I represent James E. Vila, an employee of the Boy Scouts Of America, who was suspended on November 16, 1987 due to certain criminal allegations made against him. We wish to advise you that on October 18, 1989 all criminal charges against Mr. Vila were dismissed by Judge Jay Gold in the New York State Supreme Court, New York County.

Mr. Vila is currently ready, willing and able to return to the Boy Scouts as a full time employee. In addition, due to the suspension and the concurrent loss of rights to salaries and benefits to which Mr. Vila was entitled we make a demand upon the Boy Scouts for the lost earnings and benefits, as outlined in the attached list. These losses also include the cost of litigation in both the civil and criminal matters in which Mr. Vila was named as a party.

Please contact the undersigned upon receipt of this letter in order to facilitate an equitable resolution of these claims.

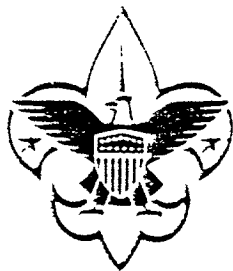

In November 1987, James Vila, district executive serving East Harlem, was arrested and charged with child sexual molestation. As a result, he was removed from his employment with the Greater New York Council.

As a result of Vila's alleged behavior, Scout youth Cordera has filed suit against the National Council, BSA and Greater New York Council, BSA. That litigation is still in the pre-trial discovery stage.

Recent correspondence from defense counsel (attached; start with 2nd paragraph, page 2) advises me that the criminal indictment against Vila is being dismissed for lack of prosecution. If the criminal matter is dismissed, Vila plans to seek re-instatement and back pay from the Greater New York Council.

Frank Lane, our attorney in Miami, advises that Vila should not be reinstated under any circumstances.

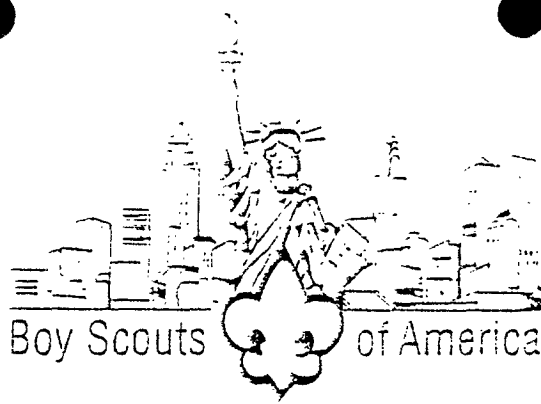

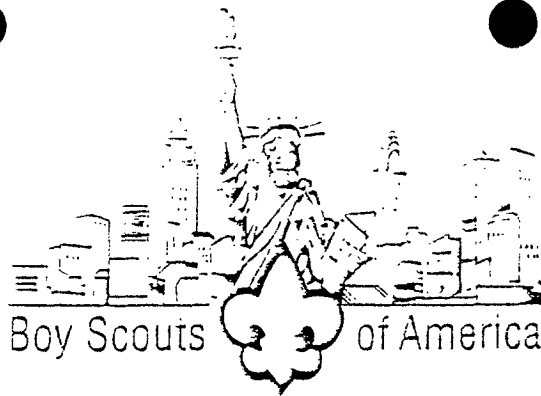

In an effort to keep you current in the matter concerning Mr. James Vila formerly of the Greater New York staff, let me provide you with an update.

This case is far from complete and will probably go on for some time now. Mr. Vila who served as a member of the professional staff of the Greater New York Councils until his suspension and subsequent resignation in November of 1987. Mr. Vila has been indicted by the Manhattan Grand Jury for sexual abuse in the first degree involving an incident which reportedly took place between September 1, 1985 and December 24, 1985 to a boy. This incidentally is not the charge which was used when he was arrested in November of 1987. The charge at that time dealt with an incident which reportedly took place in the fall of 1987. Beyond that, we do not have further information regarding the incident.

Coincidentally with this the parents of the boy involved have filed a law suit against Mr. Vila and the Boy Scouts of America. This is obviously a separate action but connected. I will attempt to keep you updated as additional information is available.

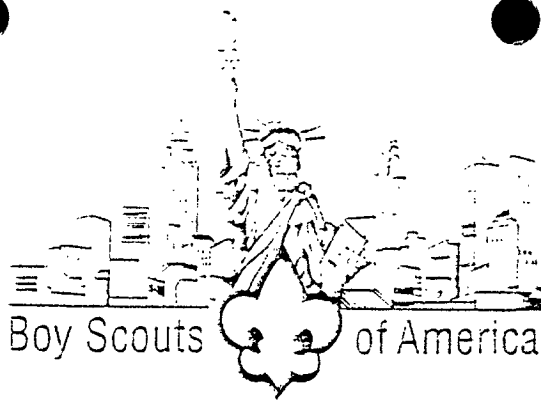

As an additional follow up to previous letters, I need to give you a current status report on James Vila concerning the legal action in his case.

The county prosecutor's office has again extended the arraignment date for Mr. Vila's arraignment on charges. This will be the last extension allowed because the new date is now May 20, 1988.

As far as I understand it, the law requires that charges must either be made by 180 days or the charges are dropped. Since he was arrested on November 16, May 20 must obviously be the last possible day that they could have in order to have an arraignment. Consequently, subsequent to May 20, 1988, we will have a better picture of where we are concerning this case. Following that date I will again communicate with you so that you have some idea of where we are headed. Thanks for your patience.

As a follow up to earlier correspondence, I need to give you a current status report on the confidential matter involving James Vila and his registration status with our Council.


As you may recall, Mr. Vila was a member of the Greater New York Councils' professional staff and was relieved of his duties after an allegation was made of sexual child abuse. Subsequently he resigned and we accepted his resignation from the profession.

Mr. Vila's arraignment has not yet been held as the prosecutor's office has continued to ask for postponements. As a result of these postponements, we know nothing further now than we knew on the 16th of November when this situation began. It is my understanding that according to the law, the prosecutor's office has six months in which to proceed with an arraignment or to drop the case. At this point, we are still in a period of waiting.

During all this time, Mr. Vila has maintained his innocence and those who know him cannot believe that the allegations are true. Those of us on the staff who knew him well hope that this is true but we will not know until later when the facts finally are brought out.

There is nothing further to report at this time. I will keep you posted as the situation changes.

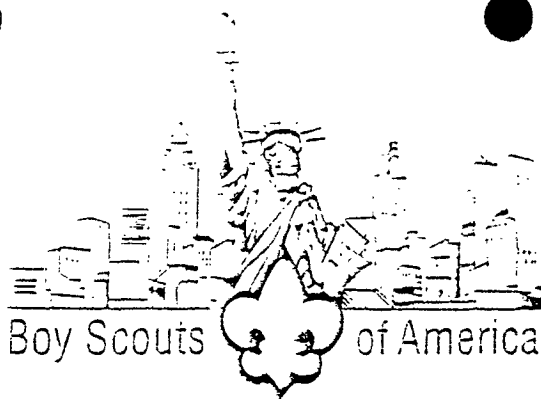

With regard to the current status concerning James Vila, please know that at this point we have no further knowledge than the day of our suspension of him and his arrest which took place on November 16.

As of today, he has not been arraigned. Because of the law, we have been unable to determine the exact charges that he will be charged with. Some of the gossip which is going on seems to indicate that there is nothing except the accusation of one youth member and it is not supported by any other youth member or adult. If this turns out to be the case, we may find a situation of charges being dropped.

As of this point, everything is very much up in the air. I am not personally sure that he is guilty. Unfortunately, the law prohibits us from finding out any additional information unless we hired a separate investigator which we are not going to do at this point in time. Hopefully the information will come out shortly and the situation will be clarified one way or the other. I will keep you informed of developments as soon as we have any additional information which can be helpful to us. Thank you so much for your ongoing support.

Scout leader's arrest shocks friends, workers

CLINTON TOWNSHIP — In the 17 years he has served as an executive of the Boy Scouts of America in New York City, James Vila had an impeccable record and was a popular leader, a Boy Scout official said yesterday.

Family, friends and co-workers said yesterday that they were stunned by charges that the 39-year-old Vila had sexually abused a Boy Scout over a two-year period.

On Monday, New York City police charged Vila, of 31 Center St. in the Annandale section, with first-degree sexual abuse of an 11-year-old Scout. The boy, who was not identified, was a member of Troop 655, which held meetings at Public School 155 at 319 E. 117th St. in East Harlem.

When contacted at his home here yesterday, Vila was polite but declined to comment on the charges. "Any questions will have to be answered by my lawyer," he said.

Vila "adamantly denies the charges and he looks forward to the opportunity to have a trial and be acquitted," his lawyer, Lee Ginsberg, said from his office in New York.

The charges "came as a complete shock to him and his family," Ginsberg said. "Until Monday, they had no inkling or idea this was coming."

"He's a great guy. We feel there's nothing to suggest that this could have happened," said Robert Williams, a spokesman for the Greater New York Councils of the Boy Scouts of America, which oversees the five boroughs in New York City and surrounding areas.

Vila was suspended immediately from his job as district executive after Scouting officials learned of the charges, Williams said. It is the policy of the Scouts to suspend any official or volunteer facing charges until any investigation is complete, he said.

Scouting officials, however, say they will stand behind Vila.

"His record is perfect and his work has been exemplary," Williams said.

"We believe a person is innocent until proven guilty. We must act on the charges. We are cooperating with the police. When he is cleared of the charges, he'll be reinstated. He's a senior member of this organization."

Vila, one of about 50 to 75 district executives, was in charge of most of the East Harlem area, Williams said. Troop 655 was only one of an undetermined number of troops in his district.

As a district executive, Vila did not deal directly with the Scouts, but with raising money for the organization, handling volunteers and activities

and dealing with parents of the youths. The organization splits New York City and the other four boroughs into districts so it is easier to organize troops and recruit youngsters and adult volunteers. Williams said.

But there were many occasions when Vila would come in contact with the children, Williams said, such as meetings, events, camping trips and cookouts. The organization, with its headquarters in New York City, has 83,000 youngsters and 22,000 adults in the Boy Scouts program in the five boroughs alone.

Ginsberg declined to say whether Vila knew the boy or to speculate as to why he would bring charges against Vila. He said he hadn't had enough time to review the evidence.

Vila previously held posts in Allentown, Pa., which included troops in Easton, Pa., and Phillipsburg, Williams said, but most of his association is with the New York office.

Hunterdon County Prosecutor Roger Manon said Hunterdon authorities were not involved in the investigation and New York City police have not contacted him. Court records show

Vila has no previous criminal convictions in Hunterdon County.

John Mayer, senior district Scout executive for the Boy Scout council that includes Hunterdon, Warren and Mercer counties, said he has never known Vila to participate in the Boy Scouts in this area.

Williams said the organization has not had many of its officials or volunteers charged with sexually abusing the children.

"It is unusual, but this isn't the first case we've dealt with," he said. "We deal with a large amount of people in a huge metropolitan area. Sometimes parents get carried away. They get so caught up with what they're doing that sometimes things turn political. They can start to point fingers and say, this scoutmaster or this official abused a child. We've had cases where that's how heated it gets. They forget they're here to help the youngsters."

Williams said Boy Scout officials were told the youth made the assault allegations to his parents and teachers at Public School 155. In New York, some of the troops are connected to a school, which organizes and runs the troop. Troop 655 was connected to the school, Williams said.

On Monday morning, police, school and Boy Scout officials met with the boy's parents to discuss the allegations, Williams said.

Vila responded to a police request that he come in for questioning. He appeared at the 20th Precinct station house in New York, where he was later arrested. Police Officer Joseph Gallagher said. So far, only one complaint has been lodged against Vila, Gallagher said.

The assistant principal at Public School 155 declined to give her name or comment on the charges.

"We did what we had to do," she said.

Vila's family posted \$5,000 bail Tuesday after his arraignment in Manhattan Criminal Court. He is married, has three children and has lived in Clinton Township for six years.

Williams said he has taken a number of calls from adult volunteers and parents Vila has dealt with, and all called to support him.

"We are perfectly behind him," said Vila's friend, John Arnone, pastor of Annandale Reformed Church, where Vila is a member. "The charges are outrageous. We'll go through this with him."
