Lovell Given 10-Year Jail Terms

'LFORD — Jeffrie H. Lovell, former teaching aide in the Milford school system, has been sentenced to serve two years of two 10-year prison terms on charges of indecent assault and battery to which he pleaded guilty Jan. 28.

Lovell, of 198 Purchase Street, had been sent to Bridgewater State Hospital for psychiatric evaluation after pleading guilty before Judge Robert V. Mulkern to 10 counts of indecent assault and battery on a child under 14.

According to Worcester Superior Court criminal clerk John F. O'Connor, Lovell this week was declared a sexually dangerous person following a hearing before Mulkern.

Lovell began serving his sentence at Concord State Prison immediately after the verdict was handed

down.
Two psychologists from
Bridgewater State, along with
Lovell's own psychologist, testified

that without strict control. Lovell would be likely to repeat his behavior, which they called repetitive and compulsive. according to a court spokesman who attended the hearing.

At the time of sentencing in Worcester Superior Court, Lovell had already served 111 days in Bridgewater State.

On two of the counts, Judge Mulkern imposed a term of 10 years in Concord State Prison, with two years to be served, and the rest sus-

pended. Lovell was placed on five years probation, which will begin on release from jail, and was ordered to receive any necessary medical evalution and treatment, according to court documents.

On the remaining eight counts. Mulkern imposed terms of eight to 10 years in Walpole State Prison and suspended them. However, if the court orders they are to be later served, the eight to 10 year term is

to begin after the Concord sentence. The five years of probation with the same provisions for medical evauation was also imposed.

Back in January when Lovell pleaded guilty, bitter and angry parents of the victims demanded he be jailed. Supporters of Lovell on the other hand point to his efforts to be rehabilitated. On the stand Lovell expressed sorrow for his actions and offered his sincere apologies to the families and children "hurt" by his behavior.

Lovell resigned as a special education aide on Nov. 26, 1985, three days after his initial arrest on three charges of indecent assault and battery. Later he was indicted on 12 counts of indecent assault and battery on a child under 14 and five counts of child rape in October 1986.

The incidents were said to have taken place in Milford and Bolton tween 1981 and 1985 and inlived four boys ages 11 to 13 at the time, according to the Worcester County grand jury indictment.

Lovell was the Milford Civil Defense director and a Boy Scout leader.

Lovell Pleads Guilty To 10 Counts In Child Abuse Case

MILFORD — Jeffrie H. Lovell, 34, of 198 Purchase Street, a former special education aide and Boy Scout leader, pleaded guilty yesterday to 10 counts of indecent assault and battery on a child under 14 during a trial held in Worcester Superor Court.

Lovell entered his plea before Superior Court Judge Robert V. Multern during the trial that was marked by testimony from angry parents of the boys allegedly incolved in incidents with Lovell.

A father of one of the boys inolved in an incident with Lovell xpressed his bitterness and asked udge Mulkern to level a jail sentnce against Lovell. After hearing the plea, Judge Mulkern ordered Lovell to undergo up to 40 days of psychiatric evaluation at Bridgewater State Hospital.

No date for the sentencing has been set, according to Lovell's attorney, Warren Heller of Milford.

Lovell took the stand and express-

ed sorrow for his actions.

Addressing the families and "the children I've hurt," he offered "my sincerest apologies."

Assistant District Attorney Joseph Reilley has recommended

that Lovell be sentenced to two consecutive sentences of 10 years in Concord State Prison.

However, Heller said he is prepared to argue for Lovell's rehabilitation and continuance of therapy he has been receiving "almost since the day of his arrest."

Heller said the emphasis should be "on the prevention of it happening again.

Instead of a prison sentence, Heller said Lovell should be placed on probation "with strict controls."

According to Heller, it was "significant" that five counts of rape on a child under 16 and two accompanying charges of assault and battery on a child under 16 were filed without a plea or finding.

He said he was prepared "to go forward" on them because Lovell had "professed innocence" to those charges.

The Worcester County grand jury handed down an indictment of 12 counts of indecent assault and battery on a child under 14 and five counts of child rape against Lovell during an October 1986 session.

The alleged incidents took place in Milford and Bolton between 1981 and 1985 and involved four boys ages 11 to 13 at the time, according to the indictment.

Milford police arrested Lovell in November 1985 on three charges of indecent assault and battery on a minor under 14 years of age.

Lovell pleaded innocent to the charges during his arraignment in Milford District Court.

In March 1986, he was charged separately with two counts of rape of a child under 16. He also pleaded innocent to those charges.

In August of 1986, Milford District Court Judge Francis J. Larkin cleared Lovell of three counts of rape of a child under 16.

Larkin said he had "sufficient doubts" about the charges.

He also dismissed five of the charges brought by Milford police in 1985 saying they duplicated some of the charges pressed against Lovell by state police.

One of the persons testifying on behalf of Lovell was Woodland Elementary School Principal John Shaughnessy where Lovell worked as a special aide during the time of the alleged incidents.

He praised Lovell's ability to work with the special education students and said he had never heard one complaint leveled against him.

Rev. Robert Hannum of Danvers, a Lovell family friend and former pastor of the United Methodist Church where the family worships. revealed he has been counseling Lovell since the time of his arrest.

He said Lovell acknowledged his problem to him and knew he should continue therapy.

Others testifying on his behalf included Peter Ellis of Hopedale and D.J. Sgammato of Milford.

MILFORD - A District Court judge yesterday dismissed the most serious charges against a. Milford man arrested on several counts of sexual assaults on children.

After hearing testimony at a probable-cause hearing, Judge Francis J. Larkin refused to bind over to the grand jury Jeffrie Lovell, 33, of 198 Purchase St., on two counts of rape of a child under

The grand jury will still hear evidence against Lovell on lesser charges of indecent assault and battery on a child under age 14, stemming from alleged incidents involving three other boys. The defense waived probable-cause ... The boy's mother then told police cleared of rape hearings on those counts.

The alleged victim in the more serious charges against Lovell testified at yesterday's hearing that Lovell engaged in oral sex with him on two occasions in 1981. and 1983 after taking him to movies. The youth, now 16, said he met Lovell through a Boy Scout troop for which Lovell was Scoutmaster, and sang with Lovell in a choir at Pine Street Baptist

On cross-examination, the youth testified that he first mentioned Lovell to police last March after he himself was charged with the rape of a 10-year-old neighbor. The police told him child molesters often were molested themselves and asked him if he had ever been a victim, he told the court.

the boy testified. At that time. Lovell had already been charged in connection with other incidents. The youth said the police told him. he could get help with his problems if he testified against Lovell.

Defense attorney Warren Heller sought to expose discrepancies between statements the youth gave police and his testimony yesterday. According to testimony, the youth originally told police the most recent incident occurred in 1985. but later said it happened in 1983.

Judge Larkin also questioned the methods through which the youth and police were able to assign specific dates to incidents that allegedly occurred as long as five

years ago.
