Cub Scout leader sent to prison for sexual assault

Jerome C. Litscher, 46, formerly of 933 E. Washington St., Appleton, who recruited a 13-year old boy to assist him with a Cub Scout pack, was sentenced to eight years in prison for sexually assaulting the boy after Cub Scout meetings.

the boy after Cub Scout meetings.

Outagamie County Circuit Court Judge Joseph Troy placed Litscher on probation for 10 years, to be served after completion of the prison sentence, for sexual assault on a 14-year-old boy over a one-year period in 1987 and 1988 at his apartment and at a cottage Litscher owned in northern Wisconsin.

A charge of sexual contract with a 16-year-old boy was dismissed and read into the record and one count involving a 17-year-old was dismissed.

According to court records. Litscher went to a Boy Scout meeting in 1987 to seek someone to assist him with his Cub Scout pack. The 14-year-old was recommended by the scout master.

The sexual contact started several months after the youth started helping and occurred on three occasions.

The second youth involved had been a runaway and had asked Litscher for help.


Suspension of registration of Jerome C. Litscher

I (Pat Conlin) received an anounymous phone call from a resident of Appleton informing me of an investigation by the District Attorney and Appleton Police Department regarding a child sexual abuse case involving Jerry Litscher. Caller did not indicate how he found out or of his involvement in Scouting.

June 21, 1988 9:30 AM

Discussed information with Director of Field Service, Bill Dalton and was asked to pursue investigation.

10:00 AM

Contacted Sgt. Henry Yunk of Appleton Police Department to verify alleged allegations. Henry would call back.

11:15 AM

St. Yunk returns call stating investigation of Jerry Litscher is in progress regarding child sexual abuse case. Sgt. Yunk referred me to the investigation Officer Pat Geenan at Officer Geenan is out of office until 6/27/88.

2:30 PM

Discussion with Field Director Doug Wilson, reviewing National Policies and Guidelines for Sexual Abuse cases, determined that B.S.A. must find out if:

- 1. there will be boy contact by alleged prior to completion of investigation
- 2. computer check to verify registration
- 3. when will investigation conclude and will a warrant be issued

3:00 PM

Computer check verifies registration with Cub Scout Pack 3025, Sacred Heart Church, Appleton.

3:45 PM

Phone check with Bob Cheek on possibly involvement with Troop 2, Appleton. No involvement at present time.

June 22, 1988 10:53AM

Phone call check with Prisilla Young, of Pack 25 to verify active participation/involvement with Pack 3025 - no answer.

June 23, 1988 5:00 PM

Called Lindore Young, Cubmaster of 3025 and determined that Jerry Litscher is not currently working with Pack, however, he is still registered. No contact with Jerry since law April or early May.

June 27, 1988 9:30 AM

Phone call to officer Pat Geenan - away from desk.

9:50 AM

Call from Officer Geenan and set up appointment for June 27th at 10:30AM

10:30 AM

Meeting with Pat Geenan of Appleton Police Department. Discussion surfaced information of two prior convictions. First April 5, 1978, conviction of 2nd degree sexual asault and was sent to prison. Second conviction on August 21, 1981 on Disorderly Conduct, non-criminal charges but allegations on sexual assault. D.A. did not prosecute on sex allegations. Conversation with Officer Geenan did confirm that an investigation is now in progress on Jerry Litscher regarding two separate assault complaints. Pat Geenan asked that the B.S.A. hold off on the contacting Jerry Litscher until Friday, July 1, 1988. At that time i will follow the procedure outlined in the 1988 Child Sexual Abuse phamplet.

July 5, 1988 10:30 AM

Contact with Pat Geenan of Appleton Policy Department stating a warrant will be issued by Thursday, July 7, 1988 for the arrest of Jerry Litscher. The Boy Scouts can send letter out in Thursday (July 7, 1988) mail indicating termination of registration. Also gave Pat Geenan list of boys (name, address and phone) who were registered in Webelos last year at Pack 3025.

Background check shows registration in 1984-85, Pack 3130, 1984-85, Troop 67, 1984 Troop 6 and 1987-88 Pack 3025. Looking for and making copies of all registration applications and charter faces.

1:30 PM

Conversation with Bruce Chudacoff, Council Vice President of Operations and informed Bruce of details and he stated the letter should be delivered at place of employment and not to wait until next week.

July 1, 1988 10:00 AM

Contacted Pat Geenan, Appleton Police Dept. Pat has not located Jerry Litscher and a warrant will be issued. Paper work to be sent to DA early next week. Jerry Litscher has moved from his Washington Street residence. Police have leads and I'm waiting for confirmation of address.

July 7, 1988

Draft letter to Jerry Litscher with appropriate enclosures.

July 11, 1988 11:30 AM

Contacted Appleton Police Department. A warrent for the arrest of Jerry Litscher has not yet been delivered. Expected to happen within the next day or two. Pat Geenan will keep me posted. Pat indicated that he still does not know where Jerry Litscher is living.

July 11 12:00 PM

After discussion with DFS, Bill Dalton and reviewing the status we felt we had to call acting Scout Executive/Area Director Wally McGill. Wally indicated we have some flexibility in this matter and to use the best approach available to deliver letter. He suggested: 1) contact post office and get new address if available, 2) send registered/return letter to old or new address, 3) deliver by hand, letter to work as a last resort. Contacting employer to find out when he will be back in the Terminal. Wally wants to be kept informed of this event. Also DFS should sign letter.

2:15 PM Contacted Walter Scott, Council President and made arrangements for signature at 8AM, Tuesday, July 12, 1988

July 12, 1988 8AM

Meeting with Council President Walter Scott who signed letter of suspension.

July 14 Sent letter registered/return.


