

Sex Charges Dropped In Deal With Ex-Cop

Two years after charging him with sexually molesting five teen-age boys, the state Thursday dropped all remaining felony counts against former Vero Beach police officer James Scharfschwerdt.

As part of a plea bargain, Scharfschwerdt, 33, pleaded no contest to a single count of battery.

The battery charge stemmed from an incident on Oct. 18, 1988, when police officers placed a hidden microphone on one of the alleged victims and sent him to Scharfschwerdt's home.

Scharfschwerdt suspected the boy was wired and frisked him. The victim was not injured.

Circuit Judge Paul B. Kanarek found Scharfschwerdt guilty of the first-degree misdemeanor and sentenced him to one year of probation, ordering him to forfeit his law enforcement certification permanently and submit to mental health counseling.

"I believe it's in my best interest." Scharfschwerdt said. "It's been a long two years. These allegations against me have taken their toil It's cost me my life."

After court was recessed, he hugged his wife, shook his father's hand and said, "Let's go home." He waiked out to the applause of a crowd of friends and relatives.

"This is the end of the case," defense attorney Michael Brodsky said.

Brodsky said as part of the plea agreement, negotiated over the past week, the state cannot refile any of the molestation charges.

Assistant State Attorney Lynn Park said she dropped the remaining lewd and lascivious charges—four were disposed of when Scharfschwerdt was acquitted in a trial last year—because it was in—the best interest of the victims.

Two are reportedly undergoing psychological counseling.

She also said there were problems in the upcoming trial because the victim couldn't remember if the alleged abuse happened in 1983 or 1984.

A It would have been difficult to fexpiain why the victim didn't come forward until last week to report an alleged statement by Scharfschwerdt admitting he needed heip, she said.

"I felt it strengthened our case, but the fact he only told me a few weeks before the trial ... they could have hurt him badly on the stand."

Vero Beach Police Capt. Ronald Blanton, the case detective, remains "100 percent convinced" of Scharfschwerdt's guilt.

"I have no doubt in my mind." Blanton said. "He's a pedophile. He'll always be a pedophile. He's not going to be cured."

He noted the victim of the case

tried last year suffered further abuse at the hands of peers who called him names like "queer" and "faggot" and eventually dropped out of school.

Chief Jim Gabbard said he "certainly was disappointed" at Thursday's outcome of the case.

"I have very strong feelings regarding this case, but those opinions just didn't prevail," he said. "I'm powerless to pursue it any further."

State drops former cop's abuse charges

VERO BEACH - With their case starting to unravel, prosecutors dropped eight felony sex abuse charges against a popular ex-cop and scout leader Wednesday in exchange for a guilty plea of one misdemeanor.

The action came during an unusual evening court hearing in which James Scharfschwerdt, 33, pleaded no contest to a nonsex-related misdemeanor charge of bat-

Scharfschwerdt, a former Vero Beach police officer and ex-deputy for the Indian River County Sheriff's Department, was immediately sentenced to a year of probation.

As a stipulation of that probation, the 12-year veteran cop must give up his police license forever and must undergo a year of "stress counseling," said Mike Brodsky, Scharfschwerdt's attoriey, "I was innocent," an ebullent Scharfschwerdt said as he was mobbed by about two dozen sup-

porters after the hearing. "I said so

from the start, and this proves it."
"It's gone, it's over," the tearful
Scharfschwerdt said as he hugged
his pregnant wife, Wanda.

"Good," his father answered.
"Let's go home," the ex-officer called loudly as many of his friends

broke into applause.

One of the most talked-about criminal cases in Indian River County in the past two years had

come to a surprise ending. It began with five alleged victims and 13 fel-

ony sex charges.

Assistant State Attorney Lynn Park said that changes in witnes testimony had begun to erode the testmony had begun to erode the credibility of the state's case. For example, the alleged victim in one of the cases changed a key part of his story. He was "off by a year in the dates he first gave," Park said.

It is not that victims or other wit-

nesses are not truthful, Park said. The problem was that the alleged crimes occurred as far back as 1984, when most of the victims were 13 or 14 years old. Most of the alleged victims were not interviewed by authorities until perhaps four years after the alleged inci-

Park had taken Scharfschwerdt to trial in 1989 and lost. The jury found

said. One of the remaining charges involves a youth who is under psy chiatric treatment for unrelated problems, and one of the other victims was not a strong witness. Park


"Overall, we assessed the case and decided this was best for every one," she said. Park said she talked to several people involved in the case, including two of the three remaining victims, and they agree.

Under the terms of an agreement approved by Circuit Judge Paul Kanarek, Scharfschwerdt pleaded ro contest to misdemeanor battery on one of the victims that occurred the night Scharfschwerdt was arrested in 1988.

In their investigation, detectives had placed a hidden microphone and transmitter on a teen-age boy and sent him to Scharfschwerdt's house to see if they could record him saying something incriminating.

Scharfschwerdt, suspicious of the youth's unexpected call, searched the boy and found the microphone. Surprised by Scharlschwerdt's reaction, police rushed in and arrested Scharlschwerdt on charges of simple battery, a misdemeanor.

Park said that the witnesses and alleged victims she talked to were pleased that Scharfschwerdt would give up his badge and get counseling.

Molestation Trial Date Set For Ex-Cop

Former Vero Beach police officer James Scharfschwerdt is scheduled to stand trial in December for a second time on child molestation charges.

Two months after Acting Circuit Judge Joe Wild disqualified himself from presiding at the trial, Circuit Judge Paul B. Kanarek has been assigned to the case.

The trial is set for 9 a.m. Dec. 3. Wild recused himself at the request of defense attorney Michael Brodsky, who alleged Wild could not be impartial because of his relationship with Assistant State Attorney David Morgan.

Wild was a prosecutor working under Morgan when the Scharfschwerdt case broke in late 1988. Brodsky has accused Morgan of coercing and manipulating the testimony of alleged victims, but no action has been taken on the allegations:

State Attorney Bruce Colton has denied Brodsky's contentions and said Morgan acted properly during the investigation.

Scharfschwerdt, 33, the city's former beach patrol officer, was arrested in October 1988 on charges of lewd and lascivious conduct with five teen-age boys.

He resigned shortly after the arrest and stood trial for the first time in August 1989, with Kanarek presiding. A jury acquitted Scharfschwerdt of molesting a 13-year-old boy in 1986. Four other trials on eight counts remain.

Assistant State Attorney Lynn Park has said the next trial will be based on allegations that Scharfschwerdt sexually molested another teen-age boy in 1983:

She could not be reached for comment on the upcoming trial, but said after last year's trial that the alleged victim of the 1983 case is a "very credible young man."

Vero Beach Police Chief Jim Gabbard declined to comment on the pending trial.

At last year's trial, Brodsky suggested the two alleged victims who testified against Scharfschwerdt made up their stories because they wanted to get him in trouble.

Some jurors agreed that the boys could have been trying to get revenge against Scharfschwerdt.

Judge Wild Steps Down From Trial

Acting Circuit Judge Joe Wild disqualified himself Wednesday from presiding at the upcoming child molestation trial of a former police officer amid allegations of bias and prejudice.

Wild granted a motion for disqualification filed by Miami defense attorney Michael Brodsky, who represents 32-year-old Vero Beach resident James Scharfschwerdt.

Scharfschwerdt worked for the Vero Beach Police Department as beach patrol officer until he resigned after his October 1988 arrest on charges of lewd and lascivious conduct with five teen-age

He was acquitted of four charges at a trial in August 1989. A second trial has not yet been set but is. expected to be held in October after the case is reassigned to another judge.

Brodsky alleged Wild could not be an impartial judge because he used to work as a prosecutor under the direction of Assistant State Attorney David Morgan, whom Brodsky said coerced and manip ulated" the testimony of alleged victims.

Although Wild was never assigned to investigate or prosecute the case against Scharfschwerdt, the defense attorney said Wild's relationship with Morgan was enough to cause a "well-grounded fear" that Wild could not be impartial.

Brodsky accused Morgan of coercing one of the victims into making false allegations against

Scharischwerdt.

Brodsky also aileged "repeatedly" communicated with another victim in violation of a court order limiting the interviews of any victim of sexual

abuse under 16.

The defense asked the court last year to determine whether Morgan should be held in contempt for doing so, but Circuit Judge Paul B. Kanarek, who was assigned the case at the time, never held a hearing on the matter.

State Attorney Bruce Colton defended Morgan's actions.....

"I am aware of Dave Morgan's involvement in the investigation and I don't feel he did anything improper," Colton said. "When the evidence comes out at triai, that will be evident.'

Colton said some of Brodsky's allegations are inaccurate and others are irrelevant to the case.

"They're trying to cloud the issue," he said. Colton said the issue is whether the victim is telling the truth, not alleged prosecutorial misconduct.

"Many witnesses at times are reluctant to tell the truth at first for a number of reasons. It takes, sometimes, some coaxing or pressure." Colton said.

As to allegations that Morgan violated a court order limiting communications with young victims, Colton said the order only applies to compelling them to testify and not voluntary discussions.

Park said the next trial - the second of a possible four on eight remaining counts — will revolve around allegations that Scharfschwerdt sexually molested a teen-age boy in 1983.



Ex-officer's attorney seeks to block trial

VERO BEACH — An appeals court in West Palm Beach is expected to rule today or Friday on an emergency request to block next week's trial of a former police officer.

James Scharfschwerdt, a former St. Lucie County jailer, Indian River County sheriff's deputy and Vero Reach police patrolman, is scheduled to start trial Monday. He's charged with lewd and lastivious conduct and sexual battery involving a boy, 13

In an effort to give people additional time to report sexual abuse that happened when they were children, the Florida Legislature ruled in 1985 that sex-crime victims have until the age of 19 or 20 to report them.

The acts Scharfschwerdt is accused of took place six years ago, in 1983. The alleged victim is now 19. In a motion filed this week, de-

lense attorney Michael Brodsky told the Fourth District Court of Appeal

The law in effect in 1983 was for a three-year statute of limitations on lewd and lascivious conduct and four years on sexual battery, Brodksy said.

But in a document filed with the appeals court Wednesday, the Attorney General's Office agreed with Kanarck and with Lynn Park, the assistant state attorney prosecuting the case, who said the law can be applied retroactively.

If the appeals court asks for more information from each side, both Fark and Brodsky said, it is unlikely the trial will start next week.

A circuit court jury in Vero Beach last month acquitted Scharf-schwerdt of four counts of sexual misconduct with another teen-age boy.

Ex-officer asks judge to reduce his bond

VERO BEACH — Former Vero Beach Police officer James Scharfschwerdt has asked a judge to reduce his bond and to declare him indigent, court officials said Monday.

Disclosure of the motions came following Scharfschwerdt's resignation from the police force late last week. The officer had been on suspension without pay.

Scharfschwerdt is charged with three counts of sexual battery and nine counts of lewd and lascivious conduct against four boys ages 12 and 13. In most of the cases, the 31-year-old former patrolman and former sheriff's deputy is accused of masturbating the teenagers; performing oral sex on them or masturbating in front of them.

He is out of jail on total bond of \$111,000. In addition to the \$11,100 cash premium Scharfschwerdt paid, several friends and family members pledged property as security for the bond.

The officer is scheduled to be arraigned on all the charges Jan. 9. The nearings on his motion for bond reduction and declaration of indigence will probably be held the

week before, a spokesman for Circuit Judge Paul Kanarek said Monday.

In his letter of resignation, Scharfschwerdt was critical of Vero Beach Police Chief Jim Gabbard and of his fellow officers who investigated him. Gabbard declined Monday to comment on the letter.

The letter was also Scharfschwerdt's first comment since his original arrest Oct. 18. He has been arrested twice since.

"Although I have spent numerous years devoted to law enforcement and to the youth of Vero Beach and Indian River County," Scharfschwerdt wrote to Gabbard, "you have unjustly permitted the lives of my wife, my beautiful young child and myself to be morally and financially destroyed."

Scharfschwerdt accused Gabbard of allowing an investigation that, "has encouraged an solicited false accusations while ignoring the truth." He said officers "manufactured evidence in an attempt to corroborate those false accusations."

You have attempted to prejudice the public against me by manipulating the press," Scharfschwerdt

"I thank God there are still people in the community who believe in me and know that I am incapable of committing those hemous acts for which I am now charged?"

Scharfschwerdt said that regardless of his confidence that he will be acquitted, "I could never return to your department because of the irreparable harm that has resulted. Nor could I ever serve under a chief who would sanction the biased and vicious investigation that you have allowed in my case." January 16, 1989
