
SCOUTS SAY THEY STAND BY THEIR RELIGIOUS DECLARATION

MACON, GA., Nov., --- The Boy Scouts of America said here today that it cannot accept the application of a Georgia man who seeks to become a Cub Scout leader but who declines to accept the religious tenets of the national youth organization.

Kenneth S. Saladin, Ph.D., of Milledgeville, has been notified by Central Georgia Council Scout Executive James H. Sawyer that "only those individuals who are willing to subscribe to (the Boy Scouts') fundamental precepts may become members." Sawyer's response follows return of the application to the local council by the BSA national headquarters.

Saladin, who says he is a secular humanist, sought to have his application approved with a disclaimer statement "explicitly rejecting" BSA's Declaration of Religious Principle.

The declaration, contained in the organization's Charter and Bylaws, says, in part, that "The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no member can grow into the best kind of citizen without recognizing an obligation to God." The BSA, the declaration continues, "acknowledges the religious element in the training of the member, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that religious training."

SCOUT REGULATIONS

"On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country..."

If you are a Boy Scout, or if you have ever been a Scout, that pledge is stamped permanently in your memory. It's been recited by tens of millions of Scouts and their leaders for 77 years.

Ken Saladin wants to be a Cub Scout leader in Milledgeville but he won't agree to that pledge, or to a similar one required of leaders. He says he is an atheist and he objects to the reference to God in the pledges. He says that if he is booted as a scout leader, he may go to court.

Mr. Saladin has every right to believe-- or not believe-- as he pleases. But he has no right to force his beliefs on the Scouts by attacking their creeds.

The Boy Scouts of America is not a governmental agency. They have every right to set standards for their members and leaders. As with any other organization, if you disagree with the rules, you don't have to join. The Scouts also have the right to refuse to accept you if you refuse to accept their rules.



THE HEARING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED FOR 16 NOVEMBER 1987. DISCUSSED, THE COMMITTEE HAS ASKED ME TO ADDRESS SEVERAL PROCEDURAL ISSUES AS FOUND UNDER APPENDIX D TO THE PAMPHLET ON SEXUAL ABUSE. PURSUANT TO YOUR INSTRUCTIONS, MR. SAVARD WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CONFRONT THE WITNESSES WHO HAVE PREVIOUSLY TESTIFIED TO THE COMMITTEE ON BEHALF OF THE BOY SCOUTS. SAVARD WILL BE ALLOWED TO PRESENT WITNESSES AT THE HEARING ON HIS OWN BEHALF. MR. SAVARD SUGGESTS HE MAY HAVE ANYWHERE FROM 60 TO 200 WITNESSES. AT YOUR SUGGESTION, WE WILL WRITE A LETTER INFORMING MR. SAVARD UNLESS HE CAN DEMONSTRATE THAT ADDITIONAL PEOPLE COULD PROVIDE NEW AND RELEVANT INFORMATION TO THE COMMITTEE, HE SHOULD RESTRICT HIS WITNESS LIST TO SIX TO EIGHT OF THOSE WITNESSES WHOM HE DEEMS TO BE MOST IMPORTANT.

Dear Mr. Pigott:

I am writing this letter to you as one volunteer to another. I am asking for help. I quite frankly am desparate for any kind of help that I can get.

You will find enclosed with this letter four letters I have recieved from Ed Weiseth, our Council Executive. Ed Weiseth has revoked my Boy Scout registration. I have not been given any formal charges justifying this revocation, nor have I been given any of the supporting reasons for the charges. I have appealed the revocation.

The other three letters deal with the appeal process which I am now engaged in. This entire revocation and appeal process seems to be a total aberration from my past 32 years in scouting. In short, in those 32 years I have always sold the Boy Scout of America to everyone I have been involved with as an organization that taught young men about truth, justice, honesty, and fair play.

For the first time in my life I see the Boy Scouts of America engaging in unfair, unethical, unAmerican activities. They seem to be doing so with wilfull, ruthless efficiency. In short, it appears as though I am to furnish witnesses to a hearings board, but I don't know what the charges are so I don't know which witnesses to get. I won't be told what the charges are until I get in front of the hearings board, I'm not even sure I get to testify before the hearings board now Ed Weiseth has said my people are not guaranteed the right to testify. This is going to be something of a hardship since some of those who could be witnesses are going to come a substantial distance to testify on my behalf.

To be absolutely fair to Ed Weiseth he has told me orally that it involves my association with two named individuals. However, he has refused to put that in writing or even to state what there is about that association with these named individuals that is a problem. You will find enclosed my first response letter and supplemental response letter I have sent to the hearings board.

The Boy Scouts of America have remained absolutely silent

about what I am supposed to have done or not done. However, several other Boy Scout officials at the Council level on down to Scoutmaster level seem to have found out that I have either been suspended, or fired, or revoked. They even appear to have more information than I do. These people when they seek confirmation from one of the professional scouters at our Council are referred directly to me. I have been showing them the letters I have received from the Crater Lake Council signed by Ed Weiseth. This process is beginning to generate a great deal of animosity against the Boy Scout organization and against the professional scouters. I have to be candid I also am beginning to feel that same kind of animosity.

It seems as though the concept of fair play has been lost to the Boy Scouts of America and they seem to be conducting a witch hunt and purge using the tactics perfected by Heinrich Himmler and the gestapo.

I would like to ask you to use your influence to make some changes in the perceived Boy Scout policy. I think if your registration is going to be revoked you ought to be told why in a timely fashion so you can have a fair hearing. This doesn't seem like too much to ask. People who receive parking tickets are at least told why the government thinks you ought to pay a parking fine. I'm not even being afforded the privileges of an over-time parked car.

The dissolusionment that is setting in with me and many other scouters who have asked me for an explanation, I believe can be quite damaging to the scout movement in the Roaring Rogue district and the Crater Lake Council. It also may be very damaging to the Boy Scout image nationwide. It also is as though the Boy Scouts of America (bureaucracy) is seeking to protect itself no matter what the cost to the program for the boys, the adult scouters, and other people involved. There is a smell about this entire affair that seems very, very strong.

I am asking your help to review this procedure.

Dear Sir,

Jim Savard has shared with me letters from Ed Weiseth dated September 14, 17 and October 7, 16, 1987 terminating Mr. Savard's relationship with scouting. While it is plain from reading the September 14th letter that certain events preceded this series of letters it strikes me as unusual that Scouts would have a procedure that in essence makes a person "quilty" before any hearing and prevents him from learning the exact nature of any charges or complaints or who brought any claims against him.

I understand in situations involving moral turpitude in regard to Scouts it would be appropriately desireable to protect the identity of minor accusers but in any other situations if there is a charge leveled it should be brought out openly with opportunity to address or confront the facts and those bringing charges.

It appears the procedures followed in this case amount to a kangaroo court with no real regard for careful researching of facts. The steps Scouts have takes have caused great turmoil amoung our Troop leadership and has damaging implications for any adult involved in Scouting leadership. These actions have the possibility of destroying the reputation of an honorable man. Therefore the procedures followed need to be carefully established and fairly applied.



You will be informed at the outset of the hearing the specific reasons for, and the facts in support of, the revocation of your registration.

To the Investigating Board:

I have been asked by Jim Savard to make some comment to the Board about Jim's involvement with a Craig L. Williams and a Ken Drury. I was asked to keep my comments limited to these two people, the Boy Scout Movement and especially Troop 22's meetings, gatherings, etc.

In regards to Craig Williams, I simply do not know this person. I have not seen or met a Craig Williams to my best recollection. I have been involved with Troop 22 since 1974 and cannot recall ever having a Scout or adult in the Troop by that name, nor do I recall ever being introduced to this person.

As for Ken Drury. I do know this person and have know him for over ten years. I met him thru my involvment with the Order of the Arrow. He is an extremely large individual and therefore difficult to forget. Ken Drury, as I recall, visited Troop 22 meetings at GPHS on one possibly two occasions during the summer or early fall of 1986. I remember him dropping off camping equipment (shovels, axes, tents, water bottles, etc.). He was never at the actual meeting, he simply delivered equipment to the meeting site (English Gym, GPHS).

I am aware that Ken Drury stayed at Jim Savard's home on occasion. I remember that he was at Jim's home in September of 1986 as the Troop held a Court of Honor at Jim's home. I showed up early and Ken was cleaning out the area in the basement where he stayed. I do not recall seeing him at the actual Court of Honor although he may have been present at the Court as he was a house guest of Jim's but he was not invited to the Court of Honor itself. This was the last time I saw Ken Drury at Jim's and the last time I saw Ken Drury at any Troop 22 function. Because of his general absence from Troop 22 functions from the Fall of 1986, Ken's reappearance around Jim Savard anytime after the early Fall of 1986 is much more notable.

Jim Savard coordinates the communities Christmas Basket program which is a joint venture of many community organizations. Jim supervises the collection of food from several different community groups, sorts this food into individual food baskets and then has the food baskets distributed the the needy in the county. Generally speaking, a lot of this activity takes place at the English Gym, GPHS. Troop 22 did participate, and helped sort the food into baskets during one its regular meeting days in December of 1986. I recall seeing Ken Drury at the English Gym, helping with the food baskets, he was not there with the Boy Scouts nor did he have contact with them as I worked closely with the Boy Scouts as they helped with the food baskets, Ken seemed aloof and stayed in the background.

I last saw Ken Drury at, not in, Jim Savard's house in the Spring of 1987. I had stopped by to drop something off and remember that Jim was out of town at the time. Ken said that he was leaving a note for Jim. We were the only ones there at the time and I believe that he was gone by the time I finished unloading the equipment that I had come to deliver.

Dear Chairman and Members of the Crater Lake Council Review Board:

I wish to supplement the letter that I wrote to Ed Weiseth asking for the hearing. In that letter I discussed what I knew about Craig Williams and Ken Drury. I have had the opportunity to review more carefully the sequence of events. In my review I had to make some assumptions which I will make clear as this supplemental statement progresses.

I have also gathered some letters from other people that would have knowledge about the events that are involved in this hearing. I have attached them to this letter as exhibits. I have further documents that are coming but that I have not revieved as of this point in time. I will provide them when I have recieved them.

I have assumed that I am accused of allowing Craig Williams and Ken Drury to associate with Boy Scouts when I knew that they had been charged or convicted of sex crimes. I have not recieved anything in writing regarding this charge. I have been orally advised of something similar to what is explained above.

If I have not recalled exactly what Ed Weiseth told me I appologize. I wish that I had been furnished something in writing to assist me in helping the review board. I hope that the committee understands that the letters from Ed Weiseth which are attached as exhibits I and 2 were supplemented with his oral statements which I did not write down at the time. The letters were quite a shock and it has taken me some time to recover mentally.

In regards to Craig Williams, I know of three Craig Williams. I am assuming that the accusations made by Ed Weiseth are about Craig Williams who was a student at GPHS. He graduated in 1979. I saw him during the school years while he was a student. After his graduation I saw him only sporadically and for short periods of time. In the last several years I have seen him only three times.

The first time was during the Christmas Basket program of 1985. He helped as a volunteer putting together Christmas Baskets for the needy. I don't recall him having anything to do with the Boy Scout Movement. The second time was a meeting in October of 1986 when Craig Williams came down to Grants Pass and participated in a Centennial Meeting for Grants Pass High School. The meeting lasted two hours and Craig left to go back to Portland. The last time I saw Craig was during mid December of 1986. He popped into my office at the high school and I asked him if he was going to help with Christmas Baskets again this year. He said no and that he did not have the time. My phone rang, I turned to answer it and when I turned back he was gone. The entire conversation would have lasted only three minutes.

This is all that I can recall about post high school contacts with Craig Williams. I have asked several other adults including Ken Drury to see if Craig Williams had any contact with my house or with the Scout Troop. No one knows of Craig Williams or recalls seeing him in or around me or Troop 22 in any fashion except as is set forth above.

I have through some confidential sources found out that Craig Williams has been convicted of a sex crime. A copy of the judgement order is attached as Exhibit 3. Please note that the conviction appears to have taken place in Court in February, 1987 and the judgement of conviction took place in My, 1987. I have learned this information only by diligent personal effort in October, 1987. You will find enclosed as exhibit 4 a letter from Craig William's mother. She has stated that her son has not been around the Grants Pass area at all. I also contacted Craig Williams in the Portland area. He has told me that except for the contact set forth above he has not been to see me at school or at my house. He has not been around me in any fashion at all. He told me he was trying to comply with the probation restrictions on contact with minor children.

Craig Williams informed me that his probation officer had asked him several questions about being in or around my house or in or around minor children. These questions were recently asked. He has no idea why anyone would think that he was coming down to see me or have any contact with me. I also will add that I don't either.

If this is the wrong Craig Williams then I am completly in the dark as to the nature of this problem regarding my association with a Craig Williams.

In regards to Ken Drury I don't believe there is very much doubt as to whom the individual is. Based upon the assumption that the Ken Drury who was awareded the Arrow of Honor from the Order of the Arrow in 1982 and recieved a thankyou note from Ed Weiseth in 1986 for an SME donation are one and the same I offer the following additional information. Ken Drury has promised to sign an affidavitt which is currently in the process of being returned to me. When I recieve the affidavitt I will forward the same to the Board.

Sometime in the Fall of 1986 probably in late October I was informed by Ed Weiseth that Ken Drury was charged with a crime involving moral turpitude. I was told by Ed Weiseth and Ron Jones who was present that Ken Drury was to have no more contact with the Boy Scouts of America. Took that to mean Troop 22 and other Scout activities. At the very next time I saw Ken Drury I informed him that he was to have no more contact with Troop 22 in anyway whatsoever and that he was not to deal with Scouts in any fashion. I also informed him that since some of the meetings were at my house that when the occasion occured I would ask him to leave. I tried to give him as much advance warning as possible so that he was not there. I believe that he went to the high school to sort paper.

I also took two other steps. These steps were premised on the fact that Ed Weiseth's statements about Ken Drury recalled to mind that he had been involved with furnishing liquor to a minor. I at this time had no written confirmation from anyone concerning Ken's problem.

I immediately took steps to monitor and limit Ken Drury's activities at GPHS. Ken Drury had the recycling paper pick up contact with the high school. He had this contract for about two and one half years. We had no complaint about his contract work. I immediately began to limit Ken Drury's paper recyling effort to a limited time frame. I limited his activities at the high school. I believe I was successful in doing this without arousing his suspicion.

I decided that since I was going to monitor Ken Drury until a resolution of the new criminal charges could be complete, I would allow him to stay at my house so that I would know when he was in the area. I made no secret about this and believe that I indicated this to the professionals of the Council. I did not have enough solid information to terminate Ken Drury's contract on the unsubstantiated but sincere belief of Ed Weiseth that Ken Drury had a moral turpitude charge.

The second step was to begin looking for someone to take over the recycling contract. I had decided that Ken Drury's contract would not be renewed at the end of the school year. Ken had already mentioned thatthe amount of paper to sort was getting larger than what he had originally bargained for. Ken Drury had started out taking paper on a once a quarter basis. The time involvement and volume had grown to the extent that Ken Drury was coming down here once a month.

In mid January or so I had reason to review in a formal manner all of the new restrictions with Ken. These restrictions included staying out of the school except for the recycling room and my office. Staying out of the ahllways and classrooms. Scheduling his time at the high school so as to have the least contact with students. Such as Sunday or Saturday sorting and late night work. There was something in his manner in accepting these restrictions and in talking about a driving offense charge (driving while suspended) that was pending in the local court that made me really become concerned about the moral turpitude charge. I decided to check on Ken Drury myself.

In the latter part of January, 1987 Ken Drury showed up at the high school to process and sort paper. He arrived at the same time that a Grants Pass reserve officer was teaching a finger printing merit badge class. I recalled Ed Weiseths brief admonition and instructions and stayed at the meeting. (The adults were picking up goodwill bags and I was supposed to go with them but did not) I kept Ken Drury in the paper recycling room and away from the Scout meeting. I kept the Scouts at the merit badge class and from wandering around the building.

I learned from sources outside of Scouting that Ken Drury was convicted in November, 1982 of a sex crime. I also learned that he had not been charged with furnishing liquor to a minor and that he had no pending criminal charge except for the traffic offense mentioned above. I realized that Ken Drury had been lying to me and to several other Scouters about his past. Shortly after I made my discovery the principal

claims to have received an annonymous phone call giving him the exact date and charge of this crime. The principal and I agreed that Ken Drury would have to terminate his relationship with Grants Pass High School.

I spoke with Ken Drury at the first possible opportunity. That is when he confessed to me that he had misled me about the charge. I told him that I could not in my position as the Dean of Students have any contact with him. I gave him one day to clean up his stuff (on Sunday) from the recycling room.

I have not had any direct contact with Ken Drury until this suspension began. I believe that he stayed at my house one night while I was gone in April. This I believe was in relation to a court date on the traffic matter. I was not present at the house and I was out of town. (I found a brief note from Ken to this effect.)

I realize that the Boy Scouts of America would have a right to be concerned about my continued contact with Ken Drury especially after Ed Weiseth's conversation in the fall of 1986. However, I am not a paid adult Scouter, I am a volunteer. I have a regular full time job being Dean of Students at Grants Pass High School. I am required to come into contact with all kinds of people with all kinds of criminal records. I also am charged with chaperoning several on going student activities and I also more than many other adults work hard at supporting student activities and lending my home to many of these activities. Those activities include student council, class governments, IRL-MUN, MDA, and others. I also can not like a private organization fire or terminate government contracts without a substantial basis. I did not obtain a substantial basis to terminate Ken Drurys contract with the high school and me until late February, 1987.

I believe from conversations with Ken Drury and my own regarding Ken Drury that if several events that should have taken place had been carried out at the appropriate time then none of this would have happened. I wish to illustrate my points as follows:

- 1. Ken Drury was convicted in 1982. Ken Drury believed that he was unofficially black balled by the Oregon Council Executives at that time. Ed Weiseth was not at Oregon Council Executive at that time. Someone should have informed the National Office to terminate his involvement with Scouting.
- 2. John "Pat" Patterson took part in evicting Ken Drury from a summer camp in 1983. (Most likely because of his 1982 conviction.) When John "Pat" Patterson saw Ken activitily involved in a Scout function as in the 1986 OA conclave he should have informed the leadership immediately so that steps could have been taken to remove Ken at that point in time.

His continued presence without official complaint from John "Pat" Patterson or any display of concern by professional scouters present served notice to many people that Ken Drury's involvement in Scouting was acceptable and welcome. Paul Clute of Silverton was still trying to obtain along with the help of Al Jakes a professional Scouter the Woodbadge beads that Ken had earned.

- 3. Ed Weiseth in his conversations with me in the fall of 1986 did not to my recollection show me any charges. Never did I see anything in writing. The failure to state in writing begs the human memory's imperfect ability to recall. Also the failure to ascertain the exact charge left me in doubt until my own investigation turned it up.
- 4. The failure of the Boy Scouts of America to clearly establish a policy on the restrictions that an association related to one's own employment will govern one's membership in the Boy Scouts of America. The failure of the Boy Scouts of America to publicize that policy so that Scouters will understand what the rules are. If it had been made clear to me that any association with Ken Drury not just association with Ken Drury in regards to the Boy Scouts would subject me to dismissal from the Boy Scouts I would have taken steps to limit my contact with him further.

To Whom It May Concern:

I have known Jim for about four years and have lived in his home since February of 1987. Over the last four years and especially these last eight months, I've observed in Jim Savard such a noteworthy character and standards so high that I can only hope to one day emulate him. Jim is the finest example of discipline I've ever met.

Shortly after I moved in, Jim informed me that Ken Drury was not to be allowed in the house, that he had asked Ken not to come around. Jim explained that Ken had been convicted of child molestation and that he could be dangerous to the scouts; and since I've lived here, I haven't seen Ken around Jim's house at all. Also for the record, I've never seen, heard, or taken messages from anyone by the name of Craig Williams. Neither do I know of any even remotely close association between Jim and any Craig Williams.

You see, I know beyond the shadow of doubt that Jim's character does not allow and simply leaves no room for degradation. Please understand: my testamony is not heroworship, only that living with Jim over a period of time has been an unadorned testament in itself.

I admire Jim's dedication to his job friends and family. Often Jim is out doing some activity or in charge of some meeting every night of the week. He just doesn't stop. It's common after the busiest week to see Jim leave on Sunday in his grubby clothes and old tennies to do yard work at his parent's house.

Many school activities and scouting functions are held at Jim's home. It is clean, comfortable, and big enough to accommodate a large number of people-though Jim sometimes complains that its still not big enough. Jim respects his house for the very legitimate purpose it serves and insists the same respect from temporary residents, his scouts, and other guests. After living here, I can say without question that Jim would never in all his power and control allow any immoral activity in the strictist definition of the word to take place on his property. When I moved in, Jim discussed and made clear the rules of the house, which I have been careful not to offend.

I regard Jim even as a parent. He's been there with comforting advise during times when I've been emotionally distraught. Through two years of college he's given me nointrest loans and made it possible for me to spend the first year at BYU in Hawaii. And most recently, he's made possible a carreer that will meet and surpass all of my financial goals. Through high school, college, and after college Jim has filled the gap where my out-of-state parents couldn't. I owe Jim the same unrepayable debt we all owe our parents. For the unconditional love and unfaltering example, I am in his debt forever.

To Whom it May Concern:

James Savard's membership in the Boy Scouts of America should be reinstated. Rescinding his membership seems to be based, at least partly, on Scout professionals neither knowing the truth nor making an active attempt to discover the truth as to why Ken Drury cooked for the 1986 Order of the Arrow (O/A) Sectional Conclave. The problem seems to stem from the fact some believe Jim Savard recruited Ken Drury as a cook for the conclave. I can unequivocally say Jim did not recruit Ken Drury, because I was instrumental in the recruitment.

I have known Ken since November, 1982. My husband, Paul, told me Ken had been charged with sexual abuse, but had been acquitted. Ken had a fine reputation as a Scouter, having served with councils broughout Oregon and Washington. He continually made contributions of rood, materials, and time to the cause. He also told me Ken held the O/A Arrow of Honor. Ken was often a guest in our home and I perceived him to be a giving person, who desired to help others and help Scouting, who was often misunderstood by others, and whose position in Scouting seemed very unclear to everyone.

I knew one of Ken's difficulties was not receiving his Woodbadge beads earned on a course where my husband served as an Assistant Scout Master. Al Jacques, the Course Director, as well as a Scouting professional, and Paul spent many hours trying to have Ken reinstated as a member of the BSA, thus making it possible for Ken to receive his Woodbadge Beads. Even Al could not secure information, we later received, that Ken a arrest occurred immediately prior to his earning the beads and this was the reason for denial of membership. Hi, like Paul, Jim, and myself believed Ken had been acquitted of the charge, because Ken told us about his "acquittal."

Ken Drunt, a self-temployed necyclen, collects newspaper, candboard, etc. While collecting recyclable materials he would often find items such as axes, showels, cots, and food stuffs which he would donate to our thoop, our district and our council. I am sure he did the same for the thoops, district and council in Grants Pass. To collect recyclable items he would travel to Silventon and Grants Pass, when in our area we had him stay with us because he needed help. As educators, like Jim, my husband and I would never knowingly jeopardize our centificates by associating with a person who served time for child buse. This, as we now know, includes hen.

During a recycling visit in late May, 1986 I suggested he call Ed McAllister, a District commissioner working with the O/A, to see if they needed supplies or help. During the course of this conversation Ken offered to donate food and supplies.

Even though my husband and I saw Jim several times during June, July and early August we never talked about the conclave. In fact, neither Paul nor I knew Ken would be a cook until Labor Day weekend, when he asked if he could stay with us the Sunday night after the conclave. We did not talk to Jim until December. Jim Savard, therefore, could not know Ken Drury cooked for the conclave. Ken was recruited by Ed McAllister, s Scouter residing in Silverton, during the time in question and a Scouter who does not know Jim Savard.

During the summer of 1986, Ken actually told me he had been acquitted of the abuse charges, and in spite of this fact the membership check had been returned by the Modoc Council. The next I heard about either Ken or the conclave was on June 21, 1987. Jim expressed concern about our positions as educators if we allowed Ken to use our house as a base for his paper collecting activities. It seems ken had lied to us about the abuse charges. First, he had served 15 days in county jail for sexual abuse, not for furnishing alcohol to minors. Second, he had been re-arrested for the same charges in Klamath Falls.

Jim had cut Ken off from Scouting activities in his area during October when his council CE brought the problem up. In February Jim anned Ken from his house and removed Ken from the school recycling outliness. By doing this he eliminated any reason for Ken to come to Grants Pass. Ken stayed in Jim's house only one night during May, so he could appear in court on a traffic charge.

Jim is an extremely ethical and intensely loyal man. Jim's house is an extension of both his school and his Scout activities. He provides a safe environment for students and Scouts who may need a place to study, have problems at home, and sometimes don't have a place to stay. As the advisor to the Grants Pass High School Student Council he often uses his home as a place for the council to meet and hold social activities. During visits (and there have been many) I have seen Kids come to the house for Scouting business or student body business, find a place to study, do research projects, and work on ment badges.

While there, Jim expects Kids to conduct themselves in ways decoming ladies and gentlemen. Jim expects them to be polite to adults, take care of their business, pick up after themselves, and leave. Sometimes ne would invite them to stay for ice cream, a pizza, or hamburgers. He provided sods or juice for them to drink. He never has hard liquor and only on hare occasions does he have been, and only for adult consumption. If kids had personal pusiness with him he would have them in his office and he always left the door open. If kids stayed with him they had their own rooms. He a parent I we had no dualing about having my children or my foster-children for that matter, spend time with Jim in his home.

He you can see, ken lied to Jim about his dincumetances; Ken lied

to us. Because of Ken's "reputation as a good Scouter," because of Ken's willingness to share, and because Ken received the Arrow of Honor, none of us had any reason to question his story. When a professional spen't many hours attempting to discover why Ken could not be a member of the BSA and was not told the truth, none of us pursued the situation further. Certainly, as educators who could have our certificates pulled and who have students in our homes, we would not provide comfort to a man who has a record of sexual abuse of a child. As Scooters we would never knowingly open doors to enable Ken to be an active volunteer. Please do not accuse Jim of these things.

My name is Chad Nelson, I am currently a student at SOSC in my junior year. I have known Jim Savard for over six years and know him to be a man of integrity and honesty. It has come to my attention that Jim has been implicated, by Ken Drury and an associate named Craig, in some cases of child abuse. I spent the entire summer living in Jim's home and know that neither of these two men were at Jim's home while Jim was there or with Jim's consent.

Jim has many specific guidelines for people living in his home. I stress "HOME" because that is the environment that Jim provides and demands. Everyone shares duties and responsibilities and is required to treat the house as a home, not "a pad".

In the years that I have known Jim, I have found him to be a very good friend and resource. Jim has a genuine concern for young people and spends much of his time counseling and being a friend to more kids than I could ever name. I cannot believe that these accusations have any truth behind them and hope that this letter will help to clarify any gray areas that may exist due to any misunderstandings or mistatements of truth.





Dear Mr. Savard:

This will acknowledge receipt of your request for a local council review of the suspension of your registration with the Boy Scouts of America. A review committee of three volunteers will be appointed by the Council President to review your suspension.

The review committee will undergo an investigation to determine whether or not the suspension of your registration was appropriate. The standards which the review committee will apply are those set forth in Article VIII of the Rules and Regulations of the Boy Scouts of America, No. 4492.

All attempts will be made to set the hearing within 60 days of the date of this letter. As soon as a date has been established, you will be notified by mail.

The review hearing is not adversarial in nature. Neither yourself nor the Boy Scouts of America or any other participant in the hearings will be formally represented by legal counsel. At the outset of the hearing, you will be informed of the specific reasons and facts which the Council believes supports the suspension of registration. If you intend to call witnesses at the hearing, you must provide to the committee, at least, 2 weeks prior to the hearing, then names and addresses of the witnesses together with the summary of what these witnesses will say. The committee may, at its discretion, interview these witnesses prior to the hearing.

All facts considered by the committee will be kept confidential. At the conclusion of the hearing, the review committee will base its decision upon a majority vote. The committee will then draft a memorandum of decision setting forth the findings of fact and decisions of the review committee and issue a copy of that memorandum to you after it has been reviewed with the Registration Service at the National Office.

I have enclosed a copy of the "Applicant Procedure for Request and Review of Decision Denying Registration" for your information.


TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Dear Mr. Park;

I first became aware we had a sotential problem with Mr. Jim Savard in late September, 1986 when I received a phone call from Jerry Dempsey, Scout Executive, Oregon Trail Council informing we that Ken Oruny had been present at the C/A Conclave. According to Jerry, Ken had a child abuse conviction in his background. This had occurred some years ago in the Modoc Council.

I called Fred Hansen, retired Scout Executive of the Modoc Council to יחיים He immediately recognized the name and confirmed that Ken Gruny had been convicted of child abuse. I asked if he had notified Paul Ernst of this conviction. He indicated he had. I called Paul Ernst. He had no record of Ken Oruny and asked me to get confirmation of the conviction. I contacted Sgt. Ron Jones of the Oregon State Police and asked his help in confirming the conviction. On October 8th, 3ct Jones wrote me a letter confirming that Ken Oruny pleaded guilty to a charge of second degree child souse on Movember 10, 1982. On October 16, 1986, I forwarded a copy of Est. Jones letter and a Confidential Record Sheet to Paul Ernst.

Curing the fall of 1986, Egt. Jones continued to inform me that ken Gruzy was spending considerable time in the Grants Pass area and that he appeared to be a friend of Jim Bayard. Crury had a paper recycling business of some sort and Mr. Savard was using him at Grants Pass High School.

I had a conversation with Jim Savard on January 22, 1987, after our Annual Meeting. This conversation took place in the carking lot at the Crater Lake Council. We were alone. As I remember, Mr. Bayard mentioned getting Kan-Oruny active in Boouting. I asked if he was aware that Oruny had been convicted in November of 182 of second degree child abuse. Mr. Saverd appeared shocked. I am not sure if if he was shocked that Ordry had a record or that I knew Oruny had a record. The conversation didn't go much further that hight, partly because it was below freezing and heither of us had idats.

Suring February and March, 1967, I continued to de made aware of Drury's presence in the Grants Rass area. My sources of information were 5gt. Fon Jones and District Enscutive Tom Grimes of this office.

In early to mid Acril, 1987, Fon Jones informed me that he was positive ken Gruny was staying on occasion at Jim Savard's residence in Grants Pass. This caused me great concern because Mr. Savard's residence is like a revolving door with kids (high school students and possibly Scouts) coming and going all hours of the day and night.

we decided we needed to confront Mr. Savard with this. I informed the Council President of our plan and on April 18th, Sqt. Jones, who is also the District Commissioner in the Grants Pass District, and I met with Mr. Savard.

We essentially said we were aware that Ken Oruny was staying on occasion at Mr. Savard's residence, that Oruny was a convicted sex offencer and that Oruny would have to go. Mr. Savard essentially said that Oruny had only stayed at his residence once or twice when he was in town to appear in court. (Oruny was cited on October 4, 1986 by Grants Pass Folice for Felony Oriving while suspended.)

Mr. Savard agreed that Oruny would go. All indications are that Oruny did go and I am not aware that he's deen in Grants Pass since. As far as I am aware, this ends the chapter with ken Oruny.

Early the week of May 4th, 1937, I received a call from Sgt. Jones informing me that he had just learned, through a source ne could not reveal, that a Craig Williams was staying overhight on occasion at the Savard residence. Mr. Williams was convicted of sodomizing a 13 year old victim in November of 1986. Mr. Williams is a graduate of Grants Pass High School. He is a self-proclaimed homosexual. He resides in Fortland, which is 4 1/2 hours north of us, and comes to Grants Pass on occasion to visit his parents. However, when he comes to Grants Pass to visit his parents he does not stay with them; he stays at Mr. Savard's residence according to Sgt. Jones source.

When I shared this information with our Council President it was our feeling, we could not walk away from this but to guide us as we attempted to deal with the situation we would need the counsel of a good attorney.

On May 13th, we met with a local attirney, Bob Cowling, who agreed to help us. Our plan was to confirm that Mr. Williams was in fact visiting the Salard residence. On May 13th, I talked with you by shone and appraised you of the situation. Your advice to me at this time was to go ahead and confirm williams was spending time at the Bavard residence and then contact Mr. Bavard with a middle ground approach, iel to more Scouts at the house, no Scout activities at the home, and no more association with known sex offenders.

To assist us in knowing when Williams might wist Grants Pass, Sgt. Jones contacted Williams' probation office in Portland and asked him to make Williams report in prior to coming to Grants Pass. The probation officer agreed to help, but Williams never again visited Grants Pass.

On June 14th, I met again with Soo Ecwling and Sgt. Jones to revise our plan. We agreed that Sgt. Jones would contact Williams' probation officer and get him to call Williams in and ask him if he had stayed at the Savard residence after his November 186 conviction. The probation officer agreed to help. He met with Williams. Williams denied staying at Mr. Savard's after November 186. However, the probation officer felt Williams was lying.

I met priefly with Sob Cowling on July 20th. We decided to go alead and confront Mr. Savand but that I would call you to confirm we were proceeding properly. You asked to have Sob Cowling call you on July 21 and on July 22, Mr. Cowling asked me to develop this harmative for you.

This brings us up to date and with this as packground, we would very much appreciate your guidance and direction so that we may properly deal with this difficult situation.
