Jopling told Slocum that he was recognized as a leader, but he had disgraced and damaged his family, himself, the Boy Scouts, his community and his church. "I can see people holding opinions

"I can see people holding opinions against religion and Scouting because of what you have done," Jopling said.

Jopling stayed within Florida's sentencing guidelines, which recommend a total of 17 to 22 years for the four sexual batteries and six counts of a lewd act against a child. Slocum pleaded guilty to the charges in Suwannee County in September.

Circuit Judge Stephan Mickle of Gilchrist County went outside the guidelines Monday when he gave Slocum 60 years for sexually assaulting two Scouts on a troop camping trip on the Suwannee River near Bell in March.

The guidelines recommended a 12- to 17-year sentence for the Glichrist County charges of three counts of sexual battery and three counts of a lewd act against a child.

The sentences in both counties were made consecutive.

"When a big tree fails it crushes the little trees around it. Your conduct not only crushed a tree, it has shaken the foundation," Mickle told Slocum.

Slocum was arrested after the March camp-out when the two Scouts told their parents he had

Jessie James Slocum, Jr., Live Oak, Florida (North Florida Council, Jacksonville), is charged with various "sex acts" involving members of Branford, Fla. Troop 90, Live Oak. Incidents are alleged to have occurred over a 20 year period. In addition to serving as a Scout leader, Slocum also is a city councilman and church deacon.

A Mr. Harvey, of the North Florida Council, confirmed the events as reported. He said the initial charges resulted from alleged sexual battery involving a 12 and a 13 year old Scout. Slocum holds the Silver Beaver and other BSA awards.

Paul Ernst provided the necessary forms several weeks ago to remove Slocum from his BSA leadership role(s). The council says they have done so, but have not reported the matter to national. "We wanted to keep it quiet and handle it at this level," said Harvey, who added he was upset that the newspapers would report matters like this.

ACTION OR RECOMMENDATIONS:

Council will talk with Ernst and Harvey said he would follow-up to see that

the suspension paperwork is completed. He was advised regarding "what makes news" and how best to respond in this instance.

been too frightened to tell anyone.

When the state attorney's office began investigating, Curtin said, other Boy Scouts came forward and told of Slocum's lewd acts behind the troop headquarters building in Branford. He also had molested children during camping trips in Suwannee County and possibly in Columbia County, Curtin said. All of the victims were boys.

The assistant state attorney said one former troop member told him he had been molested by Slocum 20 years ago. The scout leader was not charged with all of the illegal sex acts he committed, Curtin said, because Florida's statute of limitations prevents charges for crimes that happened more than four years ago. Slocum appeared before judges in Gainesville and Lake City Friday morning. Curtin explained that Slocum had to make separate pleas to two circuit judges because he committed some crimes in the 8th Judicial Circuit and others in the 3rd.

Slocum pleaded to the Gilchrist charges at the Alachua County Courthouse in Gainesville. Circuit Judge Stephan Mickle set sentencing for Nov. 3.

After that hearing, Slocum was taken to the Columbia County Courthouse in Lake City. There, he pleaded guilty to the 10 Suwannee charges. Circuit Judge Wallace M. Jopling set sentencing for Nov. 13.

In the meantime, Slocum will be interviewed by a state-appointed and a private psychiatrist, said Slocum's attorney, Huntley Johnson of Gainesville.

Johnson said the consultations will be a part of Slocum's pre-sentence investigation. "If there's a possibility that he can be helped to get over the difficulties he has concerning interaction with children, then the judge will want to know," he said.

Slocum could be sentenced to 135 years in prison and fined \$60,000 for the crimes he committed in Gilchrist County, but state sentencing guidelines call for a 12- to 17-year prison term, Curtin said. For the Suwannee charges, Slocum could be sentenced to 210 years and fined \$100,000. Sentencing guidelines call for a prison term of 17 to 22 years, said Curtin. Slocum is 45.

"We want the sentences to run consecutively," said assistant state attorney John Terhune, who prosecutes in Suwannee County. Consecutive sentences would force Slocum to spend more time in jail than he would if his sentences were to run concurrently.

Slocum was scoutmaster of Troop 90 in Branford for 24 years. He resigned from the scout troop and Branford town council a few weeks after he was arrested.
