
The purpose of this letter is to document the circumstances under which you received the resignation of Mr. J. W. Weeks in the latter part of October, 1969.

On October 15, 1969, it was brought to my attention, by my sor, that certain advances had been made toward him on the night of October 10, 1969 at the District Camparee by one J. W. Weeks, at that time Scoutmaster of Troop 1111. I informed man, my son, at that time of the severity of this charge and the effect such in accusation would have on the man's life, family, church, etc. and he still persisted in the charge. He also told me of some other alleged advances on some other boys in the troop. I checked this out with the father of one boy whom I knew and through questioning, found the allegation to be true.

Mr. an Assistant Scoutmaster in our troop, who is subsequently informed, then made a call on a local psychiatrist who told us something of the behavior pattern of such a person. After consulting with this doctor, we then informed the Chairman of our troop committee. And the other two Assistant Scoutmasters of the charges. A meeting was then held wherein we informed these people of what had transpired. At this meeting, it was concluded that (1) we would inform no other man within the committee, (2) we would and did inform scout headquarters through Mr. and (3) that Mr. and myself would confront Mr. Weeks with the charge and evidence of his homosexual behavior and request his resignation in writing.

The confrontation with Mr. Weeks was then made on October 20, 1969, resulting in his full admission to the charges and we received his resignation. At the same time Mr. Weeks not only stated that the charges were true but also added that he had been aware of his homosexual tendencies for 40 years and sad sought and received medical help in the past. Mr. then defivered Mr. Weeks' resignation to you during the following week.
