scout again walking to the waterfront. We
then reported to [redacted] (camp director).

If Guy Conkey & the scout were wrestling,
why in sand & why in an area where no one
would see them unless they knew that Guy Conkey
& the scout were there. Also I have wrestled for
high school for 4-years, and I could not consider
them wrestling.
