
This case caught my eye because Arce was the leader of my son's Webelos unit at Camp Mack during the summer of 1984. I am sure you are aware of Arce and his Boy Scout connection, but I decided to share my concern with you just the same.

While Arce was charged with two counts of abuse, many assaults occurred during the years mentioned and it was only because of the hospitalization of one child that the abuse came to light.

My son assures me that his week at Webelos camp was wonderful with no out-of-the-ordinary episodes. I would also share with you that he was very fond of Arce and that he was contacted after camp by letter several times by Arce with requests for my son to come to his home for a visit, which my son never did.

I hope that the Boy Scout organization has in place a policy for screening volunteers and/or for protection for boys in a meeting or camping situation. I know this is a difficult area to deal with, but the first concern must be the safety of the boys.

I would appreciate hearing from you about this unfortunate situation.

Thank you for your letter of January 14, 1987, along with the clipping concerning Jesus N. Arce.

We have established a "red flag" personnel listing (in our national office) concerning all the activities of Arce. This man never again will be registered with the BSA - regardless of when or where an attempt would be made.

Since leadership is ordinarily the responsibility of the sponsoring organization - it is often "after the fact" that we in the council get involved. In cases such as Arce - were he to again attempt registration, his name would immediately pop us as being on the "red flag" listing - and would be stopped then and there.

What we have to do is enable sponsoring organizations themselves to be more thorough in screening - and this we continually attempt to do.

We appreciate your comments regarding your son's Webelos experience. Thank God that you did not allow him to respond to Arce's overtures following camp.


