
Dear Mr. Belk,

Dear Mr. Ernst,

It is my understanding that the first step taken in suspending registration of an adult in the Boy Scouts is on the local council level. The "BSA Staff Orientation" on how to deal with child sexual abuse awareness indicates that the local council president will make the first review and write the first letter and indicates that there would be a council review committee.

If this is true, please advise me why this first step was not offered to me.

Despite this failure of "first appeal", I would like to submit the following statement. I will send a copy to our council president in case he "needs to know".

Your letter says to explain my version of the facts supporting my claim... I really do not know what Mr. Bain has been told, so it is extremely hard to explain my version.

I was investigated by the district welfare department for alleged physical abuse and sexual abuse. The investigation lasted for approximately two weeks. The results were sent to my school and read over the phone to me and to Judge John Hudson (Youth Court Judge, Adams County, Mississippi). Mr. Walter Weathers read the statement to me and to Judge Hudson.

The findings of the investigation were as follows: "The investigation did not reveal physical evidence of sexual abuse." It did reveal a pattern of touch and behavior directed toward male students by a male teacher which is considered to be inappropriate.

This was apparently the same statement which Mr. Weathers read to Mr. Bain over the phone. This is also the only "things" of which I have been accused.

When Mr. Weathers read the findings of the investigation to me, I asked him if there were any restrictions on me as to what I could do. He said there were none at all.

I also had an hour conversation in the chambers of Judge Hudson. I told him that I intended to go to Philmont Scout Ranch for the summer. I asked him if he knew any reason

why I should not go. He said he knew of no reason at all. Judge Hudson is a former Chairman of the District Committee, so he knows about Philmont.

The only two people who had access to all of the investigation reports - Mr. Weathers and Judge Hudson both said that I had no restrictions.

On my first day of work at Philmont I asked Dave Bates to set up a meeting with me and him and Chuck Buenger. Dave Bates is Director of Program at Philmont and was my immediate supervisor and Chuck Buenger is General Manager of Philmont. In the meeting I told them about the investigation and the resulting outcome and then gave them the telephone number of Judge Hudson so they could call him.

They apparently talked to him and to Larry Bain. They informed me that Mr. Bain was going to ask the Boy Scouts to revoke my registration. I was given the option by Mr. Bates and Mr. Buenger to leave immediately or wait until the home office sent word that my membership had in fact been revoked. I told them that I would stay until it was revoked because I knew the investigation had cleared me of the charges and that I had been told by Mr. Weathers and Judge Hudson that there were no restrictions.

I asked Bates and Buenger how long it would be before the home office let us know, and I was told that it would be taken care of by Tuesday - two or three days. I talked to my wife and we decided that since it was going to be only two days that we would just go ahead and leave before the emotions got out of hand. I did not receive the letter regarding the suspension until July 10. It was written almost one month after the conversation with Mr. Bates and Mr. Buenger - not two days!

I have taught at Trinity Episcopal Day School for 21 years. I have taught many of these children's parent and many of their older brothers and sisters. The school is a small school and a family oriented school. I have never once thought that I should not touch these children. The touching happens! The children are touched by every teacher in the school. I would be the "odd ball" if I had not touched them.

I realize that "times are changing", but I did not realize it had changed to the point it apparently has. I am aware that parents tell their children, "If something is uncomfortable, let us (parents) know." I certainly feel that is good policy, and I have told my own children the same thing. However, there must be an area left for caring people to show that they do care, and touching is an excellent way to indicate that you do care.


The touching I have done is called inappropriate. I would like to know who said it was inappropriate and I would like to know who decides what is inappropriate and what is appropriate.

I did the touching, and it was in no way inappropriate. Someone deems it inappropriate and it then becomes inappropriate. Who has the right to make those decisions.

One reason I would like for the first step to be taken - council review - is that they would have better access to the people who could give a truer picture of my character and morals. The review committee on the local council level could get a truer picture of our school and the situation in Natchez.

I believe my character and morals are as high and good today as they have been the past thirty years I have been in Scouting. The council review committee will find that to be true after an initial inquiry.

Jim Foster has been a key member of our seasonal staff for about 20 years. He is a resident of Natchez, Miss. and has been a teacher in an Episcopal school for there for about the same length of time. He has been active in the local Scout program.

He and his family arrived here on June 2. On the morning of June 3, he told Dave Bates that he needed to discuss something with us. He told us that he had been accused of fondling a student on a class trip and of corporal punishment. He indicated that an investigation had been conducted and recently completed. He met with County Judge John N. Hudson and asked him if there were any restrictions on his employment in the future and the Judge told him there weren't any. He then asked if it was OK for him to serve on our staff and was informed that it was OK.

Prior to the completion of the investigation, the school terminated his employment.

He wanted us to call the Judge and we did. The Judge would not say that Jim had been cleared and recommended that we call the local council so they could relay what the report said.

We called Larry Bain, the Scout Executive of the Andrew Jackson Council in Jackson, Miss. Larry had received an oral report on June 1. He said that the report stated that there was not any sexual abuse but that there was "inappropriate touching". The council had also received a complaint about Jim from a Scouter. Larry had not received a written report. He had discussed the situation with his key leaders and his Area Director.

We met with Jim and relayed to him that, right or wrong, the situation didn't look too good. He, of course, feels like he has been falsely accused. I told him that based on the available facts that his registration would probably be revoked. He asked how he could clear himself and I explained the review process that would be outlined in the letter. Dave Bates then said that it looked Jim needed to make a decision on what would be best for him and his family. Jim wanted to discuss it with his wife.

After doing this, he informed Dave that they would be leaving on the morning of June 4. We gave him a check for a month's salary and they left. Their two older daughters will be serving on the staff this summer and their son will be in the trail crew program. We agreed that we would say that he left for personal reasons since his father-in-law was ill and he needed to look for employment.

He does not have an attorney but I believe he will retain one and pursue whatever means necessary to clear his name.

I called Larry Bain to up-date him. He and the Area Director had tried to reach Paul but apparently he was on vacation.

I made handwritten notes as we went throught the process and will keep them in our files here.
