
Dear Paul:

## DEATHS

### Florence Knapp, world's oldest

PHILADELPHIA — Florence Knapp lived to be 114 years and 94 days because she had "good genes," according to researchers. But the woman who had been the world's oldest person once said it was God's way of punishing her.

Knapp, who lived in the same suburban house for 110 years, died Monday just two weeks after said she officially became the world's oldest person.



"She lived so long we never knew when to expect it," said Ross Oberholtzer, husband of Knapp's niece, Ruth. "It was quite a shock to us, because she was getting weaker,

but she wasn't sick. ... She just slipped away."

Knapp was a schoolteacher from 1893 to 1935, when she retired. She marched for women's suffrage in 1919 and was a staunch Democrat who voted until she was past 100.

Ulysses S. Grant was president when Knapp was born. She lived through 22 presidents.

"I think she could never understand why she was allowed to live so long," niece Ruth said. "One time she said that she feels like she might have been bad and this was God's way of punishing her."

Two of her sisters lived into their 90s, and an aunt and another

sister lived to be 107.

According to the Guinness Book of World Records, her predecessor as the person with the world's oldest authenticated age had been Anna Eliza Williams, of Swansea, Wales.

### August Baden, toothpick maker

INDEPENDENCE, Kan. — August T. Baden, an Independence drugstore owner who founded cinnamon-flavored Baden's Hot Toothpicks almost 40 years ago, died Sunday. He was 93.

What began as a treat for neighborhood kids in 1949 turned into a big business, with Baden shipping millions of cinnamon toothpicks around the world with the help of his family and dozens of townspeople.

### John Williams, former senator

LEWES, Del. — John Williams, a former four-term U.S. senator, who earned the nickname the "Conscience of the Senate," died Monday. He was 83.

Williams, a Republican who represented Delaware from 1947 to 1971, longer than any other senator from the state, was known for his honesty and devotion to his constituency.

In 1957, Williams' determination to return \$1,500 from his \$1,300 stationery fund to the Treasury led to a tussle with the comptroller general. Williams eventually won.

## Scout worker convicted

LAPEER — A 23-year-old Detroit man who was a staff member at a Detroit Boy Scout ranch in Metamora Township has been convicted of gross indecency in a sexual assault case involving a 16-year-old boy.

Jimmie L. Francis will be sentenced by Circuit Judge Martin Clements March 21. Francis could get up to five years.

An Eagle Scout who served four years in the U.S. Army and now is an Army reservist, Francis was convicted by a Lapeer County Circuit Court jury.

He was convicted of the sexual assault of a Sterling Heights boy who worked as a camp counselor at the D. Bar A. Ranch at 880 E. Sutton in the summer of 1986.

State Police Detective Michael Fink said Francis apparently was a member of a group of homosexuals who worked at the camp and who allegedly forced or intimidated young boys into committing sexual acts.

Francis was convicted of assaulting the boy in the back seat of a car parked alongside Olds Road in Metamora Township on July 1986. The crime took place after Francis and another camp staffer bought alcohol for two boys who also worked at the camp that summer.
