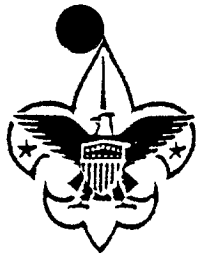


Please note, however, that I am including an updated list of adult leaders for which I am requesting the mentioned information on.

In review of some of the articles in recent issues of your magazine *Scouting*, I feel compelled to write and express my disappointment in the direction in which Boy Scouts of America (BSA) has chosen to pursue relating to the very real problem created by present day child abuse issues. It appears to the naive that BSA is taking an aggressive and logical approach to these issues.¹

As the observant will be aware, BSA is only creating an illusion of performing what they claim. The above referenced article states: "...the background and references of anyone who volunteers for a leadership position in Scouting must be thoroughly checked out before he is accepted." In my own instance, as well as others that I am personally aware of, BSA is not "checking," beyond that of contacting the chartering organization who is registering the prospective leader in the first place. The surface appearance of the above statement is that BSA is accepting some responsibility for verifying the character of those who apply. This pretext is not true, nor is it a requirement as the article suggests; my own pack leaders acceptance's demonstrate this fact. Along with several others, I refused to sign the application form when I organized the pack of which I am Committee Chairman. I am aware of this happening in other units as well.

Anyone who would sign a release statement to "...release and hold harmless from liability any person...that provides information..."² without first confirming what that information is, is not worthy of being a scout leader in the first place. Those who do, cannot understand the civil rights principles that this country is founded on well enough to teach our young people anything worthwhile about them.

As the above article mentions: "... A two-part BSA leadership application,³ elicits specific background information and references that are useful to the chartered organization in evaluating prospective leaders." The key phrase in this quoted sentence is "useful to the chartered organization." From these half-hearted attempts by BSA, it becomes quite clear that BSA is more concerned in "passing the buck" than in accepting responsibility for those who are it's adult leaders.

Soliciting this background information on an individual (and then passing on the responsibility to someone else to evaluate the prospective candidate) is irresponsible and a violation of many of the principles that I was raised to believe that BSA stood for.

As a committee chairman within the BSA organization, I am disappointed that BSA would maintain a confidential file on its adult leaders. (See the above article.) However, in that they do, I want a copy of this file on each of the adult leaders listed on the attached list (those whom my pack does, or may utilize as adult leaders). In light of the wording of the release of information that is in the adult application, I will feel compelled to contact these people and verify any of the information that is given me by BSA. Further, if in the future, any unsuitable behavior comes to light regarding any of my adult leaders (up to this point in time) that I could have prevented by being privy to what may be in these "confidential files" that BSA holds, it will be my intention to hold BSA accountable for not having already released these files to me--in their entirety.

Somehow, it seems totally inappropriate that BSA would have "confidential" files on leaders and not be advising the chartering organization of the content of these files, particularly when it is this same chartering organization whom BSA suggests is the responsible party for making decisions about the acceptance of the prospective leader. Whatever happened to honesty and integrity?

In BSA's tools to aid in identification of the molester, they would teach the child to recognize¹ that those who would be molesters, approach a child seductively, with "attention and affection" and these gradually turn sexual in nature. They further caution (in this article) that this person is "... most often ... a member of the family, ... a school teacher, police officer, physician, youth leader--in short anyone who would seem a most unlikely suspect." What BSA neglects to say is that anyone who is loving, caring, attentive or truly cares about children, fits this description of a possible molester.

If BSA's advice is followed, we would be teaching our children to be fearful of anyone who would provide the nurturing and support that all children need to grow into well adjusted adults.

The advice that BSA gives is negative. Instead of teaching families to love, respect, care for one another, or to watch out for one another, this policy teaches fear, mistrust, and resistance to what should be open and honest care and concern for one another within one's family unit.


BSA's articles advise teaching the child to "report." If the proper background has been established within the family it is totally unnecessary for someone to be teaching a child to "report."

The child will have long since established the support structure between parent and child, so that the communication needed will happen as a matter of course. The intimate relationship between family members cannot be taught after the fact, particularly by a third party. It has to be developed over a period of time, based on positive attitudes, respect, and trust within the family unit. It is terribly unfortunate for those whose families have not established these relationships. However unfortunate, it still cannot be done by someone else, no matter how well intended. The end result is confusion and further destruction of the family which is already weak because these things have not been taught. This behavior that BSA espouses ultimately damages the very family that it is (supposed to be) designed to help!

At one time, I was proud that my oldest son is an Eagle Scout. I had intended to encourage my second son to strive towards attaining what I felt was an honorable and prestigious rank. I am sorry to state that I do no longer hold BSA in this position of esteem. BSA's behavior has demonstrated to me that even BSA has their price. In an attempt to divorce themselves from a sticky issue, they have attempted to insulate and protect themselves from the issue of child abuse, instead of vigorously and actively attempting to support the needs of the children of this country.

I would encourage BSA to change their response to these issues, to get involved and work at creating positive experiences for the family and to provide support and encouragement, instead of attempting to distract from the real needs of this generation's children.

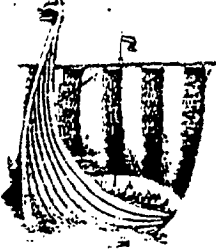

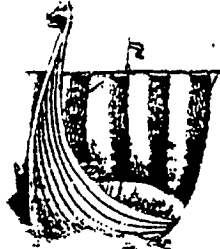

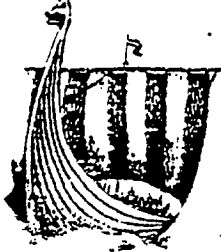

The undersigned is an attorney who represents Jack Tibbetts. Enclosed with this letter is the application of Jack Tibbetts for the Boy Scouts of America. This application has been fully completed by Jack Tibbetts. The waiver that you are requesting on the application of liability for persons supplying you with information seems to encourage false and defamatory statements leaving the applicant without any legal recourse. Because false statements have been made about Jack Tibbetts that resulted in a court settlement prohibiting that individual from divulging any information about Jack Tibbetts, Jack Tibbetts cannot agree to the release and hold harmless language contained in the application. Should that individual, in violation of a court order, divulge information from Jack Tibbetts, Jack Tibbetts must be free to pursue his legal remedies.
